The difficulty is that money cannot be created. It comes in gradually, and if from every side the Government is pressed, the result mus; be worse for the creditors. The very large remittances which it has been necessary to make to Europe, for example, keep gold at a high premium, reducing the revenue in proportion. Any operation, therefore, which may give the Government breathing time for a year or two will roduce the premium on a wold improvement progold, increasing the revenue in pro-


