LONDON NOTES

Deputations from the Corporation of Edinburgh, the University of Edinburgh, and the Church of Scotland waited on the Queen yesterday at Balmoral, and presented congratulatory addresses on her Diamond Jubilee on the part of those bodies.

The Duke of Devonshire yesterday laid the foundation stone of the Diamond Jubilee Chapel in connection with the Giggleswick school. In the course of a brief address he expressed the hope that secondary schools would shortly receive more attention from the general public than hitherto.

Lord George Hamilton, speaking at the final meeting of the Indian Famine Fund, held at the Mansion House yesterday, under the chairmanship of the Lord Mayor, said that the famine, the most serious of the century, was now gradually leaving the territories of India.

Speaking at Macclesfield last evening on Christian Socialism, the Bishop of Chester said it claimed that Christian principles must influence business and pleasure, home and foreign relations, the action of the State, and the action of individuals.

Amongst the addresses delivered at yesterday's session of the Baptist Union at Plymouth was one by the Rev. G. Hawker on the attitude of Baptists towards Romanism. They were, he declared, as good Protestants as ever, although their temper had grown milder; but they were determined at all hazards to uphold the Protestant succession to the throne.

Religious teaching in the Field Lane Day Industrial School was discussed yesterday at the meeting of the School Board for London. It was decided that correspondence on the subject should be forwarded to the Home Secretary, and that in the meantime the children should be sent to the school in the ordinary course.

The annual provincial meeting of the Incorporated Law Society was continued at Sheffield yesterday, when the year's report was presented. Papers were read on Dilatory Defences, Registration of Debentures, Prisoners as Witnesses, Libel and Slander, and County Court Procedure.

At yesterday's sittings of the National United Temperance Convention, held at the Memorial Hall, the two subjects discussed were, "How to prevent addition and obtain reduction in licensed facilities for drinking," and "How to secure a better enforcement of the licensing laws."
