We notice that this Company has been electing a new Board in London and the Financial News of Jan. 15 and other dates contains various articles on its financing, stating that a respectable Board of Directors was secured, and reputable firms were associated with the undertaking, and further that "there was an opening for such a tramway, its auspices were favourable and its estimated profits

within reasonable probability, also the line is complete and in working order." We can fully corroborate this statement, this line is always well patronised, probably on account of its picturesque and pleasant route, running for a considerable distance by the edge of the sea, and also on account of the cheapness of its fares, it costing only 4 cents to ride from the National Hotel, at the extremity of the city, to the Union, passing close to the School of Arts and Trades and the Playa Ramirez. A return drive along this route is much appreciated on holiday afternoons. Naturally present business is affected by the crisis and the scarcity of money, many walking who formerly rode, and the Company has to be content with small profits, however, it is only a question of time for the property to be one of great value. The works of this line are of the most solid description. They have no temporary buildings. Their main stable has been built on the most modern type, as erected in Buenos Aires for the National Company and referred to at their General Meeting as a fine type of building. There are also additional offices stabling which is being used for the "Credito Real" horses, smith's shop for shoeing purposes, and large smithy for general use, also large repair shops, 10 metres by 18, and a large carriage depot. The fine sea wall at the extension of calle Maldonado makes a fine promenade and has been admirably paved.

The constructors of this line were Alfred Collet and Co., represented in London by Mr. Walton. We believe the amalgamation of this company with the "Credito Real" or Uruguayan tramway is concluded. Disastrous Fire. A family of seven persons burned to death. One of the most terrible fires known here for many years, not account of its magnitude, but on account of its tragic consequences, took place early yesterday morning in the house 80A and 82 calle Treinta y Tres, almost directly in front of our offices. The building consists of three stories or flats, the ground floor, with a frontage of only 10 metres and a depth of 30, being occupied by a fonda and almacén kept by a Spaniard named Juan Garcia. He, his wife, two children, a man-cook named Carballo, brother to Sr. Garcia, Casiano Carballo, another brother and a servant girl, occupied small rooms at the back of the premises, some sleeping in the entresol. All had retired to rest a little before midnight on Friday, the front doors and windows being securely fastened and all lights supposed to be extinguished. About 4 a.m. yesterday the policeman on duty noticed an issue of smoke and gave the alarm, the fire brigade was on the spot with admirable promptitude but the fire must have been raging internally for when they broke open the doors and windows the interior was a raging furnace of flame. After working hard for nearly an hour the flames were extinguished, the material for combustion being exhausted, and in the front nothing but the bare walls being left. As soon as they could penetrate to the interior a most terrible sight met their view, for it was found that all the inmates of the house, as named above, had fallen victims to the flames. The body of the Sr. Garcia, who was expecting very shortly to become a mother, was found at the foot of the small iron staircase leading to the upper rooms where her children were, clinging to the rails, and fearfully disfigured. The body of the Sr. Garcia was found in the patio, terribly charred, and those of the children and others in their beds or on the floor. All were in their night dresses. All the bodies were so charred that it was difficult to remove them, as they fell to pieces on being touched. Some doubt exists as to the fate of the youth Sarah Carballo, whose body has not yet been found, some asserting that he ran out in his night shirt when the fire was first declared. As no trace of him is forthcoming it is thought more probable he may have fallen into or jumped in the well, which has yet to be searched. It is to be hoped in mercy that these victims were suffocated by the smoke before the flames reached them. When the tragic catastrophe was known, the neighbours were much affected, as the family, though humble, was greatly respected. It was too late to render any assistance so beds were procured, and the poor charred remains were placed thereon and taken to the Central Police station, presenting a truly appalling sight. Here they were viewed by a brother of the Sr. Garcia, and other relations living at the other end of the town, the scene being most affect-

ing. Later on they were taken to the Central Cemetery. The families living in the two upper stories of the building escaped at the first alarm, not without difficulty. The first floor was also considerably damaged by fire and water, the floor being partly burnt through, and part of the furniture and property destroyed. The house will probably have to be pulled down, as the foundations are weakened. The extent of the damage has not been valued and it is believed the place was not insured. This tragic catastrophe made a profound impression, not only in the neighbourhood, but throughout the town, and all day long crowds of persons came to visit the scene and gaze upon the ruins.

BUENOS AIRES. —A decree of the National Government of November 26th last authorized the Córdoba Bank to issue "agricultural bonds," bearing the national seal, to the amount of \$3,000,000, for the purpose of withdrawing the notes of the old issue still in circulation and which were alleged to be in such a state of deterioration as to be unfit for use. The notes withdrawn were to be sent immediately to the Conversion office to be destroyed, and the Bank was to amortize the bonds at the rate of \$150,000 a month, and to send such bonds to the Conversion Office. The bonds were to circulate under the same conditions as the notes for which they were substituted, and its worth 82.5 cents. —Few places of business have felt the pressure of the crisis more severely than the restaurants, and it was therefore no wonder that the once popular and thronged Criterion should have partly succumbed. Now, however, we understand that an energetic attempt is to be made to restore it to its pristine glories and former rank.
