WRECK OF A BRAZILIAN IRONCLAD. 118 drowned. Telegrams received late yesterday afternoon from Bocha announce the late of Deluging of the Bra Telegrams received late yesserday afternoon from Rocha announce the total wreek, off Polonio, of the Bra-zilian Ironelad «Solimões», which was to Matto Grossi to utflocate the revolution there. The cause of the wreck was not mentioned, but it is stated that of all the orew of 123 only four mariners and a steward have been saved. The exact spot of the disaster was off Punta Negra de Castilloi, Island of Polonio. The vessel was commanded by captain Javier de Castro, who is amongst the lost. It was built in the Seins in 1875, had two amoured turrets and four guns. Her capacity was 8640 tons. The tig «Emperce» left for the scene of the disaster yester-day afternoon, taking the 2nd Com-mandant of the Brazilian gunboat «Cavicas» in port, a representative from the Brazilian consulate and two coast pilots. 


