POLITICAL NOTES.

The Council of State held a short sitting on Friday. A batch of peti-tions, mostly relative to applications for pensions, were referred to Committee Sr. Gonzalez Roca took the oath and his seat The resignation of General Ventura Rodriguez as member of the Council, was accepted Nothing else was done of general interest Contrary to expectation, discussion of electoral reform did not commence, but we understand that it will do so at the next sitting

The Executive has issued a Decree reorganising the Peni-tentiary Council, the members tentiary Council, the members of which resigned some weeks ago, by the appointment of the following; Dr. D. Agustini, Sr. P. Risso, Sr. F. E. Martinez, Sr. J. B. Buela and Sr Federico Costa.

Yesterday's Siglo somewhat modifies the recent assertions that the Government is about to reopen negotiations for building the port. All that has been done so far, it plans, etc. to be put in order, and a summary of the whole matter form ed to be laid before the Cabinet. If found sufficiently satisfactory, they will then be presented for legislative approval (the course ordained by the Port Law but set aside by the previous Government) and further proceedings will then depend on whether the Chambers approve the plans. In any case, we understand, it is intended to wait until constitutional Chambers have been elected, and not to submit the matter to the present Council of State. This will mean a delay of at least four months before anything important is done. Referring to the Port, the Tribuna expresses the opinion that, with a Govern-ment enjoying the public confidment enjoying the public confid-ence that the present does, the cap-ital for building the port might very well be subscribed lo-cally, which would have the advantage of keeping the interest in the country. This is true enough, but on the other hand local inves tors expect higher interest for their capital than do European investors, and in any case the contract for the construction would have to be given to a European firm and it would probably be found more convenient to leave the financing in the same hands. In connection with the Port, we may recall that when the Borda Government was still in power, it was repeatedly stated that the then Minister of Finance, Sr. J. J Castro, had prepared an elaborate and detailed Report, giving all the antecedents and history of the port question, in two or three languages, and running into several volumes, the printing of which was already supposed to have reached an ad vanced stage. It would be interest ing to know what has become of this work, which, whether valu able or not must have occasioned considerable outlay.

It has been resolved that the numerous military officers and men put on the full pay list by the late Sr Borda when the revolu

their services-will, with a very few exceptions, now be returned to their former status. This will mean the reduction of some eight hundret from full to half-pay, no incon-siderable economy. It has also been resolved to suppress the office of «Escalaton Militar» of which General Santos Arribio is Chief. The Dia makes some further edilying but not surprising revelations about the corrupt practices of the late Municipality. The Prado, it would seem, was the especial victim of what the Dia not inappropriately calls their kleptomania Trees, shrubs, ornamental plants from the greenhouses and nurseries

In fact, the members of the Municipality seem to have dis-posed of public property and lab-our for their private benefit, just as if it was their own. Full particulars of the scandal have been laid before the Investigating Com-mittee by Sr. Racine himself and the *Dia* asks and well may it ask-if no steps can be taken to enforce responsibility for such scandalous irregularities, which were, in fact an open robbery of the public. The Tooth Brush,

It is but a little thing, yet on its proper use depends much of the happiness of modern man. Why civilised teeth should be so rotten is a question which has often been debated, and probably the true answer is more complex than some would think Many good mothers are content to put all toothache down to follypops; but that sugar in itself is not responsible for bad teeth is proved by the splendid «ivories» often possessed by ne groes who practically live upon the sugar-cane, and thrive upon it too, during the whole of the season when it is in maturity. Den tal decay is common enough, however, among negroes in towns, and it seems clear that the caries of the teeth, which is so common among most civilis ed races, is due not to any parti cular article of diet so much as to digestive and nutritive changes imposed upon us by our mode of life, and to some extent by the fact that by hook or by crook we do somehow manage to live, not withstanding our bad teeth; whereas, in a state of nature, the tooth-

predisposing causes, the final act in the production of caries is the lodgment of microbes on and around the teeth, we see that for long to come the tooth brush will be a necessity if the health is to be maintained. It is only by the frequent use of this little instrument that those minute accumulations can be removed which are at the root of so much mischief. A few elementary lessons in bacteriology would, we fancy, greatly startle many people, and certainly would show them the rutility of trusting to one scrub a day. The fact is that it people, instead of looking at the tooth brush from an æsthetic point of view, and scrubbing away with tooth powders (!) to make their front teeth white, would regard it merely as an aid to cleanliness. they would see that the time to use it is alter meals and at night, not just in the morning, only, when the debris left from the day before has been fermenting and brewing acid all night through. They would also see how inefficient an instrument the common tooth brush is unless it is used with considerable judgement. One of the secondary advantages of spending a good deal of money on dentistry is that at least one learns the value of one's teeth. By the time we have got them dotted over with gold stoppings and gold crowns we learn to take care of them, even although that may involve the trouble of cleaning them more than once a day and using perhaps more than one brush for the purpose. - Hos-Holy Trinity Church.

Upon a division the amendment was defeated by 233 votes to 65. The claims of Wales were afterwards urged in an amendment which was rejected by a majority of 39-129 to 90. Mr. W. Redmond next submitted an amendment dealing with prisoners convicted under the Treason Felony Act. This was in turn defeated by 152 to 100. The House then adjourned.

It is reported from Peking that the Chinese Government has granted Great Britain the right to extend the Burma railway through Yun-nan. The concession demanded by Germany to build a railway to Ichau in compensation for the murder of a German sailor has also been granted.

The trial of M. Zola was contin-

ued at the Assize Court in Paris yesterday. The afternoon was chiefly occupied with the evidence of Colonel Picquart who gave an account of the manner in which his suspicious had been excited against Esterhazy, the steps he had taken to confirm them and his subsequent removal from Paris to Africa. He had kept his superiors informed from the first of his investigation, and he believed that his departure from France was ordered as a means of shielding Esterhazy. Several incidents oc-curred at the close of the proceedings, one young barrister being violently assaulted and wounded.

Dispatches from Hull state that Dispatches from Hull state that the steamer Marbella bound from that port to Hamburg, with passengers and general cargo, collided with the bow of her Maiesty's ship Deferred Debt, \$54,000 at 23 to with the bow of her Majesty's ship Galatea in Hull Roads on Thursday night She sank immediately. The crew and passengers were saved, but a number of valuable horses went down with the vessel. Yesterday morning the Galatea, in making the harbour, grounded on the Hebbles, and her position for some time gave rise to considerable anxiety. She was eventually got off and towed into the Alexandra Dock, where she now lies.

In the cricket match at Sydney on Thursday the Colonials, who had made 452 for the loss of eight wickets, were not out until they had put together the enormous total of 574, the last man, Howell, making 95. The Englishmen then went in, and at the close of play had made 258, with one wicket down. McLaren was not out 135. Further remarkable evidence

was given yesterday before Mr. Justice Ridley in the case in which a shareholder of the Grosvenor Hotel Company claimed relief for himself and others against Mr. R. C. Drew, a director and the principal tradesman supplying the hotel, against the other directors, and against the manager. Mr. Lawson Walton opened the case for the de-fence, and contended that the allegations of improper dealing had not been sustained. The hearing was

adjourned until Monday
Before Mr. Justice Lawrance, at
the Central Criminal Court yesterday, the trial was completed of a Russian and a Pole, who were charged with printing and publishing in a revolutionary journal ar-ticles inciting people to assassin-ate the Czar. Lord Coleridge made an earnest appeal on behalf of the prisoners, but they were found guilty and sentenced, one to 18 months', and the other to two months' imprisonment with hard

labour. Another case dealt with at the same court was that of John Cotterell, an ex-metropolitan police-man, who was found guilty of at-tempting to obtain by fraud a thousand pound prize offered by a sporting newspaper. The jury re-commended the prisoner to mercy. He was sentenced to six months' imprisonment, without hard lab-




