

This was a very necessary step, as the said Registers were notoriously full of frauduent and bogus inscriptions. It is expected the Committee will present its report to the Council in the course of the present week. The Custom House has published the general totals of the Foreign Commerce of the Republic for the year 1897. The importation was \$19,412,216, the exportation \$29,-319,573 and the total Commerce \$48,731,7200 00 on cardineering 319,578 and the total Commerce \$48,731,789. On an early occa-sion we will give fuller particulars. To day is the 1st of March, on which the Chambers, if they had not been dissolved, should have proceeded to the election of a Pre-sident of the Republic. Some cur-iosity—but not the least apprehen-sion—is felt as to whether the dethroned «collectivity» will make any sign on the occasion. Grotesany sign on the occasion. Grotesque rumors, probably invented by themselves, are rife to the effect that they will find means to issue a proclamation signed by a suffi-cient majority, of Don Tomas Gomensoro as elected President of the Republic, which will be fol-lowed by outbreaks in his favor in various parts of the Republic. The first part will be difficult, for the ex-legislators are considerably dispersed, some being in Buenos Aires and others in the interior, and the second part is incredible, for there is no part of the Republic in which any disaffection is known to exist. We Schmidt, Franco and Co. believe there are 950 of them, though the present number of subscribers to private boxes is only about 400. — The installation of these would afford the P. O. to reduce the present high charge for the use of boxes. Private boxes are not only a great con-venience to customers, but also an economy to the Post Office itself for they diminish the labour of the letter carriers. The present charge, \$12 the year, is simply extortionate and prevents many from using them who otherwise might to do. It might be reduced to \$5 or even less with advantage to every one concerned. In many countries the charge is little more than nominal, the P. O. encouraging the use of boxes in its own interests.






