The duplex system of working has been satisfactorily established on the Lisbon-Madeira cable laid in 1892, and upon the Madeira-St. Vincent and St. Vincent-Pernambuco cables laid in 1884, thus very materially increasing the carrying capacity of the company's line. The various sections of the company's line are in good working order.

Financial. Our contemporaries are still full of rumours and reports relative to the new Bank, but as Mr. Noetzlin refuses to give any definite information, these must not be accepted as trustworthy. The Government organ the Nación confines itself to the syllabic statement that "the Bank will come." We can, however, guarantee, from authentic sources, the statement that every reasonable effort will be made to induce local capital to take an interest in the bank, for the which purpose Government influence will necessarily be minimized; and that once the statutes are approved and the minor difficulties with Government settled, there will be no loss of time in starting the Bank, the capital being ready. Although there is still, and for strong reasons, a considerable amount of reserve about the business, we think we are qualified to say that affairs look more satisfactory than was at first anticipated and that the adverse rumours are not founded.

LONDON NOTES FRIDAY, APRIL 22. Probably thirty thousand persons yesterday witnessed the funeral of the Rev. Dr. Allon. The first part of the ceremony took place in Union Chapel, Islington and was attended by a remarkably representative gathering of Nonconformists, in addition to a number of Church of England clergymen. The institutions represented numbered nearly forty. The Rev. W. H. Harwood, recently appointed co-pastor with Dr. Allon, the Rev. Dr. Reynolds, the Rev. Dr. Dyke, the Rev. J. Guinness Rogers, and Prebendary Calthrop officiated in the church, while at Abney Cemetery, where the interment took place, the ceremony was conducted by Mr. Harwood, the Rev. Dr. Booth (secretary of the Baptist Union), and the Rev. Brooke Lambert, vicar of Greenwich.

His brother took charge of the body for burial. The "golden" wedding of the veteran King and Queen of Denmark was celebrated on Thursday with great pomp. All the European courts and especially England, were represented.

LONDON NOTES

FRIDAY, APRIL 22. During the past few days the United States Democrats have been holding State Conventions for the election of delegates to the National Convention which is to nominate the party's candidate for the Presidency. The delegates chosen, are all favourable to Mr. Cleveland, and his nomination is thus almost certain. The Republican Conventions are generally in favour of Mr. Harrison, although in many cases with some reserve.

Dr. Danford Thomas opened an inquest yesterday on the bodies of the eight persons who lost their lives in the accident at Hampstead Heath railway station on Easter Monday. Witnesses were pretty well agreed in the opinion that the ticket collector's box at the bottom of the staircase formed a serious obstruction, and the interest chiefly centred upon the question whether or not the gates at the foot of the stairs were closed or open. On this point there was much conflicting testimony.

Another horrible crime has been committed in the department of Canelones, close to the scene of the sensational murders of last month. A respectable working man named Juan Repetto was found on Thursday, near his house, with his head split open in two places by a hatchet and with ten stabs in his body. The murderer is known to be a young man named Pedro Pereira, aged about 23, who was living with a neighbour, and who has since fled to Minas where the police are looking out for him.

The popular Zarzuela "La Tempestad" will be given at the Cibils Theatre this evening. The fixtures for this afternoon are polo at La Union at 3 p. m., and a practice football match on the Albion ground at Punta Carretas. We are unaware of any fixture on the cricket ground.

The audacious thief G. S. Oliveira, who took advantage of his position as clerk to a Judge of the Peace, to commit a large number of jewel and other robberies, extending over three or four years, and who was detected and arrested several months ago, was quickly released on bail, thanks to influential friends. He has fled to Buenos Aires and now that he is wanted for trial laughs at the police. The reader may supply the moral.

The jockey Sebastian Birriel, who was injured in the races on Wednesday, died from the effects on Friday. A subscription for his widow has already been opened.

Mr. Gladstone, in a letter welcoming the adoption of candidates for Hereford city and county, dwells upon the importance, after the deliberate consideration of the last six years, of bringing the Irish controversy to a close, and also of dealing with the claims of the rural labourers from one end of the island to the other.

Sir Lewis Pelly, Conservative M. P. for North Hackney, died at Falmouth yesterday from an affection of the heart. He was 67 years of age. Owing to the determined attitude of both claimants and men, there is but little hope of an immediate settlement of the Durham miners' strike.

A Newcastle correspondent reports that the engineers' strike in the north has ended in a complete surrender by the men, who have accepted all the employers' terms. The strike has cost the men about \$3,000.

The prospects of arbitration in the South and East Lancashire cotton trade disputes are considered to have improved. Both sides are ready to arbitrate on the subject of the strike at Stalybridge; but the question of dismissing those who stopped into the strikers' places still remains. Excitement continues at Stalybridge.

A telegram from Simla states that the Indian Government has thrown open to natives a number of higher posts in the Civil Administration, including judgeships, magistracies, and under-secretariats. The salaries attached to these posts range from five hundred to two thousand rupees per month.

bulloff. The Bulgarian Premier threatened to break off diplomatic relations. With the exception of the Minister of Finance, whose resignation has been accepted by King Humbert, the members of the Italian Cabinet retain their portfolios, and the crisis at Rome is at an end. It is stated that the Ministers have decided upon the means by which they propose to make good the deficit in the Budget.

Numerous arrests of Anarchists took place yesterday in Paris and other centres in France. The authorities have adopted this means of ridding the community of the agitators to whose methods the recent dynamite outrages belong. Of a total of 122 arrests, 60 were in Paris. All the prisoners are Frenchmen.

Deeming was yesterday brought before the Criminal Court at Melbourne on an application to postpone the trial, which is fixed for Monday. The Court would only grant a postponement till Thursday.

Samuel Chishler, a clerk, was brought before the magistrate at Marlborough-street yesterday on a charge of attempting to obtain 2/15s from Mr. Vogel, proprietor of the Hotel Albemarle, Piccadilly, by sending him a telegram from Victoria Station in the name of the Marquis of Tweeddale, asking him to pay a bill. Mr. Vogel, knowing that the Marquis was in Paris, gave the prisoner into custody when he called with the bill. Mr. Newton granted a remand for a week, saying that he should send the case for trial.
