Same month, 1895 These receipts show an improve ment of some \$66 000 on those for the same month in 1896. and although considerably below those for December, 1895, are slightly above those for the same month in 1894 and 1898. In the table of Customs Receipts published in our issue of Tuesday last, the receipts for December were given approximately at \$750,000, instead of the \$798, 882.31 they really reach. This difference of \$48.882 will bring the total for the year 1897 up to \$8.5. 159 as against \$10,304,436 in 1896 and \$10,624,625 in 1895.

RECEPTION OF THE UNITED STATES MINISTER.

The Official reception of the new United States Minister to this Re-public, Mr. William R. Finch, took place on Tuesday afternoon, the retiring Minister Mr. Granville Stuart at the same time presenting his letter of recall.

Messrs. Finch and Stuart were escorted to the Government House from the Hotel Central by the 1st Official of Foreign Affairs, Sr. Hordenana, the aide de camp Col. Turenne, and the Presidential Escort. They were received in the audience chamber by the Pre sident Sr. (uestas, who was accompanied by his Ministers, the Chief of the Staff and his adjutants, the Chief of the garrison. corps and other officers, and the heads of various public depart

Mr. Granville Stuart said; «I now place in Y E's hands my letter of recall, and present person-ally my worthy successor Mr. W. B. Finch who will place in your hands his credentials as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the United States near
the Government of Uruguay. I.

dent McKinley to strengthen the
friendly sentiments which at present handly axist between Hard sent happily exist between Uru-guay and the United States. Further telegrams state that the catastrophe at London (Canada occurred during a political meeting on the upper floor of the Town Hall, attenned by some 2000 persons. Owing to the breaking of a beam, the platform gave way, and some 200 persons fell through, breaking through the floor of the mayor's offices below, and landing in the cellar. To comand landing in the cellar. To comand landing in the cellar. To complete the catastrophe, a heavy safe and a stove tell upon the mass. Some 28 persons, mostly prominent citizens, were killed and over 100 injured. The panic in the Hall was terrible The city is in general mourning and all the shops closed.

-In banking circles in London there is some talk of a vast plan for reorganizing the finances of Spain, now in course of formation by the Sagasta Cabinet, the principal points of which have been already communicated to the house of Rothsc ild, in order to ascertain if it can undertake the floating of a loan. The greater part of the funds so obtained would be devoted to the construction of ressels of war. and the purchase of armament for the land forces in view of the possibility of a rupture with the United States

-Bishop Warren of the American Methodist Church will sail from New York on 20th January for Colon, Panama, Peru and Chili, crossing to Buenos Aires. While in the River Plate he will preside at the Conference of his Church to be held in Rosario.

-The Citizen, in an article on the safes which have been excavated from the ruins of the great fire in the City, mentions some curious facts. One safe by a leading firm had the brass handles and fittings had the brass handles and fittings completely melted and run into the keyhole, the contents of the safe being uninjured Safee protected by brickwork or in cellars and basements generally escaped, and those taken first out of the ruins gave the best results. Sales falling from upper stories into the centre of mountains of brickwork which remained red-hot for days, had their contents charred beyond recognition. The leaves of many account books could be separated and handled, although as black as coal, and the writing in ink was completely invisible, while curiously enough, the ticks and corrections in pencil shone out like silver.

-The well known journalist Trojan, editor-in chief of the illustrated German periodical Klad-deradatsch, has been cited to appear this week before the courts in Berlin accused of the crime of high treason, committed by the publication of a caricature in that paper on the 11th of November, with reference to the scheme of the Emperor-for the increase of the navy.-We have seen the «caricature» in question and it is of the mildest and most barmless kind imaginable. The German people must have an extraordinary lack of spirit or they would rise up like one man and insist on the abandonment of these monstrous prosecutions for lesc-majeste, which only make the nation ridiculous in the eyes of the world. -According to a Paris telegram,

Retired-commander Count Wol-sin Esterbazy will be tried on the 10th, inst by a Council of War on the charge of treason made by Ma-thieu Dreyfus, brother of the excaptain, on the ground that the document which served as the basis of the sentence passed on the latter was really written by Esterhazy. The formation of the Council of War has been ordered by General Saussier, commander in chief of the army, in terms of the report made by Colonel Ravary after an examination of the case. The trial of Count Esterhazy will be conducted in the strictest secrecy, instructions hav-ing been issued that neither the public nor representatives of the press are to be admitted. - This secrecy simply means that, whatever the result of the trial, there will always be room for doubt and dissatisfaction. It was the secrecy. more than anything else, that has caused the trouble over the Dreyfus case, yet the same pernicious and condemnable method is to be employed again The French do not seem to learn by experience —We quote the following para-






