The Council decided to disallow the extra shot fired by Private Simpson, of Manchester, in the second stage of the Queen's. Consequently, Lieutenant Fletcher, 2nd Liverpool, and Sergeant Barret, 2nd Norfolk, were left to fire off the lie for the Silver Medal, the trophy being eventually won by the former after a second tie.

Rain considerably interfered with the progress of cricket yesterday, and in several instances brought play to an early termination. Thanks largely to the brilliant batting of Abel, who completed his 1,000 runs in first class cricket, Surrey carried their total to 282 for four wickets, and left off on even terms with Hampshire. At Leyton, Essex hit up 137 for the loss of three men before the game had to be abandoned for the day. F. S. Jackson was in excellent form at Scarborough, and Yorkshire had much the better of their match with Somerset, the southern country being still more than 100 behind, and having lost half their wickets in the second innings. Lancashire having carried their own score to 484 got rid of Leicestershire for 172, and in the second innings for 53 for three wickets.

Dr. Danford Thomas, Coroner for Central London, held an inquiry yesterday regarding the deaths of Walter Pearl and John Dean, the driver and fireman of the Windsor express, to the engine of which an accident occurred on Monday. The jury returned a verdict of accidental death, adding that in their opinion the engine was not a proper one to be used for express traffic. They commended the deceased for their devotion to duty.

Mr. Luxmore Drew, the West London coroner, yesterday held an inquest into the circumstances attending the death of a labourer and sweeper in the employ of the Midland Railway Company, who was killed by the explosion which occurred at the Earl's Court Exhibition on Monday last. Captain Thompson, one of her Majesty's Inspectors of Explosives, said the best and the most likely theory that he could form was that the sodium stored in the magazine ignited first, probably through contact with the moist air, that petroleum vapour caught alight from the sodium, and that the vapour caused the gunpowder to explode. The jury returned a verdict of accidental death, but added a rider that they considered the County Council should take more stringent measures to ensure compliance with the Explosives Act.

MONDAY, JULY 25. The Queen paid a visit on Saturday to H.M.S. Blonde, on which Prince Henry of Battenberg died, being accompanied on her trip into Osborne Bay, where the vessel is lying, by Princess Henry of Battenberg. In the evening the Queen opened the new road, under the name of Beatrice Avenue, she has constructed at East Cowes with the object of giving a shorter route to Whippingham from the town. An illuminated address was presented to her Majesty by the District Council. In reply, the Queen returned her thanks for the loyalty displayed, and expresses her pleasure in opening the new road, which she hoped would prove a permanent benefit to her neighbours in East Cowes and the adjoining parishes, amongst whom she had spent so many happy years.

Saturday night was the best night which the Prince of Wales had passed since his accident. The bulletins issued on Saturday and yesterday morning were to the effect that his Royal Highness was making satisfactory and continuous progress, and in view of this fact no bulletin was published last night. Yesterday morning the Prince heard through the electro phone a service conducted by Canon Fleming at St. Michael's, Chester square; and in the evening, by the same means listened to a sacred concert.

An interesting ceremonial took place at Highgate on Saturday, when the Duchess of Albany attended to dedicate the Queen's Wood, till lately known as Churchyard Bottom Wood, to the use of the public, and as a local memorial of the Diamond Jubilee. Lord Salisbury gave a garden party at Hatfield House on Saturday, the guests numbering about 2,000. Besides the Duke of Cambridge and several Ambassadors and Ministers from foreign countries, the company included members of the Cabinet and of both Houses of Parliament. The Premier, Lady Gwendolen Cecil, and Lady Granborne, received the guests.

An interesting gathering of representative French and English artists took place at a banquet given for the purpose by the Lord Mayor at the Mansion House on Saturday. The toasts of the Queen and of the President of the French Republic were cordially honoured, and that of «Prosperity to French and English Art» proposed by the

Lord Mayor, was responded to by M. Dayot and Sir E. Poynter. The American expedition to Puerto Rico under General Miles is expected to land to-day or tomorrow. The troops will, it is said, number 40,000. Guantanamo, in Cuba, is expected to surrender at once. General Shafter says he will have to feed all the troops there, they being on very short rations. It is reported that Garcia's force has attacked a column of Spaniards who were coming in to surrender, but the rumour is not confirmed. General Shafter has sent the insurgent leader a mollifying letter.

The Spanish Government, a Madrid Correspondent says, continues its efforts in the direction of peace, but is meeting with serious difficulties. The chief of these is declared to be the attitude of Mr. McKinley, who, while sometimes inclined to put an end to the struggle, at others seems to wish to carry on the war indefinitely. Friends of the Cabinet say he desires to inaugurate a powerful military empire, and that the Americans will not listen to peace proposals until Manila and Puerto Rico are in their power.

Bisley Rifle Meeting was brought to a close on Saturday in splendid weather. The Gold Medal and the Queen's Prize of 150l. was, after a close contest, gained by Lieut. D. Yates, of the 3rd Lanark, with a grand total of 327, his nearest competitors being Sergeant A. Handford, of the 2nd V. B. Manchester and Armourer Sergeant J. H. Scott, of the 1st Roxburgh and Selkirk, who each made 326. Shooting for the St. George's Prize resulted in a tie between Corporal Fleming, 4th V. B. Scottish Rifles, and Private Gray, 1st Scots Fusiliers. This being shot off Corporal Fleming was declared the winner. Yorkshire beat Somerset at Scarborough on Saturday by six wickets, and at Leicester the home county was defeated by Lancashire by an innings and 24 runs. The match between Surrey and Hampshire at the Oval ended in a draw, as did also the contests between Essex and Kent on the Leyton ground and Notts and Gloucestershire at Nottingham.
