Mr. R Bridger, Manager of the River Plate Land and Farming Co. at Los Merinos has consulted the Rural Association as to what claim he can make under the following circumstances: -In March last, a number of the Paysandu Cavary, commanded by Gerardo Fernandez, entered the Company's lands, cutting the wire fences in all direccutting the wire lences in all directions, killing withoutleave two cows of 3/4 blood and a call of 7/8 blood, encamping at the side of an artificial hill, burning several bundles ciai hill, burning several bundles of cut willows, and, worst of all, cutting down, in order to build their tents, some hundreds of imported trees, such as ash, oak, acacia, oak, etc., these being the only ones saved out of several thousands imported and after many years of labour; the wire fencing being cut some three hundred times between March and hundred times between March and September, often two or three times in the same square and even at the side of large unlocked gates. The claim, which will pro-bably be referred to the Classifying Commission confirms what a Camp Correspondent recently said in our columns about the entirely wanton and unnecessary damages done by the troops during the war. No won-der the estancieros in the interior

are in dread of a fresh outbreak Remembering such things as the above, it is not pleasant to learn from our contemporaries that there is a very uneasy feeling in various parts of the interior and especially in the Northof the Republic Obscure as is the outlook in the capital, the dread of a fresh revolution is said to be much more imminent there and is producing the consequent effects of the stagnation of all business and enterprise. It is even said, though we cannot help thinking this exaggerated, that the laboring classes are ugain emigrating or hiding themselves in the fear of being called upon for forced military service, and that this has been accentuated by the convocation of the National Guard. The latter appears to us quite un-reasonable, as it has been very dis-tinctly stated that the convocation is confined to the Capital. Anyhow, the blame must be entirely attribut-

cause of alarm and of revolutionary fears The obscurity of the political situation continues as great as ever and our contemporaries have almost abandoned comment as hopeless. Referring to the chaos both of the situation and of public opinion the Telegrafo Maritimo says: - «Meanwhile the laboring country, the country that impatiently awaits the arrival of February 15 in order to see a definite situation which will also permit it to adopt a definite resoluion, only sees in the horizon of this Republic an accumulation of dense clouds, and fears that the first electric spark may let loose the tempest. But although this is the general fear, it is true that there are some persons who, whether it is that they are more short-sighted or that they contem plate more calmly, believe that all this political confusion, which apparently threatens such grave events, will conclude tranquilly enough, perhaps by an embrace between the rival elements of the dominant party, as family quarrels generally do conclude It would not be the first time that this has happened in our short political history, but, be that as it may, and overlooking the character which the solution of the present problem may have it is undeniable that the country desires a prompt conclusion, for the atmosphere is already too heavily charged for the farmer, the merchant, the producer or the worker to live in it without thinking seriously in the supreme resources prompted by their own salvation, the first of these resources being flight from a land without horizon for work and for a tranquil life. Like those diseases which attack different organs in succession, the situation through which we are passing is affecting our entire economic organ heavily charged for the farmer, the

of the country, financial decay, as already seen in the arrears of nine monthly budgets. Before these facts which are plainly visible to all the inhabitants of the country, and before the perspect-tive formed by doubts and lears, it is not surprising that only a very limited satisfaction has been formed by an abundant harvest of wheat and wool, and that the backwardness in the work of the salade-ros throughout the River Plate has produced somewhat exaggerated alarms. To day everyone looks on the gloomy side, and the worst of it is that both reason and logic assure them that they judge correctly.

THE BRITISH SAILOR AND THE BRITISH NAVY.

It has ever been a favourite occupation with philosophic speculators to discuss the pros and cons of the conditions which would or might obtain did we become engaged in a dispute with some powerful maritime State. The usual form which this mental problem takes is whether or no the British Fleet would be sufficient to protect our commerce, and also, if the vessels themselves were adequate to the task, could we obtain the requisite men to place the Navy on a thoroughly efficient war footing. Now, such brain searching as this is not only interesting, it is useful, for it accustoms the public mind to grasp hypothetical situations which some day or other may be converted into stern reality. The return recently issued by the Registrar-General of Shipping throws an important sidelight on the number and occupation of the men engaged in the British Mercantile Marine, and from this data a writer in the United Service Majazine proceeds to discuss the extent to which these crews would be available for the British Fleet in case of emergency.

From the return above mention-

ed it is calculated that there would

be employed, or available for employment, in the British Merchant Service between the ages of 16 and 45 a total of 125.8 0 officers and men. In case of a naval war, how ever, all merchant shipping would not lie up. We would still be depend ent upon over-sea supplies of food and raw materials, and foreign customers would still continue to purchase our manufactures and coals. There would, obviously, be a very serious interference with the transaction of this commerce, and the foreign going sailing vessel particularly would perforce be compelled to lie snugly in port. This means that two and a quarter million tons of sail would remain in enforced idleness until peace was restored With regard to steam tonnage, too, the slow vessels would necessarily cease running and thus the calculation is made that were we engaged, let us say, with France and Russia, something like three million tons of British shipping would cease to earn freights, while France and Russia would each reduce their sea going tonnage by 250,000 tons. Assuming, therefore, that the withdrawal from the active list would be what we have stated there would be available, after the wants of the merchant tomage were supplied, a paper reserve for warships of 6,000 officers and 30,000 men. But such figures as this must be accepted guardedly, for granted that a section of our mercantile fleet continued, or attempted to continue, its work, it is obvious that more hands would be carried, and also that the enhanced remuneration offering would ensure that the pick of the merchant sailors would still be employed on merchant vessels.

The next question, of course, which comes up for settlement is whether this reserve is adequate, i.e. is it equal to the combined for-French navy is credited with a personnel of 40,00), and in addition has a reserve of 90,000 to fall back upon, while Russia can boast 86 000 men plus a reserve of 10,000 Great Britain, to meet these possibly hostile forces, has 100,000 men in her navy and a reserve force of 26,000. BUENOS AIRES.

After this there occurred a fire in Piedras hetween Sadi Carnot and Billinghurst which at one time threatened to burn down the station of the Anglo-Argentine Tramway Company at the Once. The firemen have been more than ordinarily busy during the last few weeks. No one seem to be able to explain the cause of so many fires and insurance companies are no doubt not a little puzzled.

Consequently, the police were put on the track and have succeeded in discovering that a guard on one of the lines had a large quantity of the false coins in his possession, which he served out to unsuspecting passengers one at a time, and thus put consider-able quantities in circulation during the day. In India it had made their army a more effective weapon of war than it had ever been before. Presenting to Sir John Hutton, in

the County Council's library Spring gardens, a portrait of the gentle-man, suscribed for by the great majority of members of the Council the Earl of Rosebery yesterday spoke of the work of that body as chiefly hard work done in com-mittee rooms and little known to the public. However bighly placed the Council's critics might be, however great their talents and experience, they should vow at the altar they most cherished to serve six months in the Council before they expressed an opinion on it again. The portrait, immediately given by Sir John Hutton to the Council, will remain in the library.

Professor Gabriel Lippmann, of the Sorbornne, explained and demonstrated his process of colour photography last evening at the Society of Arts, to the members of the Royal Photographic Society. The Earl of Crawford presided.

Mr. Leonard Courtney, in his presidential address to the Royal Statistical Society yesterday, dealt with the question of Coal Supply in this country. There was, he held, convincing proof that the prophe sies contained in Professor Jevon's book were being justified by ex-perience. As to foreign competi-tion, Mr. Courtney endorsed the recently expressed views of Mr. Ritchie, that this country had more to fear from the United States than from Germany.

After the engineering delegates had reported the result of the ballot to the Federated Employers at yes terday's resumed conference, a sub-committee was elected, consisting of three representatives of either side, to draw up a new basis of settlement in place of the employ-ers's ultimatum Such progress was made before the sitting terminated in the evening that an optimistic official report was drafted for publication, and sanguine expectations were expressed as to an early termination of the dispute.

Dover Castle was yesterday the cene of a fire, which is described has occurred in the town for some years. The flames broke out about 41 3/4. ten o'clock in the morning, and it was half past two before they were got under control. By that time the officers' quarters were burnt down. The local fire brigade, the soldiers, and the police cooperated in the work of subduing the confla-

The cricket match between Mr. Stoddart's team and an eleven of All Australia was continued yester day at Sydney. Hirst increased his over night to 62 before being dismissed, and after some remarknble cricket the innings closed for 551, Ranjitsinhji with 177 being last man out. At the close of play the Australians had lost five wick ets for 86 runs.

Judgment was delivered in the House of Lords yesterday in the case of Allen v. Flood and Taylor, which raised a question of vital importance to trade union organiza tions. It was whether action would lie against a man or body of men for inducing a master to dismiss a workman in his employment on the ground that he was not a member of a particular trade union. By a majority of six to three the law lords held that, in the absence of malice, the action-would not lie, and accordingly they reversed the judgment of the Court below, and

sustained the appeal with costs.

Sentences were passed at the
Central Criminal Court yesterday upon the two men, Krahn and Alford, for what are known as the City bucketshop frauds. Krahn was sent to penal servitude for four years. Alford getting nine months' imprisonment with hard labour.

At Bow-street Pocice court yesterday, Colonel Frederick Howell, Thomas Cory, and Harry Ellis Collins, directors and manager of the National Bank of Wales (Limit ed), were charged on remand with misappropriation of the funds of the bank. Evidence was given concerning Messrs. Pugh, Jones and Co., and their amalgamation with the National Bank of Wales. and the defendants were committed for trial, bail being allowed as






