NEWS OF THE DAY

MONTEVIDEO.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY IS, 1898. Saints Craton, Faustina and Jovita:-

POLITICAL NOTES.

The great event of Saturday was the formal installation of the Council of State, which takes the place of the dissolved Chambers. The first scene took place in the Government House, and was attended by numerous civil and military officials, a gathering of the most prominent men of all three political parties, and many prominent citizens of all classes. There was also a large and eager crowd in the Plaza outside. There was no display of military force, and the occasion was a thor ough and genuine civic one, show ing the free and hearty participation of the people and of the best ele-ments of the country in the new Government, in a way that has not been the case for many years past.

At 3.15, all being ready. President Cuestas entered the Hall, and pronounceu a short speech congratlating the country on the fact that so many distinguished citizens of all parties were to be found fraternis ing with the sole object of working for the good of public interests. Addressing the Council, he declar ed it installed as a deliberating body and recommended to its pre terent attention the Electoral Law, with such other matters as were awaiting despatch In the name of national interests he asked them to remember two words which, put into effect, would produce the hap piness of the people-aunion and traternity.» A minute of the proceedings was then drawn up and signed by Sr. Cuestas, his Minis ters and the Councillors present, some 68 out of the 88 named.
Dr. J. C Blanco spoke a few words reciprocating the sentiments of Sr. Cuestas and expressing the hope that it would not be long before the Council was replaced by the elect ed representatives of the peeple.

The members of the Council then proceeded on foot from the Govern-ment House to the Cabildo A large crowd accompanied them, cheering incessently, Vivas being given for Sr Cuesias, for the Pro visional Government and for the Council. Arrived at the Cabildo, the Prefect of Police banded the keys of the Chambers to the Min-ister of Government Mr Mac-Eachen, who unlocked the gates, and the Council entered into posses sion. The «bar» and lobbies were besieged to overflowing, a large crowd still remaining in the plaza. The enthusiasm throughout was unbounded, and we doubt if so thoroughly popular and democratic a scene has ever been witnessed in this or any other Republic. Not a single discordant voice dared to make itself heard and the approbation of the new Council may be taken as a measure of the demnation of the pseudo Chambers which, usurping and abusing the name of National Representation claimed to be the repositories of constitutionality and legality.

The first proceedings of the Coun-cil were confined to formalities Dr. Juan Carlos Blanco was elected President of the Council, unanimously, amid great applause, and Drs J. L. Terra and Juan José Her era were elected 1st and 2nd Vice presidents respectively by large majorities. Dr Blanco returned thanks for the honor done him in a few eloquent words, and the proceedings terminated. The reappear-ficits outstanding and await-

ance of the Councillers in the street was the signal for more cheering and a considerable crowd accom panied Dr. Blanco to his house where they insisted on his addressing them from the balcony. The first business sitting of the Council was held yesterday, but we cannot yet say what occurred.

On Saturday evening the whole city gave itselfup to rejoicings which almost equalled the memorable manifestations on the declaration of peace in September last. Bon-fires were lit at every street corner, then was a continuous shower of rockets and crackers, bands of youths paraded the streets with music and singing, and the central streets and principal plazas were crowded with people, especially ladies, all wearing a holiday and jubilant aspect. There was a connuous procession in front of Sr. Cuestas' house and the people never seemed tired of cheering him. This was kept up until nearly midnight Telegrams from the interior give account of similar manifestations in nearly all the towns. Whatever doubt there may have been for the first day or layer states. first day or two as to the new Government, are now entirely banish. ed, and hit has been been accepted throughout the Republic, by all parties and classes, with a popular acclamation which falls to the lot of very few governments indeed in any part of the world. A. ing the people and threatening to plunge the country into disaster and renewed civil war, but as a vulgar tyrant imposing himself on the that «Freedom shrecks unheard, unheeded» in Uruguay, just at the moment that the country has been relieved from a nightmare and the whole Republic is rejoicing at being freed from the misrule of the men who have oppressed and plundered it for a generation, and the people are finding their opinions consulted and their interests respected. The people who are giving their support to Sr. Cuestas, that is to say the best and most representa-tive men of all three political parties, finance, commerce and the foreign residents, the Standard regards as a «fickle rabble.» Lastly, it predicts that the dis-solved Chambers will yet meet to elect Sr. Gomensoro, and that the people will support the latter against the army!!! The Stand ard seems utterly ignorant that it was the people, of all parties, classes and nationalities, who proclaimed Sr. Cuestas as their president - elect, who beseeched him to sweep away the Chambers, and who rejected the absurd candidature of the almost nonagenarian Gomensoro as a transparent mask for «herrerista» restoration. We do not know who supplied the Standard with its absurd and mischievous falsehoods, but we do strongly recommend it, if only for the sake of what reputation it has left, to send an emissary here to consult the state of public feeling, to see the new era of relief and hope that has dawned on the Republic, and to consult the barometers of commerce and the stock exchange. This might save it from playing the fool and disgust

ing its English readers here. Sunday's Siglo, reviewing the events of the week, writes the obituary of the «collectivity» - «Sr. Cuestas, sit says, emay and should be satisfied with the impression produced in all minds by the recent sensational political events. The people have begun to respire with vigor, freed from the leaden cap which had oppressed them for twen ty turee years, and from the dolorous prospects with which they were still threatened by the high priest of collectivisms from his new domicile in Buenos Aires (meaning with the work of political corruption and economical ruin with which his name will be eternally associated in the history of the misfortunes of his country.. The Siglo then recalls that when the Ellauri government was overthrown by the military mutiny of 1875, the public Debt was only 45 million dollars. When Borda fell last August, it und reach

ing arrangement which bring it up to 147 millions, so that it has been more than trebled in 23 years of *collectivist* Government. eight years of Herrera and Borda added fifty millions, an average of six millions the year, without a single public work of importance to show for the money, hesides heaping up the taxes to suffocation point. From this we may judge what was the prospect offered by another «collectivist» administration, such as we would have had if the Chambers had not been dissolv ed in time. Their work may be summed up as ruin in finance and economics, civil war in politics. Thanks to Sr. Cuestas the country is freed, and every obstacle to the work of regeneration is removed. The opinion of political classes is shown by the unprecedented manifestations of which he has been the object, and of economic classes by the rapid rise of Uruguayan values here and in London. further rise. The «collectivists» keep discreet. ly quiet, nor has their protest yet made its appearance. The threat that the dissolved Chambers would meet somewhere, elect Gomensoro president and call on the army to support him, has only been met with laughter. Mean-while they have amused themselves by circulating the report that the Provisional Government would find difficulty in obtaining recognition from foreign Powers, beginning with Argentina. The tale is obviously absurd. Sr. Cuestas has already been recognised as interim or provisional President, and as he remains in the post, requires no further recognition. Foreign Powers are not likely to bother them selves with internal changes, whether regular or otherwise. American Cucrency.

Washington, Jan 16. Advocates of currency reform are compelled to recognize what has been plain since the opening of Congress, that there is no hope of such legislation either now or in the immediate future, as I pointed out when Congress assembled. The Senate is the insuperable bar to all legislation in favour of a gold standard Senator Allison, one of the Republican leaders, says that the Finance Committee which has charge of such measures has a majority in favour of free silver, and so has the Senate itself. Senator Carter, a Republican, who favours silver, says, with Western picturesqueness of language, that the chances of passing a Currency Bill unfriendly to silver are about as promising as a anowsparm in Hadae. mising as a snowstorm in Hades. If the House favours the Bill the Senate will turn it into a free coin age measure. Senator Caffery, a gold Democrat, who is thoroughly informed about Southern and Western sentiment, says:

No man who does not meet and talk with the silver people begins to realise the infatuation of the 16 to 1 advocates. The craze has not abat ed but has increased among those who believed in it two years ago. In the South it has taken hold very much as secession and pro slavery possessed the people years ago. It seems to me some of our southern Silverits are as ready to fight for free coinage as in 1860 they were ready to fight for a Government pledged to protect slavery. The gold men of the South are not mere ly disapproved of. They are pun ished. There is no tolerance of

hostility to the free silver idea > That feeling is not only manifested in the Southern States, but is found here at Washington. Here in the Senate, through which the coming measure, small or great, must pass, the Republicans have not a majority. The Populists unanimously, and the Democrats with two or three exceptions, are for silver, or against offending the silver men on a question involving an expression of a preference for gold. The Democrats, Populists. and Free Silver Republicans will be in a majority, and it is useless to hope for anything else. Currency reform, I fear, must wait upon that re-alignment of parties that seems to be as inevitable as it is desir-

A special delegate meeting of the Joint Committee of the Allied Trades was held on Saturday in London, for the purpose of con-sidering the replies of the affiliated unions to the suggestion that the engineers' demand for a 48 hours week should be formally withdrawn. After long deliberation it was decided to postpone a final decision until to day when a consulta-tion with the Committees of the engineers attected will be held. It was ascertained, however, that a preponderance of the replies fa voured withdrawal, and it is expected that an official declaration to this effect will be published to-night, and that the three firms originally «struck» and the Em ployers' Federation will be notified of the decision at the same time. It is probable that the men will resume work this day fortnight.

The third test match between England and Australia was contin-ued at Adelaide on Saturday. Darl-ing was dismissed without increas ing his overnight score of 178. At the close of play, the Australians had achieved the great score of 552 for nine wickets, Iredale having made 84, Noble 40, and Trumble, not out, 32.




