THE NEW DEBT.

CONSOLIDATION OF THE TREASURY CERTIFICATES. Publication has been made of the Report of the Finance Committee of the Council of State on the Debt to be created for the consolidation of the unredeemed Treasury Certificates. It is a lengthy affair, but, as most of the antecedents are sufficiently well known, we content ourselves with reproducing the following passages.

The amount of the Certificates in circulation is officially stated to be \$4,040,000 (round figures, presumably) of which \$490,000 corresponds to the month of November 1897, \$450,000 to December, January and February, and \$440,000 to March, April, May and June and July, 1898. (The decrease in the figures may be taken as practical evidence of the economies effected by the Cuestas Government.) It is also officially stated that a tax of 5% on Administrative salaries and pensions, including the Municipal and Charitable employees will amount to \$32,812 monthly or \$394,951 yearly if charged on the gross salaries, or to \$28,335 monthly or \$340,028 yearly if charged on the net salaries (that is to say after other permanent discounts have been allowed for.) Of this about two-thirds corresponds to the civil and pension lists and one-third to the military list.

The petition presented by the representatives of the Chamber of Commerce dwells upon the loss that would be inflicted on the holders of the Certificates by the low rate of bonus (20%) originally proposed by the Government. The average price of the oldest (November) Certificates is calculated at 88.57% in March, 91.33% in April, 94.12% in May, 94.98% in June, 95.30% in July and 97.65% in August whereas, in the present state of the market the proposed bonus would only return 66.50 (this is giving the new Debt the very depressed quotation of 55%). The petition, although it endeavours to defend the market from the charge of having allowed itself to be dominated by alarmists and "bears," shows very plainly that this was the case for in June the difference in the quotation of the Certificates was only 9.90%, for the nine months, whilst in August it increased to 20%, or twice as much, and in the last few days of the month to still more, sales on term (the base of the market) being offered at almost any price. The petition concludes by asking that the bonus be raised to 50% (1) and the amortisation to 3 or 4%, and that the service be effected monthly or bi-monthly.

We now come to the Report proper of the Finance Committee. This defends the action of the Executive in suspending the issue and conversion of the Certificates, on the grounds that the step had been rendered necessary, and indeed unavoidable, in defence of the interests of administrative employees by the unreasonably depressed quotation at which the Certificates had arrived in creating the new Debt, which was to take the place of the outstanding Certificates, it being impossible for the moment to create new charges on the Treasury. This limit, taking as basis the tax of 5% on net salaries and the product of the 2 1/2% additional import duty (the latter only till the end of the present year) was equivalent to \$351,000. It had been decided, with agreement of the Executive and of the Certificate holders, to reduce the amortisation to 1% per annum, which would permit of a larger bonus. Under these conditions the bonus could be fixed at 36%, with a reduction of 3% per month instead of 2%.

The value of the Certificates would thus acquire, supposing the new Debt to be quoted at 60% or at 70%, is shown in the following table.

This would require \$5,017,400 of Debt to be issued, the service of which, at 6% interest and 1% amortisation would just reach the limit named. The loss which the holders will suffer, and which it is impossible entirely to avoid—though it is worth nothing that the market had foreseen and discounted it by establishing a heavy risk premium for the purchase of the Certificates—is considerably diminished by the proposed bonus and will even disappear entirely for those who can await the normalisation of the situation perturbed for the moment by internal problems and the international difficulties of our neighbours. With the bonus now offered, holders of the Certificates will receive an interest equivalent to from 81/2 to 9%, on the capital invested, which is more than is given by the Consolidated Debt even at the present low quotation.

The Report concludes by recommending a Bill in accordance with the above conclusions. The service of interest is to be monthly and that of amortisation half yearly. The tax of 5% on salaries is to be extended to those of the legislative body.

POLITICAL NOTES. The Council of State no quorumed on Friday. Discussion of the Budget, however, was resumed yesterday. Sunday being the first anniversary of the signing of the Peace of September which put an end to the civil war of last year, Sr. Cuestas was largely visited and congratulated. Our contemporaries mostly had articles allusive to the occasion, though it is to be feared that the memories and the patriotic sentiments which they evoke will not go far to stem the constant current of political intrigue which is doing so much injury to the Republic. In fact, they hardly produce a momentary truce, for rumors of wonderful resignations and changes continue to circulate as freely as ever. Seeing how few of these are ever realised, we wonder that people do not get tired of repeating them, but, like the well worn confidence trick, they never seem to lack gulls.

Replying to the recent consultation of the Minister of Government, the Government Fiscals Drs Reyes and Garzon have both given the opinion that the police are sufficiently authorised to enter a house where they have reason to believe unlawful games are being played. The constitutional inviolability of the domicile, they say, was never intended to protect illegal and immoral acts, and if the police know that public gambling is being carried on in a house, although the house may be apparently private, they have just the same right to enter, and it is furthermore their duty to enter, as if they knew that a crime was being committed there. The guarantees of the Constitution were never intended to cover the perpetration of penal offences, Dr. Reyes goes still further, and hints pretty plainly that the police knew this all along but preferred wilfully to ignore it for reasons best known to themselves and which the public may easily guess. The Minister has passed the Report to the police authorities, instructing them to act accordingly. It is to be hoped they will do so, and not find fresh excuses for the toleration of gambling houses.

Dr. Carlos María Ramírez.

We regret to record the death, which occurred early yesterday morning after a short but severe illness, of the prominent politician and writer Dr. C. M. Ramírez, in his 50th year. Dr. Ramírez, member of a brilliant and distinguished family, has figured in turn as Deputy, Senator, Cabinet Minister, historian and journalist, distinguishing himself in each capacity as well as in his profession of lawyer. He will be specially remembered as Editor, for many years, of the *Razon*, in which his articles on political, financial and historical questions were eagerly read, and at times exercised great influence on public opinion. We have frequently quoted both his articles and his speeches in these columns, in recent years, though of late we have not always been able to agree with him. He was independent in judgement, possessed of great discernment and wide information, and had a remarkably clear, lucid and brilliant literary style. His loss will be very generally lamented, and nowhere more than in press circles. He was married to a daughter of the veteran Dr. José María Muñoz, who survives his death, but without children.

The funeral will take place at 4 p. m. to-day from Calle Piedras 344.

An extraordinary general meeting of the shareholders was held on Thursday, August 25, at the offices, Gresham House. Mr. Herbert Ward presided, and moved the confirmation of resolutions, passed on the 10th inst., as special resolutions—namely, that each preferred or ordinary share be subdivided into five shares of £1 each, three of such shares to be called preference shares, and the remaining two ordinary shares; that the holders of the preference shares created by such subdivision be entitled to a cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of 5 per cent, per annum in lieu of a non-cumulative dividend at the rate of 6 per cent; that in the event of the company being wound up the holders of such preference shares be not entitled to any preference as to capital; that the holders of the ordinary shares created by such subdivision be entitled to the same rights and privileges as to receipt of dividends and otherwise as the holders of the ordinary shares would be entitled to after the proposed reduction of capital; and that the capital be reduced from £220,000 to £160,000, divided into 87,000 preference shares of £1 each and 73,000 ordinary shares of £1 each, such reduction to be effected by cancelling paid-up capital which had been lost or was unrepresented by available assets to the extent of £4 on each of the existing 15,000 ordinary shares of £5 each, and by reducing the nominal amount of each of the same ordinary shares from £5 to £1. Mr. J. E. Kingsbury seconded the motion, which was agreed to *nem con*.

Rough on Dudes. We quote the following severe but not unmerited remarks from the *Buenos Aires Herald*:—The moneyed class is now reaping some of the benefits of its corruption and utter lack of patriotism and of a sense of justice. When one of that class committed a crime or a misdemeanour his fellows promptly shielded him or hid the matter hushed up. They instituted a secret system of justice, or rather of law, and made a sort of unwritten code by which they could act with impunity. *Yo soy distinguido* is here as certain a pass out of prison as *Cicero Romanus sum*, in the days of the Empire, was an unwritten licence to defy all law. It may be said that the members of our moneyed class are as free to break the law and injure outsiders as the Osmanli are to trample on the rights of infidels and Arabs in Turkish dominions, except that the Turk in some respects is infinitely more gentlemanly.

Now the *agente conocido* cries out because its own unlicked young cub—*or*, to save the mark, we will call them *prole*—play all sorts of practical jokes upon people giving entertainments. The good folks wonder how they can put a stop to the little game of their exuberant progeny. The remedy is very simple. Have one law for rich and poor. Call in the police and see that the youths in fine raiment are punished as severely as any one else would be, if not more severely, on account of their superior chances in life and presumably better upbringing, to which they are such a credit. The whole system of practical joking, as this petty criminality is called, could be put an end to in a very little time if the detectives and police court magistrates were appealed to. It is as useless to appeal to the honour of such youths as to

expect to gather grapes from thistles.

If the parents of these promising scions of plutocracy would reflect on the matter they could hardly acquit themselves from blame, on account of the laxity and indulgence they displayed in rearing their progeny.

However, one offence will lead to worse, and it will serve the over-indulgent parents right if some day they are shocked by a series of more serious results from the attempts of their offspring to imitate the manners and customs of monkeys. Equanimity a Sign of Health. Worry is a curse and a source of much unhappiness. It seems the face with lines and furrows, and has a most depressing effect upon that hyper-sensitive organ, the stomach, which at such times becomes a most unwilling and laggard servant. Indeed, it is safe to say that unless encouraged by a cheerful temper and bright, or, at least, hopeful thoughts, the stomach will play truant or sulk and do no good work. The physiological explanation of this is the close alliance of the great sympathetic nerves, which are worse than the telegraph for carrying bad news; the worry and anxiety which depresses the brain produce simultaneously a semi-paralysis of the nerves of the stomach; gastric juices will not flow, and— *presto!*—there is indigestion. One sign of mental health is serenity of temper and a self-control that enables us to bear with equanimity the petty trials and jars of life, especially those arising from contact with scolding, irascible, irritating persons.

Serenity of mind comes easy to some and hard to others. It can be taught and learned. We ought to have teachers who are able to educate us in this department of our natures quite as much as in music or art. Think of a school or classes for training men and women to hold themselves serenely amid all the trials which beset them. As it is now, most of our educators urge us on to be ambitious to excel other, and in the end, if not careful, we lose our mental equipoise and with it health and happiness.

One of the secrets of the mind cure is the help it gives to those who have lost their mental equipoise through worry to throw it off again. Unburdening themselves, they are once more able to do their work and rejoice.—*Health*.

Up to the present there has been no clue to the crime by which he met his death, but the police are in search of a neighbour with whom he had recently had a violent quarrel, and who has not yet been found.

The Podesta Company of criollo dramas at the San Felipe Theatre is drawing large audiences. This evening will be given "Cobardo" and "El Cabo Melton," both by local authors.

It describes the various victuals composing the first dinner eaten in camp: "From Uncle Sam—Soup, hard tack beans and coffee. From our parents—Roast chicken, pickles, ginger-bread, mince pie, jam, and cheese. From our girls—Angel cake, bride cake, and sure enough cake. Captured—Bananas, strawberries, peanuts, cigarettes."

The monkey house at the Zoo, says a London paper, has just been recruited by the arrival of an interesting South American Saki monkey known as *Pithecia chirotopes*. It has a bright chestnut coloured fur upon the back, and a black beard which gives it the appearance of an elderly negro. This monkey is one of those hailing from South America which has nevertheless not got that peculiar characteristic of American monkeys—a prehensile tail; it has a tail which is undeniably in length, but it cannot use it as a fifth hand. This creature has acquired its technical name on account of its human method of drinking by taking water up in the hand. Some naturalists hold that the apes of America come nearer to the supposed human ancestor than do the gorilla or the chimpanzee. The boards of these Sakis certainly give them an exceedingly man-like aspect.

LONDON NOTES

SATURDAY, AUGUST 20. A telegram from Port Elizabeth states that the elections there have resulted in the return of the two Progressive candidates.

A Correspondent with the forces describes how in continuation of the manoeuvres on Salisbury Plain the Cavalry division was yesterday split up into opposing brigades.

A Correspondent who is visiting the neighbourhoods in South Wales affected by the coal-mining dispute, writing from Abonilly, again expresses the opinion that it is upon the non-combatants, the small tradesmen and others, and not upon the miners themselves, that the brunt of the disastrous effects of the strike is at present falling.

A conference of the Miners' Federation of Great Britain was held at Birmingham yesterday, Mr. Pickard, M.P., presiding. Although the proceedings were in private, it was understood that they had for their object consideration of the proposals drawn up at the conference which was held some time back at the Westminster Palace Hotel.

Delivering his presidential address at the Co-operative Festival at the Crystal Palace yesterday, Earl Grey deplored the fact that the co-operative movement upon its distributive side had fallen away from the pure faith of its founders, and unless they exercised the greatest care, was in danger of developing into a mere hunt for dividends.

Fatalities owing to the great heat continue to be reported, and further storms have taken place in some of the country districts. At Ruthin Mr. Wm. Williams, a member of the Town Council, and in Carmarthenshire a farmer named Harris, were killed by lightning.

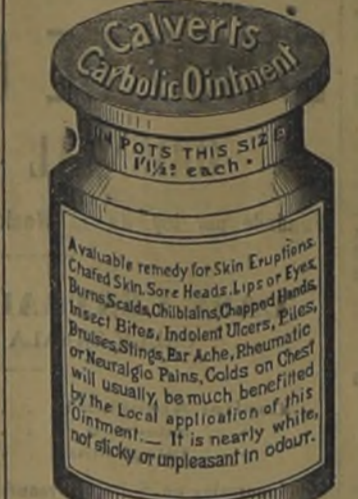
