## KILLING THE PORT.

Better late than never, we redeem to-day our long-standing promise of giving our readers an idea of the concents of the series of powerful articles published by «Mario» in the Telegrafo Maritimo and dealing with the grafo Maritimo and dealing with the important question of the excessive dues charged in the port. As already mentioned, these articles have been reproduced in pamphlet form and published in the office of the paper named, and to those directly concerned we can only recommend a study of the original, as, although the articles are long, they are so full of matter that it is hardly possible to do justice that it is hardly possible to do justice dable chain «Mario» has knitted together. That his conclusions are accurate is doubly proved by the fact that his series of articles have received the unanimous and unbesitating approval of the resident Shipping Agents and Companies, and that no one, not even those most interested in defending the abuses he attacks, has attempted the east refutation.

Commencing with a definition of the term. «packet-boat,» unnecessary to repeat, «Mario» points out that the privileges and exemptions originally conceded to such, and usual in all civilised nations, were gradually taken away one by one until in May, 1881, a final blow was struck by the appearance of a decree ordering that packet boats should pay the same duties as cargo boats, including a license or patente of \$90 per voyage. That is to say, they had no exemp-tions left, but only the obligation of carrying public correspondence. This naturally put an end to the stimulus of progress and civilisation and extension of commercial relations of which packet-boats were the basis. But that is only the begining of

the evil. The license here is \$90 gold per steamer per voyage, and as a rule mail steamers only remain in this port some 15 or 24 hours. But in Buenos Aires, old-tashioned as their system is, the same boats pay a license of \$600 min per year, which at the rate of 4 trips a year, is reduced to about \$18 gold per voyage, less than one-fourth the fee here. And there the mail steamers remain in port 10 to 15 days, the commercial movement being so much greater.

Other port dues here are equally out of proportion, and «Mario» calculates, founding his figures on undeniable facts, that a steamer of 1700 tons, which is about the average, pays here \$377.50 gold, against about \$111 in Buenos Aires, where about

As the latter port is improved, this will disppear, and then our port traffic will find isself gradually reduced to the amount quoted above as absolutely necessary for the commerce of the city. We may add that when one scheme for port works in Maldonado is carried out, as it probably will be, a large portion of the coaling trade will probably go there. Now each steamer, calculates «Mario» spends here about \$1000 in provisions, expenses, commissions, etc, wishout counting the coal, and consequently

A family of seven persons burned to death.

The families living in the two upper stories of the building escaped at the first alarm, not without difficulty. The long gallery or oven-like shape of the houses gives greater impetus to the fire, less means of attacking it, and more chance of death by burning or suffication. The little interior rooms or altillos, to which the general access is by a wooden or iron-plate staircase are even more dangerous. It has often been a wonder to us that fatalities do not occur more frequently. Perhaps the present catastrophe may call public attention to the danger and lead to some reform in the present barbarous style of architecture, which has not one single point to recom-

-A decree of the National Go-vernment of November 25th last authorized the Cordoba Bank to issue «agricultural bonds,» bearing the national seal, to the amount of \$3,000,000, for the purpose of with-drawing the notes of the old issue still in circulation and which were alleged to be in such a state of deterioration as to be unfit for use. The notes withdrawn were to be sent immediately to the Conversion office to be destroyed and the Bank was to amortize the bonds at the rate of bonds to the Conversion Office. The bonds were to circulate under the same conditions as the notes for which they were substituted, and the Supreme Court of Cordoba has decid-ed that neither the bonds nor the notes of the old issue are legal tender. As might have been auticipated, the Bank did not use the bonds for the purpose of withdraw-ing the old notes but lent them in large amounts to the friends of the Government, thus increasing the unlawful currency, and now the Córdoba Covernment has actually the audacity to ask leave to issue more bonds to the amount of \$1.500,000!

-It is reported that about 40 of the officers who took part in the July revolution and who have been ordered to the frontiers left the country on Wednesday last for Oriental Republic. We hope that the report will prove to have no foundation. Most of the officers have, in obedience to the order of the Chief of the Staff, presented themselves at his office and obtained their passports and passages for their respective destinations.
