Matters are quieting down rapidly, and public attention is now turned on the Government to see what steps if any, it will take to save the Republic from a second military outbreak, for all are agreed that it would be the height of imprudence and folly to let the matter pass with no further punishment for the criminals than a farcical deportation to Buenos Aires. As is wisely pointed out by yesierday's Siglo, this is not sufficient to calm the public mind and restore confidence. Though some twenty odd have been deported, more and quite as dangerous remain behind. #### THE WAR.

There was not much of import-

ance in yesterday's war news, mainly references, with the usual contradictions and confusions, to past events. In Spain attention seems concentrated on the political situation, and a reconstruction of the Cabinet on a more military basis seems im minent. The Government has called out 15,000 more men to arms for the 15th instant, presumably for the defence of the peninsula. It seems fairly confirmed that Admiral Camara's squadron is continuing its voyage to the Phillipines, and in view of this, according to a Washington telegram, Com. Schley has been ordered to start for Spain, to bombard the forts, with a squadrom composed of the armourclads Massachusetts and Texas, the cruiser Brooklyn, the pro-tected cruisers Columbia, Minnea-polis, Newark and San Francisco, the open cruisers New Orleans and Papeka, and various transports with coal and stores. (This is very circumstantial, but we think it still requires confirmation and is contradicted by other telegrams which represent Com. Schley and his considered. and his squadron as about to operate on Puerto Rico.) As to the idea of peace, the telegrams are too utterly contradic tory to make anything out of; the army is now said to be the obstacle, being anxious to revenge its reverses.

### THE NAVAL FIGHT AT SANTIAGO.

(Owing to circumstances of which our readers are aware, we were unable to give a detailed ac count of the great Naval Fight at Santiago. We now quote the fol-lowing from our contemporary the Herald of Buenos Aires.)—

morning the vessels composing the Spanish squadron commanded by Cervera began to leave the bay of Santiago. The cruiser «Almirante Oquendo» led the way, followed by the «Vizcaya,» the «Infanta Maria Teresa» and the «Cristobal Golon.» The destroyers «Furor» and «Pluton.» which had preceded the squadron by a lew minutes directed their course to the armed cruiser \*Brooklyn, \* the flagship of Admiral Schley. On clearing the bay the Spanish ves-sels turned their bows to the west and put on full steam ahead The American ships opened fire and several of the fastest at once went in pursuit. Meantime the destroyers continued advancing towards the American squadron, and the gunboat «Gloucester» quickly left the line to meet them, opening fire at the same time. The destruction of the two destroyers was only the work of a few minutes on the part of the «Gloucester», which accomplished the work without any assistance. Of the 60 men who composed the company of the «Pluton» 20 reached the shore by swimming, and were afterwards made prisoners: six of the crew of the mother asked how she liked it. «I «Furor» were saved. All the rest were drowned.

Meanwhile the American ships

The American vessels than directed their attention to the «Cristobal Colon», the flagship of the squadron, which, so far, had es-caped the fire of the enemy She was making a westerly course at full speed along the coast, and maintained some distance from her pursuers until two in the alternoon. About that time, seeing that it was impossible to maintain her speed and to sustain the heavy fire to which she was now subjected, she turned her stem towards the shore and shared the fate of her companions at a point 60 miles from the bay of Santiago. This vessel was the only one that struck her flag on going ashore. All the ship's company, numbering 300 men, including Admiral Cervera, were made prisoners. Cervera was taken on board the Gloucester, the captain of which congratulated him on the valour displayed by his men and allotted him private apart

#### LONDON NOTES

FRIDAY, JUNE 10. A Correspondent at Madrid tele-graphs that the grave news from Manila has created a feeling of pro-found depression there. At a conference to which Senor Sagasta invited the leaders of parties in the Cortes on Wednesday, the Premier, in urging the prompt passing of the Budget, did not attempt to hide the serious state of affairs, and his own agitation was plainly visible. One account of the pro-ceedings states that Senor Sagasta sounded the leading men present as to the manner in which they would regard pro-posals for peace, should such be made by him. All were equally and utterly opposed to such a course. In the sitting of the Chamber which followed the conference, the Government was sharply attacked for its indecision and want of energy. There was a rumour current in Madrid yesterday that General Augustin at Manila had already surrendered to the American Admiral, being unable to hold the city against the rebels, and it is believed in some quarters that, in any case, the general's dispatch reporting his exceedingly serious position was considerably modified by the Government before it was pub-

M. Paul Deschanel was yester-day definitely elected President of the French Chamber.

The House of Lords assembled yesterday after the Whitsuntide recess. Only a short sitting was held. Lord Heneage presented a Bill to prevent the sale of immature fish and it was read a first time. A number of unopposed Bills were edvanced a stage.

Considerable discussion took

place in the House of Commons on the Gas Light and Coke Company Bill, complaint being made of the price charged for gas supplied. Eventually an amendment which was moved as a protest against the charge was rejected by 214 votes to 109. On a motion for adjournment Mr. Dillon and others discussed the recent riots in Belfast Mr. Gerald Balfour stated that the really serious riot occurred after the Ca tholic procession had dispersed, and it was an attack upon the police and not upon the procession. A number of measures were after-wards advanced. Amongst them the Private Bill Procedure (Scotland) Bill was referred to a Select Committee, the Reserve Forces Bill was read a third time, and the Habitual Inebriates Bill a second time! The London University Commis-sion Bill was postponed till Mon-

Head by Lord Cranbrook, a deputation from the Houses of Lay-men of Canterbury and York wait-ed upon the Home Secretary yesterday with reference to the religious instruction given to Church of England children in industrial and re-formatory schools. It was intend-ed by the Education Act that children should be allowed to have the religious instruction of the denomination to which they belonged. In practice there had been a class-ification of Roman Catholics and Protestants, and the former, it was said, alone had separate religious instruction for their children, so that both the letter and the spirit of the Act had been departed from. The Home Secretary, in reply, said that the rules from the Home Office that the rules from the Home Office were intended to give to all children the right to have the religious instruction of the denomination to which they belonged, and he promised to do what he could to remedy existing defects.






