And in addition to that the contributions to special funds have been nearly £9,000, against £5 400 in the previous year, so that, putting aside the question of double traction on account of the locusts, and putting aside the question of floods on the San José branch, the actual expenses are less this last vear by £9,000. Now, I do not think we ought to pass that over without saying a word in praise of Mr. Henderson and his associates. Of course, when I assumed the duties of Chairman of this line the work was in a great measure unfamiliar to me, but I can say now, alter the experience of twelve months, I have never seen more sympathetic and more cordial co-operation than there is exhibited by the staff in Monte-video for the interests of the Rail way when it is in trouble and diffculty. The slightest indication on our part is always met in the most spontaneous manner by them, and no stone is left unturned by them to take advantage to economise and minimise bad results. When the real working of the Railway was known up to December 31st really the worst of the bad times had not set in -we were able ot carry a very good sum torward and still pay a dividend of 1 2 per cent. which at that time seemed really quite safe. I can assure you'it has been no small comfort to the Board, having regarded to the news that they had nad transmitted to them week by week during the second half of the year, to find that money has really been earned and that we have still a small balance to carry forward. With regard to the capital expenditure, outside what has been made on the Central Station at Montevideo which is now completed and finished. no works of any importance have been under-taken, as the Company has not been in a position to do so. The Central Station was duly completed and delivered over to traffic on July 15th. There was a certain irony in the station being finished and open

His forge greatly prospered owing to the coal he burning wood He becamethe great Walloon ironmaster of his day. The first coal fire was kindled by him in the smithy in 1197. In 1228 him in the smithy in 1197. In 1228 his charcoal was burned by all the blacksmiths of Liege and Brabant. The French were not alive to the use of coal before the 14th century, but the Dukes of Burgundy were. The collieries of Anzin were not, however, discovered before 1734. The discoverer is buried in the church of Ladinsart, in the Pas-de Calais. His tombstone testifies that he sunk the first pit at Anzin.

-A London telegram repeats a rumor that Lord Salisbury will resign the Secretaryship of Foreign Affairs in favor of the Marquis of Lansdowne, at present Secretary of War, but will retain the premiership. The report com s from the *F* nancial Post which is hardly a high political authority.

-The Brazilian Chambers have approved the proposal of the Gov-ernment to proclaim a state of siege -now that the excitement is calming down.

-A duel was fought at Monte Carlo, on Wednesday, between Sir Robert Peel and the Duke of Ceriola (Italian) over a dispute in the Casino. The telegram omits to state the result.

-In the Penitentiary at Buenos Aires two prisoners have been kill-ed by a sentinel who fired on them with his rifle on account of some of fensive remarks One of the victims was ayoung man imprisoned for a petty offence, and who is said to have been no party to the affair. It is to be hoped the sentinel will be tried for murder. This is another example of the cheapness of life in the River Plate.

-The Peruvian Congress has at last approved a Law recognising marriages by other than Catholic rites in the Republic, but it is feared that the Executive, under Catholic influences, will veto it.

He feared that the projected vote would not get further than the presentation of an illuminated address from the Prim-rose League. The dominant note of the Government's domestic pol-icy had been the preferential en-dowment of particular interests at dowment of particular interests at the general expense. He declared that the retention of Chitral had that the retention of Chillai had had precisely the effect that Lord Salisbury said its abandonment would have - namely, detriment to tribes lying between occupied ground and the outer frontier. Speaking of the South Africa in-quiry, he said that the withholding of documents was discreditable and humiliating to the conduct of and humiliating to the conduct of public affairs.

Dr. Berry delivered his presiden-tial address at the first session of the Congregational Union at Bir-mingham yesterday. Many sub-jects were referred to in it, amongst-them the changed attitude of them the changed attitude of Christians on matters of science and theology, and the contraction of ecclesiasticism. 
