A Cairo Correspondent states that the Khalifa is reported to contemplate an attack, and that Colonels Wingate and Galloway have in consequence been summoned to the frontier.

The Anglo-American Commission for the assessment of the damages to be paid by the United States for the seizure of twenty-five sealing vessels between 1886 and 1892 has fixed the amount at 464,000 dollars. The offer made by Canada to take 425,000 dollars three years ago was accepted by Mr. Cleveland, but rejected by Congress.

The Queen has been pleased to approve of the appointment of Mr. William Kenny, Solicitor-General for Ireland, to be a judge of the High Court in Ireland, in the room of Mr. Justice Warren; and to approve of the appointment of Mr. Dunbar Barton, Q. C., M. P., to be Solicitor-General for Ireland.
