## Protest.

We learn that the principal merchants and business men of all denominations are preparing a protest or petition to the President of the Republic asking him to appoint, without further loss of time, a Ministry composed of persons, who, by their merits and antecedents, will inspire the confidence necessary for the restoration of credit in commercial operations, and who will once more initiate an era of progress. A committee has been appointed to take charge of the matter, and we understand that the petition has already received some fifty signatures of men prominent in the commercial world.

It may be taken as a very significant sign of the times that such a step should be even considered necessary. We have heard indirectly, but cannot guarantee the accuracy of the statement, that the President has expressed himself far from pleased at the idea of the petition.

## Annuary.

We have to acknowledge receipt of a copy of the "Annuary of Uruguay for 1891," which must not be confounded with the Statistical Annuary published by the Direction of Statistics. The present work, which would more appropriately be called a Directory, was designed and nearly completed by the eminent statistician Sr. Eugenio Ruiz Zorrilla. Since his untimely death last September it has been completed by Sres. Orestes Araujo and Agustín Villagra. It is a formidable volume of some 900 pages, and in addition to a large amount of general, statistical, and official information, it embodies the first attempt to give a professional and business directory of the entire Republic. It also contains a number of serviceable maps. Although not free from the faults and imperfections hardly separable from the first publication of a work involving so much labour, it must be recognised as a publication of great value, and a distinct advance on anything yet attempted here. We presume it will now be continued yearly, with such additions and improvements as time may suggest. It is issued by the publishing house of Vasquez Cores, Dornaleche y Reyes, 18 de Julio 146.

## Good News for Estancieros.

The *Epoca* states that the league of *saladeristas*, formed at the opening of the season, and which has operated to keep down the prices paid for live stock, has come to an end, the local *saladeristas* finding it impossible to compete with those of Rio Grande, who, by offering more reasonable prices, secured the pick of the beasts. In consequence of this the prices paid for live stock have already risen considerably and we hear as much as \$19 per head has been paid in private sales. This ought to be cheering news for the estancieros who were greatly affected by the low prices hitherto paid for live stock this season.

## Journalistic.

Our important contemporary *La Razón* has suffered a severe loss in the withdrawal from its staff of two of its most important writers, Dr. Daniel Muñoz, who was also editor, and Dr. Ricardo Usher Blanco. This journal has of late been a leader in the ranks of the opposition, but we understand that the proprietors contemplate initiating an entire change in its policy.

*El País*, which was the organ of the "National" party, disappears from the field, having taken leave of its readers yesterday. It promises, however, that it will shortly be replaced by another paper, professing the same policy and programme.

We understand that the attempt to start an English paper in support of the present Government and situation has been abandoned, on account of the little response encountered amongst the English community. We scarcely think the community would support two papers. For our part, we have no intention of abandoning the field so long as we are assured of the sympathy of our readers, and their approval of the course we have chosen.

## SUNDRIES.

—This is the short month, and the month of holidays, there being only 21 working days. The holidays are February 3 (National Holiday), 9 and 10 (Carnival).

—A private in the Argentine cavalry has been sentenced to ten years imprisonment for the murder of a fellow-soldier. Murder is a dangerous game for privates, they should wait until they become officers.

—A telegram from New York announces the sudden death, whilst at a banquet of Mr. William Windam, the Secretary of the Treasury.

—A London telegram announces the death, on Friday, of Charles Bradlaugh, M.P. for Northampton. Although Mr. Bradlaugh's religious views have brought upon his head a great deal of abuse, most of it quite unwarranted, he was a most earnest and conscientious man, highly respected by those who know him, and one who has done a great deal of good in his life. The trouble that occurred about his taking his seat in Parliament when first elected, will still be remembered, though since then he has proved himself a most useful and hard working member. There is no doubt he will be much missed in public life. Strange to say both "Hazzell's Annual" and "Men of the Times" omit any reference to him, though was certainly of more prominence and importance than many of the persons and titled non-entities to whom they devote their pages. We believe he was about sixty years old.

—It appears that the resolution of the liquor manufacturers to suspend the production of alcoholic drinks for one year, on which we commented yesterday, has not yet been adopted, but they are holding meetings with the object of adopting some unanimous plan of action to protect their interests.

—The Committee of the Oriental Red Cross Society held a meeting last night to consider if they could or should offer any assistance to the victims of the present revolution in Chile. It appears they have in hand some funds and a quantity of bandages, lint, etc. We have not yet learnt the result of the meeting.

—The well-known pharmacist, Sr. A. Rey, who is reputed to sell the best tea in Montevideo, returns tomorrow to his old address, 25 de Mayo 184.

—The death is announced of Sr. Blas Solari, one of the principal merchants in the Department of Mercedes. He had spent the greater part of his life in the Republic, and had amassed a comfortable fortune.

—We hear that the route of the Este tramway will be extended along calle Carapá to the bottom of the bottom of Calle Victoria, opposite the Italian Hospital in Tres Cruces. Work will commence very shortly, the Municipal authority having been obtained already. When complete this will be one of the cheapest rides in the city, as it is not contemplated to raise the fare.

—Dr. Grotero, in his lengthy, not to say long-winded, report, comes to the conclusion that Jean Baptist Lonstean committed suicide, and was not the victim of a murder. Perhaps now they will let the affair drop.

—The Oriental Government has been invited by the Philanthropic Society of Bordeaux to take part in the National, Colonial and International Exhibition to be held in that city in 1894.

—The Spanish Legation has applied to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for the extradition of José Nevot y Sotano, accused of robbing the Spanish Savings Bank in Madrid of ten million pesetas. He was arrested some weeks ago and has been detained in the Penitentiary. It was this worthy who threatened several papers which commented on his arrest with actions for libel.

—Gold closed yesterday at 132, according to which the paper dollar is worth 75.7 cents.

—A brutal crime was committed on Friday evening in a house of ill fame in calle Brecha. One of the inmates, named Elvira Gomez, was attacked by a youth named Felipe Viana y Piaggio, and stabbed in seven places, some of the wounds being highly dangerous. Viana who was captured immediately is an ex-cadet of the 1st Infantry, and is only about 20 years old.

—The "Almirante Brown" with the remains of General Paunero on board, has not yet left Rio Janeiro, so it is not yet possible to fix the date of the demonstration which is being organised.

—A decree was issued yesterday from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs accepting the offer of Sr. F. A. Lanza, National Inspector of Telegraphs, to act as unsalaried representative of the Oriental Government in the International Congress of Engineers to be held at Washington to study the means of carrying out the International Railway. A better choice could not have been made, and Sr. Lanza is warmly to be congratulated on his patriotic conduct.

—It is announced that from today the Government estimates will be paid in gold, also that the estimates for November will be paid in the current week.

—It is said the new Ministry will be named on Monday or Wednesday. Nothing new concerning the loan.

—The escape from drowning at Plaza Ramirez, on Friday afternoon to which we referred yesterday, was not of an English lady. The person in question was Mr. John Hughes, a well-known broker of Buenos Aires. Whilst swimming he was seized with violent cramp, and was only saved by the timely efforts of Mr. J. J. Macadam.

—There will be music at Positos and the Playa Ramirez today. Harvey's Royal Midge's will make their last appearance at the Politeama Oriental this evening.

—The members of the Velocipede Club met at 2 p.m. this afternoon to discuss reforms in the rules and elect a new Committee.

## BUENOS AIRES.

—Dr. John O'Connor has been appointed resident physician to the British Hospital, in place of Dr. Jamieson, whose contract has expired.

—Mr. N. Bouwer has informed the Government that the London Board of Directors of the Gt. Western Railway agrees to accept, provisionally, the Government proposal that the tariffs should be fixed on the basis of an addition of 85 cto of the premium on gold, but, at the same time, the Board is of opinion that the line cannot be worked at a profit with such a tariff.

—An elegant album embroidered in gold by the artist Señora Marina Usó will be presented by the employees of the Grand National Tramway Company Limited to Mr. Alfred E. Wittey, the Chief Accountant of the Company, on his departure for Europe, as a token of their appreciation and high esteem for him during the time he was with them.

—A Court Martial sitting on private Adolfo Medina, of the 3rd Cavalry Regt., has condemned the latter to ten years imprisonment with hard labour, for the murder of a fellow-soldier named Rosas Carranza.

The Department of Engineers insist upon the necessity of substituting some other mode of lighting railway carriages for that of kerosene, in consequence of the fire which occurred on the 19th instant, in a first-class carriage on the Pacific Railway, by the breaking of a kerosene lamp. It is stated that this accident will cost the Company \$5000. The burnt carriage went off the line.

—Miss Elvira Rawson, a medical student of the 6th year, was married on Wednesday to Dr. Manuel Dellepiane.

—On Wednesday the law of the budget was definitely sanctioned by the Provincial Senate. The second vice-president Guillermo Doll was elected first vice-president in place of Dr. Villamayor, who resigned, and Sr. Martin Boneo was elected the 2nd vice-president.

—The falling off in the tramway traffic is now becoming plainly visible to the naked eye. In the morning the "plataformas" are no longer crowded with young men and boys going to business, who in the booming days disdained even to walk five squares; these young people now walk, and find their health much improved thereby. In the middle of the day and afternoon there is much less foot traffic, and even at dewy dawn there seem to be fewer of the daily bread tribe going home on tram wheels. It would be easy and amusing to forecast a tram Chairman's speech in London to the shareholders whom convening on the report for the half year ending 30th June 1891.—*B. A. Standard.*

## LONDON NOTES

London, Jan. 2.

The customary list of New-Year Honours was published yesterday. Sir Francis Sandford and Sir Edward Guinness each receive peerages of the United Kingdom. Baronets are conferred on Sir Hercules Robinson, Sir Henry Rawlinson, Mr. Thomas Brooks, and Dr. Richard Quain. Besides these, several knight-hoods are bestowed, and there are also various promotions and appointments in the respective Orders of distinction.

On the 31st ult. the strikers on the Glasgow and South Western Railway returned to their work, and traffic on that system was accordingly carried on without interruption. On the Caledonian and North British lines the main body of men in Glasgow and Edinburgh remain out, though there are isolated cases in other districts of men resuming work. The traffic returns issued yesterday by the three railways showed a decrease of between 26,000, and 27,000, as compared with the corresponding week of last year.

During the third quarter of the financial year which ended the day before yesterday, the total produce of the Revenue showed an increase of 304,663, as compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Adding this to the increase in the first quarter of 1,146,617, and to that of the second quarter, 532,782, the net increase for the three-quarters of the current financial year comes out at 1,984,062.

Notwithstanding the great increase in the number of passengers caused by the New Year festivities, the Scotch railway companies yesterday managed to maintain the traffic with comparative regularity. At Edinburgh, Glasgow, and Carlisle the men on strike continue firm. Those attending a mass meeting at Glasgow in the afternoon unanimously rejected a compromise proposed by the Dundee men—that a committee of strikers shall be appointed to confer with Mr. Walker, manager of the North British line; railway servants meanwhile to resume work.

Several deaths from the severe cold are reported this morning, the most striking case being that of a tramp who was found near Chatteris with his feet so badly frozen as to necessitate amputation, from the effects of which, tetanus having set in, he died. Yesterday there were carnivals on the Thames in the district of Teddington and Walton. Sheep were roasted whole on the ice.

Mr. Frederic Harrison last night

delivered his customary New Year's Address to the members of the London Positivist Society and others at Newton Hall. He took occasion to review the events of the past year, notably the startling events associated with the Central African expedition, and the growth of Socialism.

An inquest was held at the London Hospital yesterday on the body of John Picton, who was killed by wrestling with a performing bear at an East-end music-hall. The jury found that death was accidental, but requested the coroner to communicate with the County Council and express their opinion that the general public ought not to be allowed to engage with wild animals on the stage.

Five men and a widow were again brought up at Southwark yesterday charged with conspiring by acts of incendiarism to defraud a large number of fire insurance companies. It was alleged that they rented houses in different parts of the metropolis, insured furniture placed therein for sums much beyond its value, and then by carefully planned fires recovered money from the insurance companies. Evidence in support of this having been adduced, a further remand was granted.

On reviewing their year's trade the Sheffield manufacturers find that the fears entertained in some quarters that the abolition of the silver duty would cause the country to be flooded with foreign manufactures, have not been realized. A largely increased trade has been done in sterling silver goods, and the only drawback to trade has been the uncertainty which has prevailed owing to the fluctuations in the price of the metal. These have been more violent than at any previous period within living memory.

The Board of Trade have intimated to the promoters of the Channel Tunnel that if the Bill which has again been recently deposited by them in the Private Bill Office, is persevered with, it will be the duty of the Government—as on previous occasions—to oppose it in Parliament.

An article published in Bishop Strossmayer's organ at Agram on "Our Autonomy," has cost the editor two months' imprisonment and a fine of 2,000 florins.

There is just the possibility that another Watt or Stephenson may arise to show us how to avoid the enormous loss in friction in overcoming the vis inertia of our vast marine engines; but for the present the hope lies in the improvement of boilers. If it shall be found possible to use in the ocean steam vessels such boilers as are put into the torpedo boats that are built at Chiswick, Mr. Roberts can see little reason to doubt that the Atlantic liners will be able to attain at least as high a rate of speed as those naval flyers which can steam at nearly thirty miles an hour. Then will the problem be solved.
