### POLITICAL NOTES.

The resignation of Dr. Joaquin Salterain as Minister of Foreign Affairs is fully concerned, and has occasioned general regret, as, though he can hardly be called a political spersonage, be has been recognised as a staunch and honorable factor in the present situation. The precise reasons for his resigna tion are not known. The Tribuna maliciously insinuates that he was dissatisfied with the policy recently pursued by Sr. Cuestas and that there had been serious disagree ments between them, but this we know to be entirely without foundation. His resignation, though it has taken the public by surprise it has taken the public by surprise is not the outcome of a sudden resolution, and the reason may more probably be found in a friendly arrangement with Sr Cuestas by which the latter is left free to strengthen his Cabinet from the party point of view, a not unwise step in the present perturbed situation. So far no certain forecast can be made as to Dr. Salterain's successor in the portfolio. Various names have been portfolio. Various names have been mentioned, but none on which reliance can be placed. In fact, it is not yet certain that Dr. Salterain may not retain his post.

As to the rumors of other ministerial changes, nothing certain is known nor have we much credence in them. As regards Mr. Mac-Eachen we can give an authorit-ative denial to the rumors of his resignation.

General Nicomedes Castro took possession of his portfolio as Min-ister of War yesterday, with the usual formalities. General Salvafor Tajes was installed as Chief of Staff on Tuesday.
It is confirmed that the Govern-

ment has applied, through the Director of Customs Sr. Gradin, to various commercial houses of the market for a loan of \$200,000 at 6% interest, to be repaid in four fortinghtly instalments out of the product of the additional 21/2%

Duty when reestablished. The amount is to be employed in assisting the redemption of the Treasury Certificates for October The raison detre of the operation is not at all clear. So small an amount will make no appreciable difference in the heavy arrears of the Certificates. and, in any case, the Government, if it is really in difficulties as regards the next conversion, might have drawn upon its credit with the Bank of the Republic, which is generally understood to be more or less intact. Anyhow, we learn that there has been a ready re-sponse to the application for the loan, showing that the Government enjoys good credit in the market.

The Siglo continues to express its dissatisfaction with the manner in which the Government is facing the problem of the Treasury Certificates. It insists that the only plan is to unify the unconverted Certificates into a Debt and then return to eash payments. and then return to cash payments. For this purpose, according to its calculations, there would be nocessary a Debt of \$5,076,000 at 6 % interest and 7 % annual amortisation, issued at 64 %. This would give a practically exact compensation to the present holders of the Certificates, and would require an annual service of \$406. ers of the Certificates, and would require an annual service of \$406,-080, to which, the Siglo proposes, might be applied the profits of the Bank of the Republic and such other resources as the Government might devise. — We cannot say we view with favor this proposal to add another \$400,000 to the already programs permanent obligations. another \$400,000 to the already enormous permanent obligations of the country, and we are surprised that it should be made by the Siglo which, in previous times, has so consistently combatted any increase of the public debt. We believe that some better expedient may yet be found. It is unfortunate the discussion should have arisen at a time

sion should have arisen at a time of the year when the revenue is slackest. The best thing would be to tide over the present months without change, and devise some better plan to come into operation towards the end of the year, when the revenue improves and the new Budget should be in force. Considerable amusement has been caused here by the news that Dr. Julio Herrera and the exiled mutineers in B. Aires held a banquet there on Monday to celebrate the anniversary of the Constitution. The idea of men who have so shown such little respect for law or Constitution halding such a hanor Constitution holding such a ban-

quel is decidedly ludicrous. Various changes are announced in the Departmental Pretects, mostly of a political character. Sr. Au-relio Noboa has resigned the Pre-fectship of Salto, and will be succeed-ed by Col. Bartolomé Caballero, an appointment which does not seem to have made a good impression, as he is regarded as too much of the «old school » Col. Angel Casalla will probable be transferred from Paysandu to Minas, Col. resume his former post of Police Inspector of the South.

The Presidential reception usually held on Wednesday evenings was suspended yesterday on ac-count of the serious illness of the mother of Sr. Cuestas. The venerable lady, who lives at La Plata,

is 88 years of age. We have omitted to mention an interesting ceremony which took place on Monday last, namely the presentation to Col. Pollo, Chief of the 14h Chasseurs, of a sword of honor, subscribed for by the residents of the Cordon in recognition of his valiant resistance to the military mutineers on the 4th instant. The incident is worth recording as it is another proof of the outrageous falsity of the assertion of the mutineers that their cause was supported by public opinion. ### Uruguayan Products for Cuba.

We copy from the South Amercan Journal the following account of the new book «South American Sketches,» just published by Mr. Robert Crawford, M.A., M. J. C. E, and of which it is to be hoped the English Club will lose no time in procuring a copy. It is issued by Longmans, Green & Co. at 6s. «Mr. Crawford is already well

known to many of our readers,

both professionally, as a civil en gineer, who has done much con-

struction work on South American railways, and as an author. His first work, "Across the Pampas and the Andes," was a record of his experiences whilst engaged in the survey for the Buenos Aires and Pacific Railway, and it was widely read and much as was widely read and much ap preciated for its racy style and accuracy of delineation of South American scenes In 1888 Mr. Crawford was appointed chief en-ginner of the Central Uruguay Northern Extension, from Paso de los Toros to Santa Ana do Libramento, on the southern frontier of 335.87; -Silver cheques conformes from Paysandu to Minas, Col. Brazil. The present book is the in circulation, O. (in May \$500.)— Elias Borches will be appoint result of his observations and adventures whilst engaged in the construction of that line. Consequently, it refers almost entirely to uruguay, and to a part of that country as yet but little known to ordinary travellers. As might be expected it gives much information about the Banda Oriental and its railways; but Mr. Crawford is a discursive writer, and dearly loves to lethis pen run away from technical subjects into the realms of natural history, sociology, and other to-pics, always mingled with the genial banter inherent to his countrymen from the Green Isle," so that his work will be welcome reading to other than railway engineers and shareholders. One impression the book will probably give to these latter is that the Northern Extension of the Central Uruguay Railway was built in advance of the requirements of the country, as indeed has since been proved by its traffic returns. Pastoral industry seems to be the only business in the section traversed, and it does not appear likely to develop any other. The future of the line will much depend ipon measures being taken by the Uruguayan and Brazilian Govern-ments to put down the contraband trade which has so long flourished in this region. ### Mr. Parish Robertson.

We quote the following very interesting historical sketch from the B. A Standard.—

«One of the most remarkable Englishmen who visited South America was John Parish Robertson, who was born at Kelso, Scot-land, in 1792. His father was assistant secretary of the Bank of Scotland, and his mother, Juliet Parish, daughter of a Hamburg merchant. He began life at 13 years of age as powder monkey aboard one of Admiral Sterling's vessels in the attack on Montevideo in 1806, his father having come out to es- advices it has not yet started, but is tablish a house of business in the River Plate. Scotland and proceeded to the Cape of Good Hope. In 1807 young Ro-bertson, being then 14, sailed from Greenock for Rio Janeiro with two guineas in his pocket; one of them he sent back by the captain as a present to his mother. During four years he acted as commercial clerk, first at Rio and afterwards at Buenos Aires, until he was sent by some merchants in 1811 to dis pose of a cargo of merchandise in Paraguay. Three years later he was joined by his brother William, but both brothers were soon after banished by Francia and obliged to remove to Corrigorias.

rrientes. Here they pursued for two years a profitable business in hides, being aided by an Irishman named Campbell, who held military sway under Artigas. John P Ro-bertson visited Scotland in 1817, established valuable trade relations established valuable trade relations with merchants in Liverpool, Glasgow, London, Manchester and Paisley, and during seven years carried on so extensive a commerce in the River Plate and Peru that he was able to return to Greenock in 1825 with a fortune of £100000 sterling in a vessel of his own and holding the character of Diplomatic Agent from some of the new Republics of South some of the new Republics of South America Being now 32 years of age he resolved to embark on still larger ventures, and got up the Scotch Colony to Buenos Aires, sinking all his fortune in the Monte Grande settlement. In 3 years the war with Brazil and Lavalle's revolution ruined his enterprise, and he returned almost penniless to England in 1830. Although nearly 40 years of age, he entered Cambridge University as student, and after 3 years retired to a cottage in the Isle of Wight to embrace a life of literary labours. Having about this time married a lady of fortune, he was in comparatively easy circumstances for the remainder of his days. His letters on Paraguay and La Plata gained a world wide popularrity, as also his brother's works on Mexico and other Spanish Republics. He was the first man to open trade with Paraguay; the first who sent a steamer into the R. Plate; the first who established extensive relations with the West Coast, and the first who attempted agriculture on a large scale in Buenos Aires. He died at Calais on November 1st, 1834, at the age of 51 having been for some time in declining health, perhaps caused by hardships of his early life, when he oft rode 100 miles or more in one day, as told in his interesting memoirs».

### THE WAR.

There was little news of importance yesterday In Santiago the Americans are steadily putting matters in order. The great problem seems the one of good. The Red Cross Society have some 40,000 persons on their hands, all in want, butit is said that 20 vessels with provisions have already arrived. According to one telegram the refugees have hard the description of the descri with open arms, and do not conceal their joy at the termination of the struggle. General Algerreports having already received 10,000 rifles and 10 million carteids. and 10 million cartridges. The surrender of the outside garrisons of the province is not yet accomplished, but it is not imagined that there will be any serious dificulty 22,789 in given officially as the number of the Spanish troops included in the surrender. The U. S authorities are in possession of the cable and telegraph offices, which cuts off all communication between General Blanco and his Government (this has been said before.) President MacKinley has is sued a Decree establishing autonomic government the island under guarantee of the United States. The aqueduct is being rapidly repaired. General McKibben, the Military Governor has proclaimed complete liberty of commerce, with the exception of restrictions on the sale of liquors. A number of po-litical prisoners have been set at liberty. An English Navigation Company has offered to convey 18,000 men to Spain for £120,-000 Yellow fever is reported to be making great ravages among the Spanish garrisons of Caimanera and Guatanamo, where only 3000 men were found in good health. There has been an un pleasant incident with Mr. Scovel, correspondent of that notorious paper the N. Y World, It is said that he tried to raise the flag of the Cuban Republic on the Government House at Santiago, but was turned out by the U. S offi-cers. He then had a violent interview with General Schafter, whom he insulted and, it is said, even struck. He has been sent to Tampa as a prisoner.

Though the Spaniards seem to expect hourly the appearance of an U. S. squadron off the coast of Spain, according to Washington


