#### THE OPPOSITION.

One of the most important steps yet taken by the parliamentary group in opposition to the candi-dature of Sr. Cuestas has been the publication, yesterday, of a formal protest against the «Colorado Congress, now being held in his do Congress's now being neid in dis-favor. This decument is signed, not merely by the parliamentary group in question, but also by a number of civilians and military officers some of considerable party officers some of considerable party and public position, and these give the document greater importance than any that has emanated solely from the parliamentary group, most of whom are, in effect, illustrious nobodies who owe their position to the electoral manipulations of the late Sr. Idiarte Borda. Two things may be deduced from this document.

from this document. First; that the opposition to Sr. Cuestas' candidature within his own party is stronger than has generally been supposed; in fact strong enough to make it dangerous in case of a trial of strength.

Second; that the Colorado party is profounndly divided into two factions of precisely opposite tendent.

tions of precisely opposite tenden-ces One faction, that whose names appear in the protest before us, is allied by tradition, sympathy and personal association to the corrupt disastrous and profoundly discred-itable rulers as Santos, Julio Her-rera and Idiarte Borda, and it does not hesitate to propose to restore that regime, in defiance of experience, of the public opinion of the country, and of the certainty that it would plunge the Republic into anwould plunge the Republic into another period of disaster and civil war. The other faction, and that which certainly possesses the larger share of public sympathies and respect, is that which is in favor of radical reform and reaction, and which is supporting Sr. Cuestas' candidature for many reasons, not the least the part of the least the representation of the least the least the representation of the least the l being that he represents a reversal of the disastrous and discredited

of the disastrous and discredited policy of recent years. This is the faction represented in the Congress opened yesterday.

It would be difficult and perhaps also impertinent for foreigners like ourselves, however closely we may try to follow the political movements of the country, to determine which of these two factions can produce the names of greatest party produce the names of greatest party weight, or the most numerous list of adherents. One thing, however, we may state with the most absolute certainty, and that is that when there are two factions of tendencies not merely radically opposite but mutually destructive, as is the case in the present in-stance, they cannot both claim the right to call themselves by the same party name. If the adherents of Sr Cuestas are «colorados,» then the opposing fraction, more conveniently known as the «collect-ivity», are distinctly anti-colorados. We do not pretend to decide which are the genuine «colorados», nor do we think it matters much, but we do say that either one faction or the other ought to seek a new or the other ought to seek a new name, if only to prevent confusion in the public mind. It is impossible to go on applying the same party name to two factions that are rad-ically opposed to each other, and which in fact constitute two oppos-

ing parties.

The gist of the protest may be found summed up in a phrase to the effect that neither «colorados»

the name either of the «colorados party or of the country, for it has been repudiated in every possible manner by both. And, even if the Assembly were genuinely representative, which no sane person can admit for a moment, anyone and everyone still have the right to express their ideas and wishes on the presidential question, up to the moment of the election, whatever provious pledges or compromises may have been made by the legislators. It is taking a very false and dangerous view of the duties and of the authority of the latter—even supposing them to have been legitimately elected—to imagine that they

ly elected—to imagine that they are not to consult public opinion nor to be influenced by it, in so vital a question as the present presidential election. The first duty of representatives, as we said a day or two ago, is to represent; the present legislators wish to dictate,

they are endeavouring to perpetuate they are endeavouring to perpetuate in the most dictatorial form imaginable—for they have not yet acquired the right, which can only be conferred by a legitimate election, to represent—the oligarchical rule of recent years, which the Republic has found so disastrous and objectionable.

and objectionable. Sr. Cuestas is the proclaimed president-elect of the people, of all parties, classes and nationalities. This gives him the highest possible constitutional and moral claim to the post. If the legislators were legitimate relegislators were legitimate representatives of the people there could be no further question over the matter; they would confirm the popular verdict, if only as a matter of duty. It is impossible, in such a case, to imagine a representative voting directly contrary to the wishes, we might say the mandate, of his electors. It would be like a steward disobeying the orders of his master. The very fact that the majority of the present legislators are acting thus contrary to the expressed decision of the electorate, is conclusive proof both of the ate, is conclusive proof both of the illegitimacy of their origin and of their false conception of their office. Without mandate from the people, they are putting themselves in an attitude of rebellion against the will of the people. Anything more dangerous than this cannot be imagined, and this alone is sufficient to provoke violence. What-ever may ensue, the sole blame must rest with those who imagine that impure elections give them a dictatorial right to defy the will of

the people.

For the legislators, the «collectivists», who have signed this protest, we have nothing but contempt and shall be glad to see them receive the reward of their demerits. We are genuinely sorry, however, to see attached to the document other names, such as those of Generals Perez and Vas-quez, entitled to public respect and consideration—sorry, because the names of honorable men should not be attached to a document based on falsehood and sophisms, outraging the first principles of representative constitutional government, and, in fact, directly provoking the people to violence in defence of their rights. It is not a protest so much as an in-

#### POLITICAL NOTES.

The pretendee military conspiracy has evaporated to nothing, as we half expected, and all that is left of it is the removal of a few subordinate officers who seem to have been more energetic than discreet in their utterances on the political situation. This is fully justified by military discipline, and in any case Sr. Cuestas is quite right in removing every vestige of collectivisms from civil and military office for it is a public deager. itary office, for it is a public danger as well as a taint.
The Grand «Colorado» Con-

gress was opened yester-day, we cannot yet say with what results. We refer elsewhere to the protest published by the «collectivist» faction, and which, on account of its strong terms against the people, has made a disagreeable impres-sion. If Sr. Cuestas had any intention of dissolving the Cham-

Last year Carnival took place practically simultaneously with the outbreak of the revolution—the official acknowledgement and dewas made the very day after Carnival, having been kept back for the purpose, though everyone knew that the outbreak commenced-and the tomfooleries of carnival were a ghastly mockery with the cloud of civil war over the land. This year Carnival will take place in the very crisis of the Presidential problem, between the election of the Presi-dent of the Senate and that of the President of the Republic, and the probabity is that this alone will be sufficient to kill it. The only chance is that if the first of the two events settle the problem satisfactorily and definitely, as it may do, then the strain will be off the public mind and the people will give themselves

up to merry-making with a will.

This new issue is to contain three different styles—the ordinary single card for both domestic and international use, which is 3 1/4 by 5/12 inches; a smaller card for domestic use only, which is 2/15/16 by 4/15/16 inches; and a double return card for both domestic and international use, which is 5/2 by national use, which is 5 1/2 by 6 1/2 inches. These are about a quarter of an inch narrower than the cards which are now in use. The ordinary card is to bear a por-The ordinary card is to bear a por-trait of Thomas Jefferson and the single small card one of John Adams, both three quarter face and looking to the left, surrounded by an olive wreath, and having the name on a scroll or curved tablet at the bottom. To the left of the portrait are three lines of lettering the first being the words «Postal Card—One cent,» the second the words «United States» in capitals,
