#### POLITICAL NOTES.

In the Council of State, on Wed In the Council of State, on Wednesday, Dr E Acevedo made a lengthy speech calling the attention of the Council to the official frauds which he alleged had been perpetrated in connection with the elections in the Departments of Salto, Rio Negro and Tacuarembo He reada quantity of letters, protests, newspaper cuttings and other documents in support of his accusation, and con-cluded by presenting a motion for the appointment of a special Com-mission to investigate the matter. He also asked that the motion should be treated summarily. Sr. Archaga opposed this procedure as irregular, also expressing the opinion that the Council was not qualified to inaugurate political processes. After a rambling speech from Sr. T. Freire, who asserted that the «electoral accord» had destroyed the liberty of suffrage, the motion was negatived by a large majority. The original motion was then referred to the Committee of Legislation. The Municipal Budget was then approved in general, without debate. The Bill for

the formationof Agricultural Statis-tics was approved in general, and in detail in first reading with some amendments. This concluded the

sitting.

The motion of Dr. Acevedo (editor of the Siglo) referred to above, has aroused considerable discussion. The complaints he presented hardly seem sufficient to justify a general charge of electoral fraud against the Government, or to demand so second rious a step as a parliamentary en-quiry. That from Tacuarembo is certainly trivial, and seems limited to the fact that the Prefect and another official had asked certain citizens to use their influence to se izens to use their influence to secure unity among the local «colorados» in favor of the official candidates. As no mention is made of violence or coaction, this can hardly be called fraud. The charges from Rio Negro and Salto are rather more serious, but these also must be discounted considerably as being merely the usual protests of the losers, and as regards Salto, on account of the notorious turbulence and undiscinotorious turbulence and undiscipline of the «colorados» there. The

The nine \*colorado\* members, however, all voted for Dr. Mendilaharzu, who had deserted the \*colorado\* party by refusing his adhesion to its pledged programme.
The \*Siglo\* calls this a \*beautiful triumph\* for the latter. We cannot see where the \*beauty\* comes in.
To usit seems merely an example of bad faith and entire want of party discipline. More than that, it is an unmerited slight to Mr. Mac-Eachen, a man of high character, faithful to his party, one of the principal factors in the present political evolution, and one of the most distinguished men Pays and has yet produced. To make the matter worse, the «colorado» electors, we are told, had given a distinct promise to support Mr. MacEachen, so they thus committed double breach of faith. We suppose the matter is to be explain-ed by the «collectivist» leanings for which Paysandu, like Salto, is notorious. It is hoped to find ano-ther seat for Mr. MacEachen.

A rather serious affair, the de-tails of which are not yet fully known, occurred on Wednesday at Melo, Dept. of Cerro Largo, the news being delayed in reaching the capital owing to some interruption in the telegraph line Some 100 men of the 3rd Cavalry regi-ment stationed there, refused to obey orders, mutinied against their superior officers and, placing themselves under the direction of their sergeants, have marched towards the Brazilian frontier taking their arms with them (they had no horses.) When the officers and the rest of the regiment tried to reduce them to order, they fired on them, killing Lieut. Dalaise and wounding three men. The mo tives for the mutiny are not yet properly understood, but are at present attributed to some internal cause of dissatisfaction and not to any political motive. Beyond the mutiny, it is not said that the men have committed any disorder, and so far their sole aim seems to be to gain the frontier. Seems to be to gain the frontier.
