AN AMERICAN MILLIONAIRE'S STRANGE ADVENTURES. A well-known millionaire of Napa City, California, has just returned to the United States from a Eu-ropean journey which, if the report sent over the cable is to be credited, will take high rank amongst tales of remarkable adventures. Dalziel's representative cables as follows: representative cables as follows:—
The millionaire came as a passenger in the steerage of the steamship Burgundia from Naples and Marseilles, in the company of 485 Italian enigrants. His story is a most extraordinary one. It appears that he left Napa City in September for the purpose of making a trip to Europe, intending to visit Italy and spend the winter at Nice and Monte Carlo. He took with him a few hundred He took with him a few hundred pounds and a letter of credit for an amount sufficient to cover bis expenses while absent. He proceeded to New York and sailed thence in a steamer for Genoa, his trip being as much for health as for pleasure, and not wishing to visit the northern and colder climates. Arriving in Genoa in October, he remained there some days and then made a journey through Italy, visit-ing Naples, Rome, Venice, &c. After two months of enjoyment of this kind he took a steamer for the south of France and proceeded to Monte Carlo. Here he settled down for the winter, but one night soon after his arrival, while on his way home from the Casino, where he had won a considerable sum, he was waylaid by siderable sum, he was wayland by some ruffians who had watched his good luck. They robbed him not only of his winnings but of his jewellery, letter of credit, and other papers. They stripped him and left him bleeding and insensible by the roadside, where he was found by the police some time after. He was taken to a police station, where his injuries were dressed, but as he claimed to have been robbed, which the police refused to believe, he was quickly turned out to find his way back to his lodgings as best he could. His landlady kept his wardrobe as security for his bill, but would not allow him to remain in the house, and the unfortunate man resolved therefore to go to Nice, where he had some friends. He started to walk, and en route stopped several persons, hoping to find someone speaking Euglish to whom he could tell his story. But his olothes being torn, his face bruised, and his general appearance most suspicious, he was regarded as a drunken beggar by those who un-derstood him, and all assistance was refused. Arriving at Nice he found refused. Arriving at Nice he found his friends gone, and he could get no one to listen to his story, much less believe it. Finally, the Nice police arrested him as a tramp, and as his explanations were unsatisfactory, and he was without a letter of paper proving his identity, he was not believed. The judge laughed at his story of the robbery, and gave him a month's imprisonment for alleged Unified Debt. months impresented to all a degree to begging and having no means of support. He served his term, and, having been liberated, tramped to Marseilles, where he called upon the American Consul, who shipped him home in the steerage of the Burgundia. The millionaire arrived in New York weak and emaciated after a long and disagreeable trip with his 485 fellow passengers. Hes ragged and unshaven, and thoroughly disgusted with his experience. He was found friends in New York, however, and is now in good honds.
