LONDON NOTES

THURSDAY, JANUARY 13.

Polling took place in Plymouth vesterday to fill the vacancy in the Parliamentary representation caus-ed by the death of Mr. Charles Havison. The result was entirely satisfactory to the Liberal party, Wr. Mendi not only retaining the seat held by his fellow candidate of the last general election, but increasing the majority from 26 to 164. For Mr. Mendl 5,966 votes were cast, as against 5, 402 for Mr. Guest, the Conservative representalive

Addressing a meeting at Wy-mondham, Sulfolk, last night, Lord Kimberley welcomed the promise of a sound measure of local government for Ireland, not only because it would be right in itself, but because it would streng-then the feeling for Home Rule. With regard to Chitral, be contended that the proclamation to the tribes involved an unconditional promise not to occupy any terri-tory. The reasons put forward for the reversal of the policy of the late Government were extremely weak. 
