\*Much cry and little wools is a saying that might well be applied to the political world just now, for there is plenty to gossip about, but not much action of importance.

The report of the Investigating Committee on tagfarre Rowly-Vill-

alba is eagerly awaited. It is ex-pected that it will be ready for presentation to-day. The Nacion disclaims the notion that the Executive had any intention of intervening to hush up or postpone the investigation. The Message of of the Executive which gave rise to the report to that effect only referred to discussion of the Buceo port scheme, and was, in effect, prepared before any thing had be come known about the other matter.

In any case, it is very difficult to believe that the \*blancos\* or any one else outside the «collectivists» can have anything to do with a revolutionary conspiracy, from the absence of any reasonable motive; and it is still more difficult to be-lieve that the \*blancos\* and «col-lectivists\* would join hands in the matter, though, of course, in a country like this there is no accounting for what may be done by individual adventurers and military desperadoes whose sole idea is to get as much as they can for themselves at the expense of every one else and of their country. Col. Borches and Col. Juan M. Col. Borches and Col. Juan M. Villar have resigned the prefect-ships of Paysandu and Salto respectively and their resignations have been accepted. The arrest has been made at Alexandria of a number of Italian Anarchists in whose possession bombs were found. It is reported that it was their intention to blow up the Kaiser and the Khedive, who was to receive him at the Abdin Palace, When his Majesty abandoned his projected visit to Egypt two of the band left for Syria, and their companions, now arrested, were detected after endeavouring to smuggle their bombs
