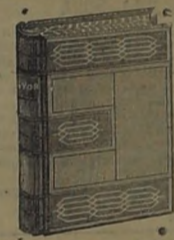

A Girl of the Period. (A STORY.) BY MRS. OLIPHANT. (Continued)
Mr. Edward Dewsbury had attained an honour upon which he was not born when he put on the wig and gown of a barrister and acquired the right to plead in Her Majesty's Courts of Law. He kept a discreet silence as to his antecedents, and nobody had ever heard him make any local allusions such as could identify one district rather than another as having been the place of his birth. There was indeed one person whom he spoke of sometimes as his guardian, sometimes as 'the friend who brought me up,' whose name was to be found among the names of other recognized persons, a Mr. Fleete, of some name or other, whom he visited occasionally. It is true that he had allowed to Blanche Fontaine in a moment when he was off his guard, that he had sisters; but she did not repeat this to trouble anybody's preconceived ideas and the general opinion entertained of Dewsbury was that he was an orphan whose estate or property had been left in Mr. Fleete's hands.
