Both Sides of the Picture.

(A SHORT STORY)

HER STORY.

It was bitterly cold that spring in Florence; the keen blasts from snow-covered Monte Morello and far Senario seemed to pierce through my thin cloak to my very bones as I crossed the Ponte alle Grazie on my way to the Uffizi Gallery.

I belonged to the noble army of copyists, and though as yet I had not been successful in selling any of my pictures, I was always hoping the tide would turn some day. It was weary work, however, struggling on alone, for now my mother was dead I had not a relation in the world. With the exception of my kind landlady, I did not know a soul in Florence, and my life was necessarily a solitary one.

The last few weeks I had been feeling depressed and weak, and the many stairs at the Uffizi seemed on this particular morning to try me more than usual. I climbed them slowly, stopping frequently to take breath, and it was with a sigh of relief that I sank into my chair in the west corridor.

I was working at a copy of Botticelli's 'Judith,' and uncovering my canvas, settled myself at my easel. I had been painting steadily for perhaps an hour, when the sound of some one coming briskly along the gallery broke in upon my musings, and caused me to do look up. This quick, decided tread was very different to the dawdling step of the hardened copyist. There was something about it so buoyant and hopeful, so alert and determined, that I involuntarily raised my head as it drew nearer.

The new-comer, I guessed instinctively, was an artist, but of a very different type to most of those who frequented the Gallery. Prosperity was written unmistakably upon him, from his spotless collar to his trim, highly-polished boots, and his appearance seemed to accentuate the shabby, poverty-stricken air of the rest of us. The curly hair and tall, well-knit frame bespoke health of body, but to me his charm lay not so much in the features of the handsome face as in a peculiar bright cheeriness and strength which seemed to pervade every line. He was English, as one saw at a glance, and his nationality was an additional grace in my eyes; he seemed to bring with him a sweet draught of my dear native air, and a sudden distaste for foreigners and their ways fell upon me. That day my loneliness pressed more heavily on me than ever.

The Englishman's easel was just behind me, and I found he intended copying the well-known portrait of Madame Lebrun. He became absorbed in his work, seldom appearing to bestow a glance upon any one—artists or sight-seers. When compelled by courtesy to move aside in order to allow the latter to see the picture he was copying, he would fidget from one foot to the other, and sometimes take short, impatient steps up and down, close to where I was sitting. Once he came so near that he trod on the hem of my dress, but even then I do not think he was aware of my presence.

My picture did not get on at this time as it ought to have done. Slowly, and half-inconsciously, a change was passing over me. A subtle warmth and fragrance seemed to surround me each morning when I awoke, it was with that feeling every one is familiar with, that something nice was going to happen that day. Of course, nothing ever did happen; my life went on outwardly in the same monotonous way, though inwardly it was different. It seemed fuller of hope and purpose, no longer so grey and colourless. And yet the chief events in it were only the coming and going of those quick footsteps, and occasional hasty glimpses of a cheerful, resolute face, and a tall tweed-clad figure.

Thus I drifted on day by day, not guessing whether I was tending; perfectly happy when at my work, restless and ill at ease when away. All manner of foolish dreams filled my mind, the predominant one being the idea of some day painting a wonderful picture, which all the world should talk of and admire. Silly child that I was! There was only one person whose admiration I wanted; only one inhabitant in my airy castle, and he did not even know my name!

In justice to myself be it said the hope of ever speaking to him or getting to know him did not even in my wildest flights enter my head. It seems to me, in looking back on those days, that I regarded him as a kind of young god, far removed from an insignificant, striking little girl like myself.

About a month after his first appearance in the Gallery, I noticed one morning that he had omitted to cover up his canvas before going to lunch. I wished very much to see his work, and as I was too shy to look when he was present, this was a good opportunity, of which I was not slow to avail myself.

Every one who has visited the portrait-room at the Uffizi must have remarked the beautiful likeness of Madame Lebrun; that lovely, piquant face which turns to most the spectator's gaze, so sparkling with life and animation that one almost wonders why no words issue from the delicately-curved lips, half-parted to display the little white teeth within. I was familiar enough with the original, it was on the copy that I bestowed all my attention. It was undoubtedly of a far higher order than most of those produced in the

Gallery, and showed careful, masterly work. The artist had not only faithfully reproduced the delicate features and colouring, but had succeeded in catching the expression—half-laughing, half-wistful—and the indescribable airy grace of the seated figure. I looked from one canvas to the other, wishing dully that Nature had endowed me with blue eyes and soft brown curls, instead of giving me a pale, wasabone face, and dark orbs and hair.

On the 15th of June, 1897, Dr. Macartney opened his office for the exercise of the profession in all its branches. 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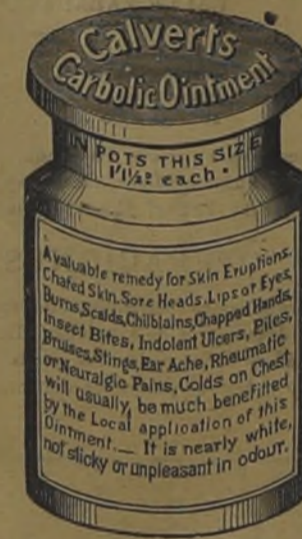
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
