LONDON NOTES

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27. A telegram from Peking states that four Englishmen, one of whom is attached to the Legation, have been attacked by Chinese soldiery ten miles from that city. Two were seriously injured.

Sir H. B. Kitchener arrived in Paris last evening and is expected in London to-day. He had landed at Marseilles yesterday morning with Captain Baratier, and travelled north in the same train with him. Captain Baratier has received the ribbon of the Legion of Honour.

Addressing a public meeting, held after he had opened the new central block of Aberystwyth University College yesterday, Sir Wm. Harcourt described the present dispute between this country and France, in her present condition, as a position of unexampled difficulty. It was the duty of Britain, therefore, to obtain from vulgar swagger of provocation, and to hope that the Government, while firmly maintaining the national interests, would find a peaceful and honourable solution of the problem with which they were faced.

Mr. Ritchie, President of the Board of Trade, speaking last night at Thornton Heath, insisted that while there was no wish in England to humiliate France, England would not consent to be humiliated. The late French Government was responsible for the difficulty created at Fashoda, and it must extricate itself from that difficulty by the withdrawal of Major Marchand. On this point the British Government was firm in the pursuance of its policy, and he believed it received the united support of both political parties in the State.

The Bishop of London (as chairman) the Bishop of Hereford, the Rev. Dr. Guinness Rogers, the Rev. F. B. Moore, and other gentlemen, spoke last evening at a great meeting held in Exeter Hall to support the Czar's proposal for a stoppage of the growth of armaments. Their addresses were enthusiastic in praise not only of the scheme, but of the Czar and his motives, and several of them contained pleas for courteous treatment of France with reference to the Fashoda dispute. These views were entirely approved by the meeting, which unanimously passed resolutions urging the Emperor to persevere, calling upon the British Government to co-operate with him, and asking the Christian Churches to do their utmost in the cause.

On the Women Workers' Conference being resumed at Norwich yesterday, Miss Gibson read a paper on the proper treatment of epileptic children. Other papers were on the care of deaf mutes and the training of the feeble minded. Miss Soubly and Miss Rendell were amongst the speakers at a young ladies' gathering in the afternoon; and in the evening Lady Laura Kidding presided at a discussion on home work as it affects women and children.

Amongst the distinctions conferred upon the Lord Mayor during his year of office is that of Past Grand Deacon in the Masonic Grand Lodge of England. To celebrate the event, the Lord Mayor last night entertained at dinner at the Mansion House between four and five hundred brethren, most of whom were entitled to wear the purple of the order. The Lord Chancellor and many members of Parliament were present, the provincial brethren being headed by ten of their Grand Masters and the District Grand Master of the Transvaal.

Racing at Newmarket yesterday resulted in a surprise over the Cambridgeshire, George and Diana Forget, both 40 to 1 chances, coming in first and second respectively, and Hawthick, at 50 to 1, third. The Cheveley Stakes were won by Dominie II., the Second Welter by St. Ia, the Maiden Plate by Bishopswood, the Selling Plate by Miss Boney, the New Nursery Plate by Gaiety filly, and the Subscription Stakes by Velasquez.

In the Rugby football championship at Richmond yesterday Kent beat Middlesex in a very lucky manner by one try to nothing. Other Rugby matches yesterday were won by Oxford against Cooper's Hill, and by Cambridge against St. Thomas's Hospital.

On the arrival of a South Western train at Chertsey yesterday, it was noticed that a scuffle had taken place in a second class compartment, and a man who was hurriedly leaving it was detained, but refused to give any account of himself. Another man in the carriage was found to have been seriously ill-treated. Robbery was said to have been the object.

Mr Justice Phillimore yesterday inflicted penalties amounting to 45l. upon a person named Clarke, who had sat and voted on the County Council of Buckinghamshire, he being at the time an undischarged bankrupt.

In the Divorce Division yesterday further evidence was given touching the wife's confessions in the Blake divorce suit. At the close of the hearing Sir Francis Jeune accepted the admissions and pronounced a decree nisi, giving costs against both co-respondents, Mr. Waddell and Mr. Powell.

Dr. John Lloyd Whitmarsh, 58, of Brompton-road, who was charged with the willful murder of Alice Bayly, of Plumstead, by performing an illegal operation on her, was yesterday convicted at the Old Bailey, and sentenced to death by Mr. Justice Bigham, who promised to forward the jury's recommendation to mercy to the proper quarter. It will be remembered that at the first trial of the accused the jury disagreed, and that in the hearing just concluded, he gave evidence on his own behalf under the provisions of the new Act.

While putting forward a claim at the Whitechapel County-Court, yesterday, for damage done to his barrow, a cat's meat man caused much amusement by insisting on the importance of his «profession» to the animals he catered for and on their strong aversion to any but the very freshest and choicest horseflesh. «Them Frenchmen ain't no such fools if they do eat catmeat,» he added.

James Cook and his wife, members of the sect known as the Peculiar People, were convicted yesterday, at the Central Criminal Court, of the manslaughter of their daughter, from whom, in conformity with their religious convictions, they had withheld medical ministrations. Mr. Justice Bigham, in discharging them on their own recognisances to come up for judgment if called upon, begged them to modify their mistaken faith.

At Bath Police-court yesterday, the hearing was resumed of the charge against William Pearson, of Gunnersbury, London, who, trading as «Alexander Baring and Co.'s Co-operative System of Successful Stock Exchange Dealings» in connection with which he promised his clients a profit equal to 520 per cent. on their investments—was alleged to have obtained by fraud, from many persons in different parts of the country, sums ranging from 100l. downwards. The case was adjourned.

At the resumed inquest, yesterday into the death of Mr. Harold Frederic, some remarkable evidence was given by Mrs. Mills, a «Christian Scientist,» who had treated the deceased in accordance with the tenets of her «faith» and now upheld them in court. She denied that medicine could have benefited the deceased, and also that her course of treatment was in any way responsible for his death. The proceedings were again adjourned.

After hearing further evidence as to the death of persons killed in the recent fatal accident at Wrayby Junction on the Great Central Railway, the coroner's jury at Barnet yesterday decided that there was not sufficient evidence to show whether the collision was accidental or not, but they unanimously and emphatically condemned the practice of shunting trains on lines parallel and close to a line on which an express train was signalled to pass.
