THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE.

(Concluded from yesterday)

The portion of the Message which we translated yesterday, and which may be regarded as the introduction, we gave nearly in extenso, only a few sentences being condensed or omitted. To-day we give the remainder, but in a much more condensed form. As before, the paragraphs are numbered for convenience or reference.

§ 20. This country, which requires for commercial circulation 30 to 40 million dollars, had in 1889 in the Banks metallic and paper money for 28 to 30 millions, but its circu-lating medium is reduced to-day to \$11,300,000 of which \$8,000,000 in gold are in the safes of the Banks, there thus remaining a real circulation of \$3,500,000. In this situation it was difficult to escape curso forzoso It was very necessary to escape that rock without converting into Public Debt the paper emission of a private proprietary Bank, it was necessary that the State and the Bank should fulfill their solemn promises of con-version, and this result, which seemed unattainable and was deemed Utopian, which the political passion of some, the egoistic interest of others, and the ignorance of the rest, have obstructed with every kind of difficulty, this result has been attained at last by the patient perseverance which inspires the conscience in the performance of a high and patriotic duty. The National Bank, with its own resources is redeeming its notes of curso legal, and on July 1 this emission, as ordained by Law, will either be withdrawn from circula-tion or will be convertible in gold to the bearer at sight.

§ 21. The second danger, that the decrease in revenue would cause a suspension of the service of the Public Debts, was more easy to Public Debts, was more easy to conjure, for it was only necessary to equilibrate the general Budget, decreasing the expenses, increasing the revenue by new taxes, observing strict economy and severe morality in administration, all of which has been done by the E. P. in all its acts, the Legislative Body in the laws of Oct. 4, Dec. 12 and Jan. 30 last.

§ 22. However great the decrease in revenue, the new taxes guarantee the exact fulfilment of all

guarantee the exact fulfilment of all national obligations and services. These new taxes, calculated on the base of the income of 1888, represent an increase of 5 million dollars, which, added to the economies in the Budget, amounts to \$6,100,000. It would be necessary then for our revenue to be 50 o/o less than in

1888, not to cover the estimates. § 23. The only revenue which may and has suffered decrease is that of the Custom House, calculated for 1888-9 at \$10,000,000. The 7 months July 1, 1890, to Jan 31, 1891, produc-ed \$5,000,000. Remembering these are the worst months of the year, and were under the acute influence of crisis, it is not rash to suppose that in the 5 remaining months, with the the increased duties, the Customs revenue will reach the calculated

§ 24. These two perils averted,

§ 25. The analytical study of the present crisis reveals an important fact which calls for the serious attention of Legislature, namely the imperfection and deficiency of our monetary system. New and rapidly developing countries require the greatest quantity of money for their transactions. Hence the Yankee aphorism that a bad money is better than none at all. Thus it is that new countries create artificial and arbitrary money of exchanges. and arbitrary means of exchange, from wheat or maize to paper money. Our country, whose commercial ideas and habits are refractory to the use of credit, is one of those that needs of credit, is one of those that needs the most money for its transactions and that has the least circulating medium. In 1885 England had a circulation of \$25 per head, France \$46, Belgium \$32, Germany \$25, United States \$31, Italy \$15. Demonstraining the notes of the National monetising the notes of the National Bank, our monetary stock (gold and notes) is 12 millions, or \$15 per

§ 26. Our circulation is mostly metallic, hence it may be objected that the circulatory imferiority arises from want of paper emis-sion and is accidental and transiby facts. In December 1889 there was an emission of \$15,989,000, and a deposit of \$14,094,000, showing that the banks can not emit without gold reserve or deposit. Our metallic stock offers a much narrower base for emission than in other countries. In France the proportion of metal money is \$40 per head, England \$18, Holland \$20, Germany \$15, Italy \$7. Here the proportion is \$10 per head. Thus our circulation is purely metallic in a country which has no gold or silver mines to provide metal tor coining. This circulation of foreign gold coins, nationalised by the law of necessity, stimulates the exportation of gold, because the coins have here a nominal value inferior to that in their own

§ 27. Countries situated like ours can only procure the money they require by interchange, in conditions that the national produce exported exceeds the importation, so that the balance comes to the country in gold. And here serious attention is called to our export and import movement The excesses of importation should from the country, whilst the excesses of exportation produce no such result. Thus in 1881-6 exportation was always superior portation leaving a balance in our favour in the 5 years of \$14,588,000 and meanwhile the movement of gold was also one of exportation, \$3,736,000 leaving the country, which, added to the exportation of gold in 1887-9, gives for the 10 years an exportation of \$12,000,000 against an arrival of \$1,000,000. Under these conditions a sudden and strong extraction produces that diminution of the circudetermining causes of all crises. Furthermore, our country, placed between nations where paper money prevails, is subject to these frequent and considerable extractions of its

only money, without being able to prevent its outflow either in specie or by bills of exchange. § 28. Adding to this the quantity of gold necessary to remit to London for the service of our Public Debts, (\$6,700,000 annually) and also that produced by foreign capital invested here, and nothing further is necessary to explain the anæ nic condition of our industries and the almost permanent state of crisis of our

commerce.
§ 29. This precarious economic situation is aggravated for Lanking institutions by the great competition and incessant hostility to which they are condemned by the reign of liberty and of plurality of Banks of Emission. Even in normal situations, when the public do not seek to when the public do not seek to convert a single note, the Banks of Emission continually diminish their metallic reserves by the conversions en masse made from Bank to Bank, together with the withdrawal of the deposits necessary for the extraction of gold for abroad. To defend their reserves the emissory Banks are obliged to restrict discounts, hasten their collections and raise the rate of

§ 30. Under these conditions it is impossible to give expansion to that paper emission without which cannot be issued those loans at low interest and long term necessary for the development of industries. Those who accuse the private banks amongst us of not lending efficacious aid to commerce and industry, espe-cially in times of crisis when the action of establishments of credit is most necessary, are by no means wrong, only they do not take into account that the Banks cannot lend the assistance solicited on account of the conditions under which they

§ 31. Thus the fundamental eco-nomic problem which gives rise to these facts, and which must be solved if we wish to forestall and conjure the crisis is conquered in its worst effects and its disappearance is a question of time which the acts of regulation of our monetary circulathe meeting.

§ 32. Opportunely the E. P. will present to you a Bill in accordance with these ideas.

(This concludes the part of the Message referring to the financial situation and the crisis. The remainder we will condense considerably.)

§ 33. Absorbed by the exigencies of the crisis, the E. P. has not been able to attend as might have been wished to certain urgently needed reforms in the polical and administrative system of the country. One of these reforms refers to the exercise of free suffrage. The present electoral laws suffer from detects which give rise to all sorts of frauds and adulterations, impossible to avoid. Especially is this the case in the formation of the civic registers, often giving rise to disturbances. At present no party, not even the dominating party can struggle successfully against a dozen of citizens who corspire to take possession of the electoral apparatus This state of affairs has engendered amongst the citizens an indifference to the exercise of their electoral rights, and is prejudicial to the general interests. It is necessary for the law to secure the triumph and predominance for the majority, at the same time preserving the proportional representation of the minority, whose voice it is also necessary to

§ 34. Another reform no less needed, though of distinct character, refers to the administration of Justice, rendering necessary the establishment of a High Court of Justice. A scheme formed by Dr. Angel Floro Costa is now being studied by a committee of lawyers, and will shortly be submitted to your consi-

§ 35. The E. P. has given great attention to the moral interests represented by public instruction. The Government is seriously alarmed by the materialistic philosophy which for some years has absolutely dominated scholastic admanding spiritualistic enterery panishing spiritualistic the nature of our political organisation and the spirit of all our institutions. To avert this evil, the Government, making use of its right, and applying with its strict duty. and complying with its strict duty, has declared official spiritualistic doctrines and text books in public

Negotiations between them and Mr. Walton have been going on for a long time, and the directors came to the conclusion that the best course they could take was to retire, in order to facilitate the proposed amalgamation of this company with the Central Tramways Company of Montevideo.
So far as I myself am concerned, I may say, to prevent any misapprehension, that Mr. Walton was good enough to ask me when he formed the Central Tram-

ways Company of Montevideo to join that board, and he has since pressed me repeatedly to remain on the board, and become a director of medicine but is now recome to the conclusion that this company in its present condition is now not so much a public company, as it is the private concern of a very few shareholders, and that, under these circumstances, I do not think it consistent with my own position to remain upon the board. I am glad rather that the shareholders have afforded me an honourable and easy way of resiring from a position which I have long been auxious to vacate. During the time that the directors who board, we have done what we could to further the interests of the company.
