

PASSING NOTES.

The statistics we published yester-day bring to light a curious circumstance, which we overlooked at the time. The amount of landed property in the department of Mon-tevideo was valued in 1888 at \$112,546,540, that valuation being the basis for the land tax in 1889. The amount of landed property sold in the department in 1889, presumably in the departmentin 1839, presumably valued on the same basis, was estimated at \$56,653,791, or almost half the whole amount of landed properry. This is a proof of the extent to which speculation in land was pushed during 1889, the same property changing hands perhaps a dozen times, and thus swelling the list with each fresh registration. The movement which in one year causes half the landed property in the department aparently to pass though the registry of sales, can hardly be regarded as a healthy one, though no doubt some "booming" capitalists might be found to describe it as part of the "crisis of prosperity." part of the «crisis of prosperity.»

We see neither mischief nor want of patriotism in giving a plain, unvarnished record of passing events, in deducing therefrom the inevitable conclusions to which ordinary logic guides us, or in calling apon the ruling powers to abandon courses which experience plainly shows to be fruitless or baneful and to embrace others which baneful and to embrace others which there is every reason to believe will be productive and beneficial. It to tell the truth be unpatriotic then there is at this present moment no more dangerous traitor to the country that the Direction General of Statistics, for its periodical publications, for some time past, have given rise to little but doletul reflections and lamentable results. No, to our mind the danger lies not in the publication of facts or the clamour for better administration, but in the publications of subsidised and dependent organs which by a skilful dependent organs which, by a skilful combination of the suppressioveri and the suggestio fulsi, invent a fool's paradise of their own and put on all events an artificial colouring which is purposely intended to which is purposely intended to delude and ensnare. As the delusion never can be sustained, although the momentary result may be an illusory benefit, the ultimate result is invariably discredit, shame and failure. We have no hesitation whatever in saying that the credit of this country is to-day under a cloud, not merely because its affairs have been badly managed, but also because of the policy of deception and falsehood followed often by the very organs which now dare to stigmatise their which now dare to stigmatise their more truthful contemporaries as mischief - makers. It is they who have proved the traitors, not the latter. Apropos of this it is with deep shame that we look back on some of the publications made by our predecessors in English journalism here, and which embodied the worst vices criticised above. These worst vices criticised above. These publications, sycophantic and mend-acious, were written with no other view than to produce a false estimate view than to produce a false estimate of the country and to entrap English capital. How far they succeeded we cannot say, but we do know that the discovery of their falsehood has done more harm than their preaching ever did good, that they have brought English journalism here into contempt and discredit, and that the recollection of their contemptible artifices even yet throws difficulties in the firm establishment of an independent and truthful of an independent and truthful paper. However, that kind of journal-ism is, we trust, now dead, killed by its own poison, and judging from the manner in which its memory is still regarded, we should hardly think any one would be rash enough

Two centuries and a half ago Shakespeare put into mouth of one of his characters a complaint about the occupation of the stage by children— «Butthere is an aërie of children, little eyases, that cry out on the top of the question, and are most tyrannically clapped for it, these are now the fashion.» This «fashion» has never died out, and was exemplified on Thursday evening by the ap-pearance at this theatre of company of children playing Spanish Zarzuelas, and farces. We must confess we were agreably surprised with the result, for the little ones had been carefully trained, and ome of them showed genuine ca-pability. Consequently the pieces were, in several instances, far more were, in several instances, far more amusing than when we have seen them rendered by adults. The primadonna of the company is Miss Isabel Costa, stated in the programme to be only 18 1/2 years old, and a remarkably fine girl for her age. LONDON NOTES

London, Jan. 7.

In connection with the important action of Baird v. Walker, raised in the Canadian Courts, and involving the whole question of the Newfoundland Fisheries, a case has been submitted to an eminent English barrister. The ground of detence taken by Mr. Baird's counsel is that there is no legal authority for the taken by Mr. Baird's counsel is that there is no legal authority for the enforcement either of the modus vivendi recently established by Lord Salisbury with the French Government or of the Treaty of Versailles, since the Act 28 George III., ch. 23, has been repealed, and no law exists by which the Treaty can be made to take effect. The English counsel has, we understand, approved by his opinion the line taken by Mr. Baird's counsel. The case will be heard at the forthcoming term of the Supreme Court of Canada.

How seriously the cold weather has affected the aged may be gathered from a comparison of the mortality returns in recent weeks. In the second week of December the number of deaths of persons in London eighty years old and upwards reached 100, the highest total for very many weeks. In the three weeks whichhave followed, however, the deaths of those who have passed their eightieth year have increased to 116, 142 and 148. It naturally goes hard with centenarians in such weather, and the death of a centenarian is included in the record of narian is included in the record of last week. 
