THE MILITARY MUTINY.

PEACE RESTORED.

We are glad to say that the shameful military revolt of Monday-as criminal in object as it was in methods-has come to a speedy conclusion, and tranquillity Republic. The parley of Monday af-Blanco acted as mediator between the President and the mutincers. resulted in the accepting of con-ditions which caused the lat-ter to lay down their arms and return peacefully to their quarters. The precise nature of these conditions has not been made public, but it seems to be understood that no proceedings are to be instituted against the leaders, though possibly they may be obliged to leave the country for awhile. This is generally regretted, as it is the almost universal opinion that men guilty of such an attempt and of the utterly savage act of firing artillery is the heart of a peaceful and slumin the heart of a peaceful and slumbering city without the least warn ing, are deserving of the severest punishment, both as an example and a deterrent. However, it was President Cuestas' desire that no more blood should be spilt, and there was no doubt that the rebels would have given con-siderable further trouble, being equipped with artillery and in possession of the Arsenal. It is stated that at first they demanded the resignation of Sr. Cuestas in favor of Dr. J. C. Blanco, and the restoration of the «collectivist» Chambers dissolved last February, but we need hardly say that such conditions were not entertained for a moment. The only grievance they seemed able to formulate was the alleged spersecution» of the dissident «colorados» or «collectivists.» This, however, exists only in their imagina-tion, for it is the very general opinion that Sr. Cuestas has been ar too lenient towards a faction that were the open enemies of the country and whose criminal designs are now fully revealed Whether the Government has made any further concessions to them, is not yet known, but it is to be hoped not, though there are hints of a change in the Cabinet Anyhow, peace was made, and between 4 and 5 p.m. on Monday the re-bels surrendered the Arsenal, abandoned their positions and re-turned to barracks The Govern-ment troops were kept on guard until early yesterday morning after which they went home and the city yesterday resumed its usual aspect. Major Mir was placed in charge of the Heavy Artillery and Major Icasuriaga of the Light It appears that the principal officers of the latter were completely foreign to the revolt, but, on the contrary, lent their services to the Plantel de Artillerie to defend the Government. cess. We give below some further notes of the salient details of the events on Monday, which may be regarded as complimentary to the imperfect chronicle in our last.

The military leaders of the revolt were Generals Estevan, Casimiro

Garcia, Santos Arribio and Caram ula. These, with a staff of about 25 persons, were seen riding through the streets early in the morning, in full uniform, and wearing the sinister «colorado» badge, the appearance of which in the streets is invariably the forerunner of disorder or worse. Amongst civilians associated with the movement are mentioned the names of Angel Brian, Eugenio Garzon, Miguel Herrera, Vilaza, Lacueva, Zavalla and other pro-minent «collectivists.» It is said that they had a meating on Singles in they held a meeting on Sunday in which they evolved plans for a new government. The police had orders to arrest. Dr. Brian, but he was in hiding in the suburbs and we have not yet heard of his capwe have not yet heard of his cap-ture. We cannot say if Dr. Castro and Dr. Floro Costa had anything to do with it. Col. Ricardo Flores, only released from prison a few days ago, was arrested early in the morning by Prefect Dominguez and Major Bouquet, after making an attempt to suborn the latter.

The first news of the rising was telephoned to Prefect Dominguez as early as 4 a. m. on Monday morning by the Commissary of the Union, who advised him that the Light Artillery had sallied from their barracks with their field-guns. It seems the rebels made no attempt to cut the telephone and telegraph wires. Sr. Dominguez at once warned the President, Ministers, and all the authorities, and the garrison regiments were told to hold themselves in readiness. All the latter immediately responded to the orders of the President, except Col. Manuel Rodri-guez 1stChief of the Heavy Artillery who sent back a reply that he only beyed the orders of the «colorado party. The treachery of this of-ficer has caused much pain and surprise, as he was one in whom

the Government had great confidence. tubre was taken without fighting, by a ruse whilst the men were changing guard (this seems strange.) The first resistance was met at the barracks of the 4th Chas seurs, the Chief of which, Col. Pollo, indignantly refused to join the revolt. A company of Artillery laid seige to the barracks all the morning, but the regiment resisted valiantly and hardly suffered any loss, only one man killed. The point of resistance was just below the Artillery Barracks in the Plaza Artola, in which district some stiff The Chasseurs occupied Calles Colonia and Minas, where they received the heavy fire from the Artillery. This regiment was the worst sufterer, having some twenty killed and nearly a hundred wounded Major Arenas of the Urban Batal lion was killed in a skirmish in Calle 18 de Julio, after having gone through the revolution of last year without a scratch Amongst the officers wounded were Captain Nava and Lieuts. Dufrechou and Lino Fernandez. The rebels suffered far less than the Government forces, their losses being about forty. Reports that General Estevan and Col. M. Rodriguez were wounded proved untrue, though the latter had two horses shot under him. No precise computation has yet been made of the total losses, but they may be roughly estimated at fifty to sixty killed and nearly 200 wounded. It is confirmed that Generals Maximo and Salvador Tajes and Eduardo Vasquez were amongst these The Minister of War, General Gregorio Castro, showed great activity despite his showed great activity despite his years and infirmity, but the principal and most energetic defender of the situation was undoubtedly Prefect Dominguez who has thus added another laurel to his crown. The National Guard responded admirably to the call made, and two hours after notice had been given nearly 500 of them had been arm-ed and placed in bodies at strate gic points. They were all most enthusiastic for the Government cause, with which, indeed, whole population sympathised. giving the government troops every encouragement and assistance in

In the Departments everything has remained perfectly tranquil. From Buenos Aires it is telegraphed that Dr. Julio Herrera had nothing to do with the movement and was as much taken by surprise as anyone. This we ven ture to doubt.

THE WAR. Despite attempted contradictions

in some of the Spanish telegrams, the complete destruction of Admiral Cervera's fleet on Sunday is fully confirmed with a multiplicity of details that our limited space will not permit us to repeat. About 9.30 a. m. the Spanish fleet sallied from the mouth of Santiago Bay (how about the «Merrimac ?») the flagship «Cristobal Colon» leading. The U.S. vessels formed in two lines, reserving their fire until the they then gave chase, opening a tremendous fire. The Spanish responded valiantly but with little effect, and the incapable state of some of their vessels was plainly noticeable. By 2 o'clock all was over. All the Spanish vessels caught fire and were run on shore about five miles from Santiago, where most of them blow up Some of the smaller vessels sank almost immediately. The flagship «Cristobal Colon» managed to get about 60 (7) miles away and then ran ashore. The Spanish flag was kept flying to the last. As soon as the destruction of the Spanish fleet was apparent, the U. S. vessels lowered their boats to rescue the survivors. In this manner they took about 1300 prisoners, among whom was Admiral Cervera himself. said to be wounded in the arm. He was taken on board the «Gloucester, where he was complimented on his bravery and treated with every consideration. The . Brooklyn» was chiefly instrumental in the destruction of the «Cristobal Colon. The Spanish lost several hundred killed and wounded. The U.S. losses according to Com. Sampson were one killed and two wounded, but another telegram says 100 killed andmany wounded. Anyhow, the victory is complete, decisive and extraordinary.

Santiago has not yet fallen. The Commandant refused to surrender, and at the petition of the foreign Consuls General Schafter (who is said to be ill) allowed until noon yesterday for some 20,000 persons, non-combatants, women and children, to leave the city before the bombardment commenced. News of this should therefore arrive today. General Linares is severely wounded, and has resigned the command to General Pando.

From Manila is is stated that the «Charleston» and three transports with reinforcements have arrived, and the troops have disembarked at Cavite without molestation. Admiral Dewey awaits further troops before attacking the city. General Agustin has been repulsed by the rebels with considerable loss in an attempt to sally from the city. The Spanish gunboat «Leyte» with 52 officers, 94 soldiers and various refugees on board was captured near Ma-nila last Thursday. The U.S flag has been raised on the Ladrones Islands.

A Paris telegram reports that Premier Sagasta has already opened negotiations for peace Other telegrams, however, attribute to him the most bellicose declarations and a determination to continue the war


