MONTEVIDEO, FEBRUARY 2, 1892. A GOOD EXAMPLE. The Municipality teaches the Government a Lesson.

The Municipality of Montevideo is by no means an exceptionally brilliant or distinguished body, in fact we have no reason for imagining that its intelligence rises above the level or that the men composing it are more than average citizens, but for all that, it has done its duty towards the city and towards its creditors in a way which Government would do well to take for an example.

The Municipality, we may start by saying, is entirely independent of the Government in its finances, and has a revenue and budget of its own, as it also has its proper sphere of duties. At the same time it has more or less the same difficulties to struggle with, and is affected by the crisis in the same measure, or even worse, for it has not the same supreme authority for the enforcement of its commands or the collection of its debts.

Now, for a long time, and even during the first twelve months of crisis, whilst the Government was perpetually in trouble with its creditors, unable to pay its railway guarantees, in arrears with its local estimates, and in fact floundering on the verge of insolvency, whilst this was happening, the Municipality was perfectly solvent, its monthly bills were always punctually met, and, in short, it was a model debtor, and the very reverse of what the Government was. Example No. 1.

The loans obtained by the Government for specific purposes were not applied to those purposes, nor, indeed, has any clear account ever been given of how they have been applied. The Municipal loans—for city improvements—were duly applied to that purpose and no doubt has ever been raised as to the accounts. Example No. 2.

Government is always in a muddle with its Budget; either it is not presented in time, or else it is not sanctioned when it should be. At present it is practically working without any Budget at all. The Municipal Budget is always ready up to date, is properly drawn up, formally sanctioned, and adhered to as strictly as can be expected. Example No. 3.

Government, although in the greatest financial trouble, obstinately refuses to practice economy, it continues to waste money on cumbersome and yet inefficient administrative machinery, it issues military promotions as if it were in command of Fortunate's purse, and in fact only retrenches in its payment of its creditors. The Municipality, when it got into trouble, immediately introduced substantial economies, and its administrative machinery is not costly and is tolerably efficient. Example No. 4.

Government, when it found its revenue diminishing, instead of economising, imposed additional taxes to the detriment of commerce and industry. The Municipality has had to remain content with its former imposts, though they give a greatly diminished result. Example No. 5.

Government has done nothing for the development or assistance of the country, on the contrary it has in many cases directly retarded them. The departments under its control are chiefly notable for their inefficiency and rapid deterioration. The Municipality, on the other hand, though far from immaculate, does fulfil its duties fairly, it has done a great deal for the improvement and beautification of the city, and when the epidemic of small-pox came, it managed to vaccinate many thousands of persons gratis, and to supply

vaccine to the whole Republic as well as to parts of Argentina and Brazil. Example No. 6.

When the English Bank failed and the crisis became more intense, Government defaulted in the service of its foreign loan. So did the Municipality. But Government is forcing on its creditors, by discreditable means, an iniquitous arrangement in which priorities and guarantees are outraged, the reduction of interest made permanent when it only need be temporary, and the debt increased by the introduction of illegitimate matter. The Municipality is dealing with its creditors equably and not by force, it offers to treat with them honestly as a defaulting debtor should, not to dictate to them and insult them as has done the Government, and it proposes a reduction of interest on a sliding scale, eventually to return to its original rate, an arrangement which we should think the creditors will gladly accept. Example No. 7, and the best of all.

What the Municipality now proposes to do with its foreign obligations, the Government should have done at first; and we should then have never heard of the iniquitous Conversion scheme, and the credit of the Republic would not have been injured as it has been. But with the Government private interests are paramount and the credit of the Republic and the claims of its creditors are secondary considerations.

Altogether, then, there is a great deal that Government might learn with advantage from the Municipality, and although the latter, being human, is by no means perfect, there are not a few who think that it might supplant the present Government with decided benefit to the country.

FINANCIAL. CONVERSION OF THE FOREIGN DEBT. According to official statements the amount offered for Conversion here up to Saturday evening was \$7,126,610, represented 645 holders.

\$2,312,870 representing 276 holders remained to be presented, for which purpose the term was extended to yesterday. According to the same statement there has been no increase in the number protesting. So far, as Montevideo is concerned, then, there is no denying that the scheme has been accepted by a large majority.

We were unable to learn yesterday whether any definite news had arrived as to the amount offered for conversion in London. It was only vaguely asserted that there was a majority in favour.

We regret to notice that several of our native contemporaries have copied, and even made capital out of, the letter concerning the conversion which appeared in the Nacion of Buenos Aires, and which is evidently written by an interested party. As we have already said, it mainly consists of insults to the bondholders and dissenters translated from the Financial Times, and evidently entertains the purpose of raising bad blood between the Orientals and their creditors.

Not a few of its statements are directly contrary to the truth. The seriousness and importance of the opposition meeting of Dec. 17 were recognised by every paper in London from the Financial Times downwards, the Financial Times alone excepted.

will be published this morning. For all that, we have not heard of any convocation for the Chambers to resume the interrupted Debate. The interruption, originally made for one or two days to await replies to a telegram, has now lasted for a whole month, the debate having been broken off on Thursday, Dec. 31.

Gold Mining. A number of residents in Cañapiru, who have been working various claims on their own account with crushers lent them or hired from the San Gregorio Company, have presented a petition to the President of the Republic, protesting against the claims of Sr. Clemente Barral Posada, who claims ten per cent of all their proceeds. The petitioners ask that Government shall declare once for all that the rights claimed by Sr. Posadas have no legal foundation.

It is notorious that the litigious claims of Sr. Posadas form the chief obstacle to the development of gold mining in this country, where it should form an industry of great importance. This is by no means the first case in which it has been brought under notice. It is certainly incumbent on Government to take some steps to clear the matter and place it on a comprehensible basis.

Even if Sr. Posada's claims are well founded—which is open to question—it is absurd that he should thus obstruct the development of an important national industry.

The B. A. Standard has the following article on the completion of the extension of the Central of Uruguay Railway to Rivera, which it has chosen to christen "Grand Trunk Railway," on what authority we know not. The description of the country between Rivera and Paso de los Toros as a "howling wilderness" is a gross exaggeration, and does not in the least correspond with the reports we have received. Some account of the line and country appeared in our columns not long ago, on the occasion of the official visit of the Minister of Finance to the frontier. The extension will be open for general traffic very shortly, for if we are not mistaken, it has already received the necessary official inspection. The termination of the works is not so recent as the Standard assumes.

We received advices yesterday from Tacuarembó to the effect that the Grand Trunk Railway of Uruguay has been successfully completed by Mr. Robert Crawford and his staff of engineers, after 3 1/2 years of arduous labour, the line terminating at Rivera on the Brazilian frontier (Santa Ana), which point is distant from Montevideo 352 miles almost due north.

When the works were begun in August 1888, the Central Uruguay Railway reached no farther than Paso de los Toros, on the Rio Negro, 170 miles from Montevideo. The intervening country from there to Santa Ana was little better than a howling wilderness, destitute of roads, bridges or communication, and almost devoid of houses or population. The section now completed from Paso de los Toros to the frontier is 182 miles, and the difficulties attending the construction were of no common kind. One of the engineers writes us as follows:—

"We have had to cross numerous deep streams. The country is very rough, the works have been heavy, and we have suffered so much fatigue and exposure, in these three years, that we are glad we have reached the end. The heat has been much greater than anything we have known in the Argentine republic; last year often reaching 108 and sometimes 110 in the shade, and this year 90 to 95."

The immediate result of this Grand Trunk line to Brazil will be to open up a vast tract of fertile land hitherto comparatively valueless. If we include merely a zone of 10 leagues on either side of the section from Paso de los Toros to Santa Ana this will comprise an area of 1200 square leagues or 8,000,000 acres, which is little less than the area of Belgium; all this will now be brought within easy contact of Montevideo.

Some years ago we had occasion to make a journey with Mr. Jackson from Tacuarembó to Montevideo in a carriage, and such were the difficulties of the route that we were twelve days travelling 350 miles. By the railway now completed the journey can be done in twelve hours. Moreover, travelling will be much more secure than formerly, when "matrones" infested all the passes of the rivers. In a word the new line will bring civilization and progress.

As soon as the Rio Grande and Pelotas line reaches Santa Ana there will be direct railway communication between Montevideo and those two important cities of Southern Brazil. This will afford admirable facilities for trade, and possibly a considerable commerce in transit will be brought to Montevideo, which has more traffic with Europe than either of the Rio-Grandes ports.

Mr. Crawford has added another to the list of his engineering works. His first task, some 35 years ago, was in connection with the Victoria Bridge at Montreal. He came to

Buenos Ayres in 1864 to make the G. Southern Railway. He has since travelled and wrought in many parts of Europe. Contrary to the scriptural adage, he is highly honored in his own country. The university of Dublin has conferred on him a doctor's cap and the rank of Professor of Engineering; that of Cambridge has bestowed on him the degree of Master of Arts.

We congratulate him on having completed the Grand Trunk line of Uruguay, and only regret that he has not been able to visit the old friends in this city who know him and 30 years ago. Perhaps he may yet have time to come over here for a short time before his return to Europe; we promise him a hearty welcome.

SUNDRIES. The debut of the long announced Circus Company at the Politeama will take place on Wednesday evening with a varied programme in which many new artists and old favourites will appear. The performance, commencing at 9 p.m., will conclude with a comic ballet.

Amongst the deaths registered on Saturday we note that of John Daves (? Davies) N. American, bachelor, aged 60, in the Caridad Hospital, from Bright's disease.

There is no doubt whatever that every new manager who comes to run an enterprise is abler and wiser and better than any who have preceded or who are co-ordinate with him, but the trouble in the case arises from the fact that sometimes the public is stupid and cannot see or comprehend this superiority.—B. A. Herald.

The appointment of the new Captain of the Port is still in the clouds. It is whispered that President Herrera has made so many promises regarding the post, that now he is at a loss how to fulfil them. We hope it would not be considered disrespectful to compare him to a certain animal between the bundles of hay.

A report was circulated last week that the well-known officer Col. Pamillon, had died in his estancia. However he appeared in town yesterday and contradicted the report with success.

It is telegraphed from Buenos Aires that the introduction into the military camp at Maldonado of newspapers or other publications has been prohibited. We suppose it is not considered good that the soldiers should know what is going on in the world around them or that they should imbibe any opinions unfavourable to their masters. We believe a similar policy is pursued in Russia with regard to the Russian people. It is a good old policy, but hardly fit for the nineteenth century, nor has it ever yet proved successful, though it has been responsible for endless trouble and misery.

We hear that a new conflict has arisen between the Government and the Municipality respecting some directions recently issued respecting the slaughter houses, in which Government has revoked the resolution of the Municipality. It is said that the Board threatens to resign. Government remains where it was, and never thinks of any thing so weak as resignation.

The Basque fêtes opened on Sunday, but with a notable falling off from the animation of former years. Good order was preserved, but we think it would be well if some of the men were taught to be more decent in their style of dancing. Why is it Spanish dancing always verges on indecency?

We hear that a new weekly to be called El Sport will shortly be published to take the place of the defunct Jockey Club. It will be devoted to racing matters.

We regret to hear that the marines from the N. American gunboats continue to give trouble to the police, when allowed to come on shore.

limits between Chile and Argentina is again getting troublesome. Deputy Antonio Bachini has resigned his post on the editorial staff of the Dia, which he only recently joined. His reasons for doing so were purely personal.

Buenos Aires. The candidature of Dr. Roque Saenz Peña was proclaimed on Thursday in the Argentine Theatre at La Plata. Sr. Ramon L. Filcon presided, and speeches were delivered by him and Sres. Rufino Varela, Gabriel Larsen del Castaño, Eduardo Saenz, Manuel L. Miguens and Nicolás A. Calvo. The candidates then made his appearance. He thanked the meeting for the honour conferred on him, and made the usual promises as to the great benefits that he would confer on the country if elected. He really seems to take his candidature seriously, for he spoke with much emotion. During the proclamation in the theatre the people outside were amused with fireworks.

The Governor of Santa Cruz, Sr. Ramon Lista, has just returned from an expedition through Patagonia to the Andes, which has proved that the journey can be effected with carts and other vehicles. Sr. Lista is preparing to make another expedition to the same point at the end of next month.

The President of the Public Credit office reported to the Finance Minister yesterday that the exchange of National Bank shares for National Bonds closed with the following results: 213 holders of 93935 shares, including in these 3465 shares represented by 72 receipts for deposits. The Bank of London and Brazil has also petitioned for the acceptance of 2580 shares, which were sent from London before the Government decree was known and will be here at the end of the month. 400 shares of the private holders which came out in the Catalonia will be lodged to-morrow. Mr. Ramsey has also presented 238 shares for conversion belonging to the late Mr. Laco. In all 97153 shares offered for conversion at 50 per cent.—B. A. Herald.

The B. A. Standard calls attention to the remarkable fall in dry hides; the article which was worth \$8 to \$9 is now quoted at \$7, and lower if heavy lots must be sold off. The sale of hides to-day is difficult and it is understood that the new American tariff is the cause of the fall. From the beginning of this year dry hides must pay import duty in the United States, and it is a pity that the Argentine Foreign Office did not take timely steps to prevent this burden on the Argentine staple. Now it is too late. If we are not mistaken, Minister Pifkin informed the Argentine Government of the change of tariff many months ago; but nothing has been done to prevent the blow, and the fall in hides and stagnation in the market are the results of this deplorable indifference.

LONDON NOTES

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 31. Prince George of Wales was sufficiently well yesterday to undertake

the journey from London to Sandringham. He was accompanied by the Prince and Princess of Wales, the Duke of Clarence, and the Princesses Victoria and Maud.

Mr. Dillon and Mr. W. O'Brien, speaking in Dublin yesterday, referred to the recent Waterford election. The former commented also on Mr. Redmond's expressed wish to see Mr. Gladstone in office.

Last night a series of six fancy dress balls was successfully inaugurated at the Royal Opera House, Covent-garden. The building was for the first time lighted by electricity.

Mr. Comyns Carr's new comedy "Forgiveness" was produced at the St. James's Theatre last night, and was favourably received.

A daring jewel robbery, reported to have taken place at Richings Park, near Colnbrook, is engaging the attention of the Slough police. Whilst the occupants were at dinner access was gained to the bedroom storey, the doors on the ground floor having first been securely fastened from without, and tripping strings having been stretched across the pathways and lawn.

The Indian National Congress at the opening of yesterday's sitting at Nagpur decided to despatch a telegram to Mr. Gladstone congratulating him on entering his eighty-third year.

We learn from Warsaw that about fifty persons, among whom are four women, are kept prisoners in the citadel on suspicion of being members of secret societies.

A Naples Correspondent telegraphs that a report has been made to the British Consul which goes to prove that the English lady found dead on Christmas night in the Via Tasso was outraged and died of fright or was forcibly suffocated.

Hurst Park Old Year Meeting was continued yesterday, there being but a limited attendance. Field Marshal won the Middlesex Hunt Steeplechase Plate, Lismore the Westpool Hunter's Plate, Handley Cross the Selling Hunters' Hurdle Plate, Ansoonda the Christmas Handicap Hurdle Plate, and Serena the Wolsey Selling Hurdle Handicap.

Inquests were held yesterday by Mr. Wyatt, Coroner South-East London, upon the bodies of two persons who were drowned in the Surrey Commercial Docks during the recent fog.
