



are going a little too far in that line. They have addressed a letter to Mr. Bridgett, H.M. Consul in this city, from which we extract the following paragraph:—If our articles should not yet have been introduced into your country, we are «sure» they will have the same enormous success there as in other parts of the world, provided you will push the sale with energy, assisted by comprehensive advertisements. The cost of the «comprehensive advertisements» is to be borne by H.M. Consul, we suppose, as a sort of quid pro quo for the honour of pushing German trade against British trade. We are not aware whether the particular goods offered by the Berlin firm have been introduced here but we are «sure» that they will not be so introduced if it depends on Mr. Bridgett's energy in pushing their sale. A little discrimination on the part of Messrs. Aug. Zeiss & Co. would lead to less amusing comments on the tactics used by German firms for the development of German trade. The attempt to induce a British Consul to energetically push the sale of German wares is, to say the least of it, somewhat ridiculous and unworthy of a serious firm.

LONDON NOTES

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 5.

In the French Senate yesterday M. Scheurer-Kestner interpellated the Government on the subject of the Dreyfus inquiry. General Billot in reply stated that all the documents submitted at the trial would be placed before the officers charged with the examination of the Esterhazy case, and denied that Dreyfus had been sentenced on the evidence of the «bordereaux» alleged to be in his handwriting. An order of the day was finally adopted unanimously accepting the declarations of the Government.

A German force has occupied the town of Kiaow Chow in China. According to one report some resistance was met with, and three Chinese were killed.

Hayti has complied with the German ultimatum, and the incident may be regarded as at an end.

A telegram from Brussels states that the French expedition under Major Marchand, which was on its way to the Nile, has been massacred in the Bah-el Ghazal Province.

Under the presidency of Mr. Edward Evans, jun., a meeting of the General Committee of the National Liberal Federation was held at Derby yesterday. After discussion, a number of declarations as to the constitution of the party programme were made. A resolution describing the abolition of the House of Peers as a foremost object of the Liberal party was passed unanimously. Another was carried, though not quite unanimously, in favour of manhood suffrage. A third in favour of woman suffrage was passed by 182 votes against 124. Motions were also passed in favour of extending the hours of polling at elections, and of the principle of a second ballot. Mr. Evans was elected Chairman of the Executive, and this body was reappointed. A resolution condemning the policy of the present Government in India was also adopted.

Lord Rosebery was entertained at dinner last night by the York Gimcrack Club. In the course of an amusing speech he said that if he were asked to give advice to those inclined to spend time and money on the turf he would appropriate «Punch's» advice «to those about to marry.» He gave three main reasons for this—first, the pursuit was exceedingly expensive; secondly, it was too engrossing for those who had anything else to do in this world; and, finally the rewards, as compared with the disappointments, were not more than one per cent.

Mr. Walter Long, President of the Board of Agriculture, speaking at the annual dinner of the Central Associated Chambers last night, said the condition of agriculture had improved as compared with a year ago. Having expressed a hope that he should be able soon to declare the country absolutely free from pleuro-pneumonia he announced that he should shortly introduce a measure to improve the relations between landlord and tenant with regard to holdings.

Yesterday the London County Council, by 55 votes to 47, resolved that it is advisable that a new source of revenue should be obtained by means of some direct charge upon owners of site values. The main interest in the discussion, which was a long one, lay in the various declarations in which the Moderates avoided endorsing or opposing the principle of the taxation of ground values.

In an interview last night, Mr. Barnes, of the Amalgamated Society of Engineers, said that he regarded as absurd the statement put forward that the employers in submitting their terms to the Conference last week, did not desire to upset the present working conditions. Practically the whole of the proposals upon which the men were voting would upset the status quo. If the employers really desired to ratify by formal agreement the present arrangements, he had no doubt that the men would readily accept such proposals. As evidence of the way in which the other Unions are supporting the A.S.E., the Operative Bricklayer's Society, who have contributed 350l. a week since the contest began, are taking a vote in favour of doubling their levy and making a donation of

1,000l. and a loan of 10,000l., without interest, for a period of years. At the resumed meeting of the Executive Council of the Amalgamated Society of Railway Servants, Mr. Maddison, whose action as editor of the «Railway Review» had been disapproved of, handed in his resignation in terms which were subsequently deprecated by resolution. By way of reply to the letter lately received through Sir Courtenay Boyle from the Board of Trade, the meeting formulated and passed a resolution which, while upholding the demands of the Birmingham Conference, agreed that attempts should be made by the men belonging to the different Companies to obtain interviews with their Directors to lay their grievances before them.

For the time being the cotton crisis is at an end. A Manchester Correspondent telegraphs that the movement on the part of the employers for a 5 per cent. reduction of the wages of the operatives has entirely collapsed.

In spite of the miserable weather there was again a large attendance at the Cattle Show yesterday. Among the principal prize winners in the sheep classes were the Prince of Wales, Earl Cadogan, Lord Rothschild, and the Earl of Carnarvon. An important addition to the attractions of the general exhibition was made by the opening of the dead poultry show. During the afternoon the annual meeting of the Smithfield Club was held in the building.

A boxing competition, which has had fatal results, took place at the National Sporting Club late on Monday night. At Bow-street Police Court yesterday six persons, including the manager of the club, were charged with being concerned in the manslaughter of Walter Croot, the deceased pugilist. Evidence was given to the effect that Croot and another man named Barry were engaged in a glove contest, which lasted from 10.50 on Monday night till 12.15 a.m. yesterday. During the last round Croot fell down insensible, and remained unconscious till a quarter to nine yesterday morning, when he died. The prisoners were remanded the magistrate accepting bail of 50l. in each case.

At St. Paul's Consistory Court yesterday, Dr. Tristram, the Chancellor, gave judgment substantially against the Vicar of St. Mark's Marylebone, and in favour of the parishioners, who had petitioned, through Mr. Bishop, their churchwarden, against ritualistic practices introduced by the Vicar. Evidence given yesterday at the resumed inquest on the City fire showed with apparent certainty that the outbreak commenced on the premises of Messrs. Waller and Brown. No knowledge, however, could be arrived at as to its cause. One witness was cordially commended for the gallantry he had displayed. Another witness alleged that the coal supply of some of the engines was deficient.

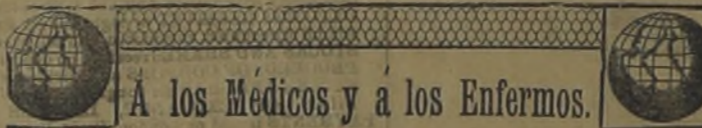
