THE RETURN TO CONVERSION.

Last week we referred to some paragraphs appearing in certain of our contemporaries conveying the assurance that the reconversion of the National Bank notes would certainly commence within the limit assigned by the law, namely January 7, 1891. These paragraphs were rather vague and rather mysterious, therefore we paid no great attention to them, but since then we have been making some enquiries and find that they have more foundation than was at first suspected. In fact, we have it on good authority (financial and political) that the return to conversion on that date is highly probable and almost certain. The difficulties in the way are not so great as they at first sight appear, and we hope in a few days to be able to prove this, and to show the manner in which the conversion may be resumed, by means of figures and facts which have already been laid before us, but which we are not at liberty to make use of just now. And although we are aware that the balance of belief is largely against the return, the idea that it will take place is slowly gaining ground in well-informed circles. At the same time, although such a fulfilment of its pledges will redeem in a great measure the drooping credit of the Government, the return to conversion will in reality only relieve the market to the extent of about a million dollars, and a great deal more will have to be done before the National Bank can be reinstated or the crisis considered stemmed.

Saint Peter Chrislogus and Saint Barbara.—Cardinal Richelieu died, 1642. Thomas Carlyle born, 1795. 338 days past, 27 to the end of the year.

Parliament.

In the Chamber of Representatives, on Tuesday, the Bill concerning the Paraguay medals was referred to the Committee of Legislation.

Sr. Luis Carre called attention to the fact that the Budget for 1890-91 had been referred to Committee over four months ago, but that no report had yet been issued. He had heard it said that he knew not from what motives, the Committee did not intend to report, and therefore he thought they should be urged to do so, it being no more than their duty. The President of the Chamber said

the indication would be forwarded to the proper quarter. There being no quorum, no sitting was held.

Death.

Many of our readers will regret to learn of the death of Captain James Lawrence Morse, which occurred at Fray Bentos on the 28th ultimo. The *B. A. Herald* speaks of him as follows: «Capt. Morse will be remembered as for 17 years in the employ of the Liebig Company, before which he was one of the best known and most popular naval men, having served in the Argentine Navy, and by all who ever knew him he was both beloved and respected. He died from the reaction of a severe surgical operation, although all that love could do was done for him. His sister, wife of Capt. Frank Crocker of Montevideo, was at his bedside. His brother is Capt. John Morse of the Platense Company. The bereaved family will have the genuine sympathy of a wide circle of friends.» Capt. Morse was also well known in this city, and his loss will be sincerely regretted.

The Financial Schemes.

The Finance Committee of the Chamber of Senators, in reporting on the Government schemes for the reorganization of the National Bank, as already passed by the other Chamber, says that from the first day of the Bank's existence it was found that it did not rest upon a solid base, that its organization was very defective and that it was exposed to serious dangers and difficulties, as later events have fully proved. It is therefore the duty of the Executive to reorganize this establishment, so closely linked to great economical and financial interests of the country. The commercial crisis, principally produced by the abuse of credit and speculation in recent years, has created a sensible perturbation affecting all classes of society, from the *rentier* to the artisan or agriculturist. It is the duty of the State to summon all its facilities and resources to remove this depression. The reorganization of the Bank would be one of the principal factors towards this result.

FRAND.

The well known stationers Galli and Co. have been defrauded of about \$4000 by their cashier and book-keeper Eduardo Salviatti. Some two or three weeks ago the manager of the house, Sr. Coppin, noted a discrepancy of some \$600 in the books. Salviatti was examined and confessed that he had applied the sum to private purposes intending to rest it. But further examination of the books showed that the house had been defrauded of about \$4000, chiefly by means of false entries in the Customs payments. Meanwhile Salviatti, who had absented himself on pretext of illness, had disappeared, and it is believed has gone to Buenos Aires, where the police are instructed to look for him. Salviatti is an Italian, aged about 50, well educated and of good address. He had been employed in the house for some eight years. His brother in law, Carlos Botasso y Gervasio, also employed by Galli and Co., has been arrested on charge of complicity.

SUNDRIES.

The 3rd Tribunal of Appeal has revoked the sentence of ten years imprisonment formerly passed on Amaro del Sur for the alleged murder of José G. Ayala, at Canelones, June, 7, 1887, and has ordered him to be set at liberty, on the grounds that the proof against him is insufficient. Amaro was the captain of a band in the employ of General Melitón Muñoz. Ayala was shot down from behind whilst riding through the camp and before dying declared that his assailant was Amaro, but as there were no witnesses of the shot, the case has ended thus.

BUENOS AIRES.

Mr. George W. Fishback, the new Secretary of the U. S. Legation in Buenos Aires, arrived in the steamer Moselle and has taken possession of the Legation. He will be the acting Chargé d'Affaires until the return of the Minister, Mr. Pitkin.

BUENOS AIRES.

Messrs. Drayfus and Co., of Maipú 146, have sold \$34,000, through a man who pretended to be Francisco Barret of Capilla del Señor, a corn merchant known to the firm, entering into a contract to sell them 20,000 bags of maize. The man was accompanied to Messrs. Drayfus's place of business by a well known broker, but his name is, in fact, Esteban Barreau, otherwise Angel Lotio and Socio. otherwise Capellon, and he never had any maize to sell. He obtained an advance of \$10,000 from Messrs. Dray-

fus and they lost \$24,000 in the chartering and demurrage of steamers waiting at Campana for the expected cargo. The swindler has been captured after a long and skilful pursuit by the police.

The Government of Santa Fé has in its service more than 200 «Correntinos» armed with large knives. They keep the inhabitants in a constant state of alarm. Labourers are wanted in the colonies and some get as much as \$130 paper the month.

LONDON NOTES

London, Nov. 4.

Whatever Sir Henry Tyler's weight or levity as a politician, he speaks with some authority as a financier, and more particularly as chairman of the Grand Trunk Railway of Canada. Yesterday, in his speech to the assembled shareholders in that company, he expressed the opinion that neither Mr. Windom's threats of checking the traffic of Canadian Railways through United States territory nor the McKinley Bill would damage their interests. Both are Protectionist measures, and Mr. Gladstone lately showed the futility of Protectionist laws in the United States so far. As a specialist, Sir H. Tyler—who by the way has just returned from a visit to America—added his mite to the same argument. The McKinley Bill, he remarked, had already disgusted the poorer citizens, because it had at once raised prices against them. He deliberately expressed his opinion that instead of hurting the railway the Act tended to divert Canadian produce from the United States and to give the line the benefit of a longer haul, as the produce would go to Europe instead.

TYPE-WRITING BY TELEGRAPHY.

Type-writing by telegraphy is now being practised in the United States on a short line in Rhode Island which will probably be extended to Boston this week, and in the opposite direction to New York by the beginning of next year. The operator's key-board at the transmitting office is electrically connected with any number of receiving offices, and the message is delivered from type-writing machines in these offices. This system if it really proves practicable in working, is an obvious improvement on the present telegraphic printing machine which delivers its message on long ribbons of paper instead of in sheets ready for the printer.

THE UNITED STATES CENSUS.

New-York, Nov. 2.
The official announcement on Saturday of the results of the new census shows that the total population, 62,480,540, is three millions less than was generally expected. It shows, however, an increase of over 12,000,000 during the last decade, or about 24 1/2 per cent. For the preceding decade, as shown by the census of 1880, there was over 30 per cent. increase. The census officials say that the apparent falling off in the rate of increase, is due to errors in the census of 1880, which exaggerated the population of the Southern States. Expert criticism is not satisfied with this explanation, and the confidence in the accuracy of the new census is far from generous, as the complete account taken by the police of this city, after the Government count, showed a total nearly 200,000 larger, making the population of the city over 1,800,000 instead of 1,650,000, the new census total. Similar recounts in other localities have shown like results.

A TALE

(Continued.)

That night was mainly taken up with the formalities of all such cases; and when at last Walter Dene went off, tired and nervous, to bed, about midnight, he could not sleep much for thinking of the mystery. The murder itself did not trouble him greatly; it was over and past now, and he felt sure his precautions had been amply sufficient to protect him even from the barest suspicion; but he could not fathom the mystery of that battered and mutilated face!

As for the servants, in solemn conclave in the hall, they had unanimously but one theory to account for all the facts: some poacher or other, for choice Joe Harley, had come across the vicar in the house, with gun and traps in hand. The wretch had seen he was discovered, had felled the poor old vicar by a blow in the face with the butt-end of his rifle, and after he fell, fainting, had stabbed him for good security in the back. That was such an obvious solution of the difficulty, that nobody in the servants' hall had a moment's hesitation in accepting it.

When Walter heard next morning early that Joe Harley had been arrested overnight, on John's information, his horror and surprise at the news were wholly unaffected. Here was another new difficulty, indeed. 'When I did the thing,' he said to himself, 'I never thought of this possibility. I took it for granted it would be a mystery, a problem for the local police (who, of course, would no more solve it than I should), but it never struck me they would arrest an innocent person on the charge instead of me. This is horrible. It's so easy to make out a case against a poacher, and hang him for it, on suspicion. One's whole sense of justice revolts against the thing. After all, there's a great deal to be said in favour of the ordinary commonplace morality: it prevents complications. A man of delicate sensibilities ought not to kill anybody; he lets himself in for all kinds of unexpected contingencies, without knowing it.'

The trial of Joe Harley for the wilful murder of the Reverend Arthur Dene was fixed for the next Dorchester assizes. In the interval, Walter Dene, for the first time in his placid life, knew what it was to undergo a mental struggle. What-ever happened, he could not let Joe Harley be hanged for this murder. His whole soul rose up within him in loathing of such an act of hideous injustice. For though Walter Dene's code of morality was certainly not the conventional one, as he so often boasted to himself, he was not by any means without a code of morals of his own sort. He could commit a murder where he thought it necessary, but he could not let an innocent man suffer in his stead. His ethical judgment on that point was just as clear and categorical as the judgment which told him he was in duty bound to murder his uncle. For Walter did not argue with himself on moral questions: he perceived the right and necessary thing intuitively; he was a law to himself, and he obeyed his own law implicitly, for good or for evil. Such men are capable of great and genuine self-sacrifices also.

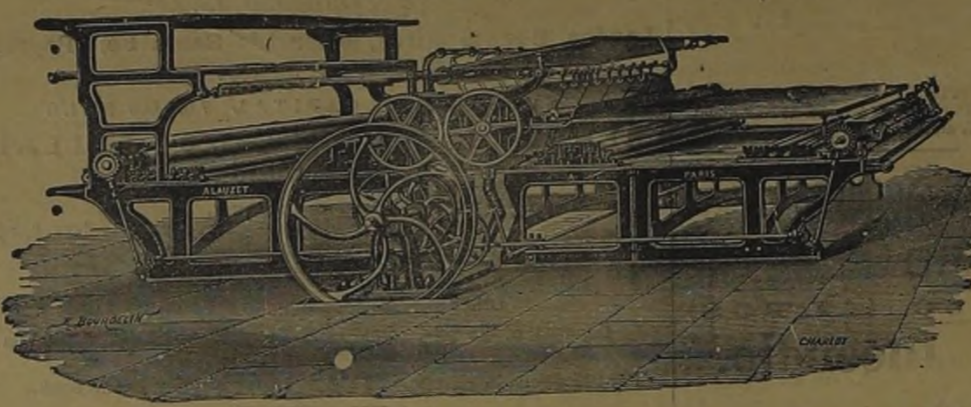
