

LONDON NOTES

FRIDAY, MAY 20.

In the House of Lords yesterday, Lord De Ramsey informed Lord Norton that the Government intended at an early date to introduce in the other House legislation for consolidating and amending the Reformatory and Industrial Schools Acts.

In the Commons, Admiral Field withdrew his proposed new clause, and the Eastbourne Improvement Act Amendment Bill was read a third time. The order for Committee on the Superannuation Act Amendment (No. 2) Bill was discharged, that the Bill might be referred to a Select Committee. The debate on the motion for the second reading of the Irish Local Government Bill was then commenced. Mr. Sexton moved the rejection of the Bill. The Attorney-General for Ireland replied for the Government, and the debate was carried on by Mr. Rathbone, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Webb, Mr. Cobhill, Mr. Blane, Mr. Ambrose, Mr. Labouchere, Mr. Wyndham, and Mr. Herbert Gladstone. At midnight it was adjourned.

Mr. Gladstone and Mr. John Morley both attended the meeting of the Standing Committee on Law yesterday. It is to this Committee that the Clergy Discipline (Immortality) Bill has been referred, but progress hitherto has been slow, the Government having shown lukewarmness about their own Bill. Mr. Gladstone opposed a number of amendments, though they were proposed by Liberals. One or twice, when Tory members intervened, the proceedings were of an animated character.

Writing to Mr. George Slipton, secretary to the London Trades Council, Mr. Gladstone reverts to a passage in his recent letter on the eight hours question, and says he should be glad to be put in possession of documents by the Trades Council in order both to enlarge his knowledge of the subject and assist him in giving it consideration.

Lady Aberdeen presided at a Conference of the Women's Liberal Federation and other ladies at the Memorial Hall yesterday, when resolutions were passed in favour of a reform of the Poor Laws, the abolition of the property qualification for Poor Law Guardians, further legislation for the protection of infant life, and the prohibition by law of child life insurance. Mrs. Ormiston Chant presided at the afternoon Conference, when discussions took place on the opium traffic, peace and arbitration, and mining royalties. Lady Stevenson suggested that royal courts should be established.

A public meeting took place last evening at the lecture hall of the West Southwark Liberal and Radical Club, when Sir Charles Russell, Q. C., M. P., gave an address in advocacy of Home Rule for Ireland and for London. Mr. R. K. Causton, M. P., and others, took part in the proceedings.

The Judicial Committee of the Privy Council yesterday considered the petition of the convict Deeming for a respite of sentence, in order to admit of the hearing of his appeal and in the result dismissed it.

A Correspondent at Middlesbrough devotes a letter to a description of the condition of the inhabitants of a number of villages in that district. Roughly speaking there are six thousand ironstone miners, and another thousand limestone quarriers whose employment are interdependent. With their wives and families it is estimated that 37,000 persons in these villages are now dependent upon public and private charity, and that charity alone stands between them and absolute starvation.

At the meeting for the School Board for London yesterday attention was called to the mortality from measles amongst children. It was decided to send a letter to the Country Council asking them to take steps in order that measles should, as far as London is concerned, be deemed a notifiable infectious disease. From Poplar came a request that the Board's influence should be exercised to make the ferry across the river free for poor school children of the district so that they could cross the river and benefit their health by visits to Greenwich Park. A letter and petition relating to the question of corporal punishment were referred to a committee. The question of temperance was discussed, and it was decided that the Board should petition Parliament in favour of the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors to Children Bill.

A telegram from Mauritius brings news of a disastrous hurricane which raged there on the 29th ult. Great loss of life is reported, and the destruction to shipping and other property was unprecedented in the island. A large number of vessels were stranded, of which several were still aground at the time the telegram was despatched.

The floods on the Missouri River, in America, have caused disastrous loss of life and great destruction to property. It is estimated that some 8,000 people have been driven from their homes in Sioux City, Iowa. It is feared that from sixty to a hundred persons have lost their lives in that part of the country.

Misses Brock made their first display of fireworks for the season at the Crystal Palace last evening under favourable conditions, the great set piece being a fine picture of the wreck of the Eider.

First-class county cricket was commenced yesterday, Sussex meeting Lancashire at Manchester. In the first innings the home team were dismissed for 55 and the visitors for 72, Lancashire then running up a score of 131 for four wickets. In London, the M.C.C. and Ground put on 141 for nine wickets against

Notes at Lords; and at the Oval Surrey scored 181 against Leicestershire, who lost three wickets for 38. At Oxford, the Gentlemen of England completed a first innings for 260, the University losing two wickets for 84. Yorkshire had the better of the day's play with Essex at Dewbury.

At Newmarket, yesterday, Mr. Combe secured the Bedford Plate with Bill of Portland, and Mr. Charlton the Payne Stakes with May Duke. The Dyke Plate went to Mr. Charlton's Lady Bob, the Selling Plate for Two-year-olds to Mr. Lawrence's Smock Frock, the Selling Plate for Three-year-olds and upwards to Mr. Ryan's Evergreen, the Third Welter Handicap to Mr. Cooper's Dorcas, and the Flying Handicap to Sir R. Jardine's Lady Primrose.

Mr. Justice Hawkins and a special jury yesterday commenced the hearing of the case of Coghill v. Bonaparte, in which the plaintiff, a medical man, seeks to recover fees for professional attendance upon Mrs. Clovis, who claims to be the wife of the defendant, and upon the defendant himself. Serious allegations were brought to the notice of the Court.

Mr. de Rutzen dealt at Westminster yesterday with summonses in which on the one hand Lieut. Gordon Moffitt, of the Army Service Corps, and a young lady whose name appeared on the summons as Lilian Gordon, were charged with assaulting William Y. Devonport, a medical practitioner, of Pimlico; while, on the other, Mr. Devonport was charged with assaulting the lady. The circumstances of the case were most singular, and it came out during the hearing that the lieutenant had just been quietly married to the lady unknown to his friends. Ultimately the charges against Lieutenant and Mrs. Moffitt were dismissed, and Mr. Devonport was fined £5 with the alternative of a month's hard labour.

The Rev. Robert K. Bell, who was curate in charge of Little Bedwyn, was again before the Hungerford magistrates yesterday, on the charge of indecently assaulting two young ladies when riding on the Great Western railway. Evidence in the case of Miss Abory, a lady clerk, was heard, and the prisoner, who pleaded not guilty, being committed for trial at the Quarter Sessions. Bail was allowed.

The Vicar of Stratford-on-Avon objects to the haste with which the Trustees of Shakespeare's birthplace concluded the bargain whereby the reputed cottage of Anne Hathaway's parents at Shottery has been acquired for the sum of 3,000l. America, however, was in the field; and although Mr. Arbuthnot doubts whether any Barnum would have been prepared to take the cottage at that price for removal to America, the Trustees seem to have taken a more flattering view of American enterprise. The Chicago Exhibition was notoriously coveting the cottage, and it appears that this was the determining cause of the Trustees' decision.

More than twenty thousand persons visited Shakespeare's birthplace last year, and of these, roughly speaking, three-fourths inscribed their names with indications of their nationalities in the visitors' book. From the analysis, which it is the custom of the Trustees to prepare on those occasions, it appears that the British Isles contributed to these figures 9,549 persons, America 5,385, Australia 174, Canada 121, Germany 91, and Holland 24. Then come Africa 23, Austria 4, Belgium 3, Brazil 4, China 10, Denmark 2, Egypt 3, Fiji Islands 2, France 41, India 28, Italy 31, Japan 1, New Zealand 34, Norway 4, Roumania 1, Russia 9, Spanish Islands 1, Spain 5, Sweden 2, Switzerland 6, and West Indies 4.

Bargaining between stockbroker and client through the telephone is a process that obviously requires a distinct enunciation at the one end and a quick ear at the other. Mr. Wildigg, a varnish manufacturer at Coventry, 'crang up' his stockbrokers, Messrs. Willis and Co., in Birmingham, and requested them to buy him thirty shares in a local company for a price agreed and Mr. Wildigg is positive that he added the words 'cum dividend.' The stockbroker's clerk, on the other hand, is positive that he never heard those words, though as a dividend was then falling due at the handsome rate of ten per cent. They were certainly important. If Mr. Wildigg's memory is not at fault, it was hard that he should be held liable to accept the shares ex dividend, but unfortunately for him there is a rule of the Stock Exchange determining the date at which stocks and shares shall be assumed to be sold 'ex dividend' in the absence of a special agreement. On this and other grounds, the judge of the Birmingham County Court has given a verdict for the stockbrokers which virtually holds Mr. Wildigg to their version of the bargain.

DISASTROUS HURRICANE AT MAURITIUS. A telegram from Mauritius, dated 7th May, received via Colombo, states: Disastrous hurricane on 29th April of unprecedented force and destruction to property. Very much damage done to shipping in harbour. Majority of vessels stranded.

Western half of Port Louis devastated. Crop very much damaged. Estimated reduction 50 per cent. Mortality from casualties and distress appalling.

Steamer Pentakota, touched on reef, has got off slightly damaged. Steamer Umballa arrived 21st April, got ashore, has got off slightly damaged. Strathely, Leander, Aconagua, Queen of Scots, Eurydice, Parima (? Sierra Parima), Amaranth, Gladstone still aground.
