WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 15. Further details are to hand of the hard fighting in which General Lockhart's force has been engaged, on its advance through the Bara Valley. In addition to the casualties already reported, Lieutenant West of the 3rd Gurkhas was killed during an attack on General Westmacott's rearguard. The weather has been terribly severe, but the troops have behaved splendidly.
