The latest that we hear of is that the Company is to be ousted from the handsome offices it had built for itself at the corner of calles 25 de Mayo and Treinta y Tres, the building passing to the hands of Sr. Garcia Mon in payment of a thrice renewed mortgage. We also understand that the Company will take refuge in the White Elephant or National Hotel, about the only property of importance now remaining to it of all its many rash and pretentious speculations. Apropos of this, some of our contemporaries have stated that the present building (we mean the one at the comer of 25 de Mayo and Treinta y Tres) will be acquired by the English Clab, for which it would certainly form very desirable premises, not inferior to those of any club in the city. We may state that although this idea has been mooted, nothing has yet been definitely settled, though we should certainly advise its being carried out if found to be within the bounds of possibility as regards terms. The present lodging of the club is hardly adequate for its needs and importance.






