A long letter is published from the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland and the Chief Secretary, Mr. Balfour, on the severe distress prevailing in that country. They say that money can be spent usefully among the poor of the western seaboard, where, if unaided, poverty may become acute during the winter and spring. They suggest that relief should be directed (1) to aiding families who, though in serious want, cannot derive direct benefit from public works; (2) to providing meals for children at school; and (3) to providing clothes for children. They lay down as a primary condition that charity should be distributed by a single authority to prevent confusion of areas. Lord Zetland and Mr. Balfour say to those who think them—in consequence of their being able to obtain the services of poor law and school inspectors, relieving officers, resident magistrates, and the constabulary—best equipped for carrying out the relief work, that they will undertake the management and distribution of funds for the purpose indicated to Dublin Castle.

Both officials and men of the Scotch railway system regard the coming week as the crucial period of the struggle. The new year holidays having terminated, the railway companies will make some attempt to deal with the goods and mineral traffic, and upon their success or failure in this respect will probably depend the duration of the strike. Speaking in Glasgow yesterday Mr. Tait, secretary of the men's local organization, asserted that the resources of the companies were fully occupied in maintaining the diminished passenger traffic, and declared that only with the assistance of the men could they cope with the goods and mineral traffic. A large meeting of London railway servants was held under the presidency of Mr. Davitt yesterday, when speeches were delivered by Mr. John Burns and others, and resolutions passed in favour of the men on strike.

About 240 second division clerks in the Savings Bank Department of the Post Office have been suspended in consequence of their refusal to perform two hours' extra duty when called upon by the authorities to do so. A considerable force of officers is being drafted into the department to carry on the work, so that no inconvenience will be caused to the public. It is said that the grievance of the men originated in what they considered to be the excessive number of female clerks employed. Another of the children burned in the bazaar calamity at Leeds has succumbed, bringing up the number of deaths to seven. The funeral of four of the victims took place yesterday amid many manifestations of sympathy.

The decided thaw which set in on Saturday continued throughout yesterday. Last night, however, the indications were favourable to a return of colder weather.

The Fifth Avenue Theatre in New York has been destroyed by fire. Fortunately, it did not break out until after the audience had left the building. Hermann's Theatre was slightly damaged by fire and water, and the top floor on the north side of the Starveant House was burned out. Miss Fanny Davenport, who had been playing Cleopatra at the Fifth Avenue Theatre, estimates her personal loss at 10,000. Madame Sarah Bernhardt was to have appeared at this theatre in February.

An American lady is about to emulate Mr. Stanley's explorations in Africa. She will start in February for Zanzibar, thence going to Mozambique, and afterwards journeying into Central Africa. Her idea is to study the home-life of the savage tribes. She is to take with her a photograph in order to bring back some African voices. Mrs. Sheldon, the lady in question, is to have a special passport from Secretary Blaine, as well as letters from Mr. Stanley. She is to be alone in the enterprise, her attendants being Arabs and black women, with, perhaps, a military escort.

They opened 32 cash and after dancing about between 30 1/2 and 32 3/4 finally closed 31 cash and tomorrow, 31 1/4 for Saturday. Cedulas were fairly busy. \$121,000 series A sold at 44 to 43 cash, 44 1/2 to 44 end of month, closing at the lower figures. \$50,000 series B at 42 end of month. \$35,000 Mortgage Certificates at 42 1/2 cash, 44 1/4 end of month. BUSINESS NOTES - At an extraordinary general meeting of the Montevideo Tramways Company, held in London on Jan. 6, the following resolution was passed, viz:—The Chairman having intimated that the directors at present in London are willing to resign in order to facilitate the suggested amalgamation of this company with the Central Tramways Company of Montevideo, Limited, a meeting of shareholders be called for the purpose of electing members of the Board of this company. The total number of passengers carried for the month of December was 65,000, and for the first week of January 17,221 passengers.

Messrs. Baring Brothers and Co. have announced the number of 113 bonds, amounting to £19,702 of the United Five per Cent Loan of 1883 for £11,127,000 of the Oriental Republic of Uruguay, which have been drawn for payment at par on and after April 1.

We learn that, subject to its shareholders' confirmation, the English Bank of Rio de Janeiro has sold its Brazilian business to the Banco de Credito Universal of Rio de Janeiro at a figure which leaves a very handsome result. The River Plate Branches, were informed, will carry on their business as heretofore.

The National Bank is now paying the interest on the Santa Rosa Railway debt for the 40th quarter.
