UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE FUND TO BE INCREASED

London, June 24th

The financial proposal authorizing borrowing powers for the Unemployment Insurance Fund to be increased to £ 115,000,000 has been approved. Government supporters contended that the was necessary as unemployment was not decreasing.

LORD KYLSANT AND AUDITOR COMMITTED FOR TRIAL

London, June 24th

Lord Kysant, the managing director of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company and the auditor. Mr. John Morland, have been ordered to be committed for trial on charges in connection with the alleged fraud concerning the annual reports of the Company. Both were allowed £ 5,000 bail under their own recognisances.

LABOURITES HOLD SEAT IN ARDWICK. BY - ELECTION

London, June 24th

The result of the Ardwick (Manchester) by - election, which was necessitated by the death of the late Labour member, Mr. T. Lowth was won by the Labour candidate Mr. Joseph Henderson with 15,294 votes against the Conservative, S. L. Elborne, with 14,980 votes.

THE JURIDICAL INTERNATIONAL LAW UNION

Paris, June 24th

The Juridical International Union meeting at the Quai d'Orsay have now studied and will proceed with the codification of International Law.

The Chilean jurist, Sr. Alejandro Alvarez, presented a project containing sixty articles outlining the basis for a new law of international

right. This will be studied by a commission which will report on the matter to the Union.

INTERNATIONAL SUGAR COUNCIL MEETING

London, June 24th

Thirty delegates under the Chairmanship of Mr. Powell attended the first meeting of the International Sugar Council and discussed the broad phases of the Chadbourne Plan as it applies to member nations, also the world's surplus carry over, the coming crop and future plantings.

It is understood that they considered methods to combat possible illicit prices imposed by non-members and it is believed the delegates will approach the possibility of securing Russia's cooperation on membership, especially in view of the fact that Russia's 1931 and 1932 crops will be virtually one-third of the combined Europe's and Britain plantings.

Seven nations were represented including the corporations from Cuba, Java, Czechoslovakia, Germany and Poland.

FRENCH SUBMARINE CRUISER TEST

Paris, June 24th

The French super - submarine Surcouf has felt for her plunging and speed test in the Atlantic. She is considered to be the most formidable submarine in the world and is in reality a submergible cruiser, displacing 3,205 tons. compared with the United States largest 2,890 and Great Britain's 2,585.

Her cruising radius is 13,000 miles, with a speed of 12 knots and torpedo capacity of thirty.

ITALIAN WHEAT HARVEST PROSPECTS LESSENER

Rome, June 23rd

The prospects for an abundant crop of wheat have been lessened especially as regards the winter yield on account of the intense heat wave at present sweeping the peninsula. It is now estimated that the crop will be 62,000,000 quintals, instead of 72,000,000 as forecasted in May.

NEXT INTERNATIONAL WOOL CONFERENCE IN SWITZERLAND

Paris, June 23rd

According to an official communication the International wool Federation voted unanimously in favour of the admission of Spain. It was also decided to hold the next International Wool Conference in Switzerland.

A SUPREME COURT HAS JUST MADE A RULING ON TIRES

In a damage suit following an accident caused by the blowout of a worn tire, the State Supreme Court of Washington ruled that a motorist is solely responsible for the condition of his tires.

 with excellent captaincy.

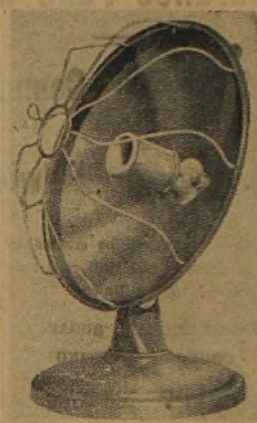

THE FUTURE OF AIR WARFARE

By A. E. Blake

(Continued)

The extent to which high explosive will be superseded by poison gas is not yet determinable with any accuracy, but one may controvert the popular opinion that gas is likely to add substantially to the terrors of aerial bombardment of civilians. Mr. J. B. S. Haldane, in Callinicus, advances as a reason why explosives are more likely to be effective than poison on a town that "houses are far more vulnerable to explosives than earth-works and do far more damage to their occupants in collapse than are inflammable, and "contain far more refuges which are nearly gas-proof", while civilians would be able to evacuate the gassed area.

Mr. Haldane gives the following interesting comparison of the potentialities of high explosive and gas in such circumstances:

On the nights of March 11 to March 14, 1918, just before the great offensive of March 21, the Germans fired 160,000 mustard gas shells into the villages and valleys of the Cambrai salient, an area of about twenty square miles, the same as that of central London. This caused 4,500 casualties, of whom only 50 died (all of them because they took off their respirators too soon). The area was not evacuated. In central London, if the population had had gas masks, the casualties would have been perhaps ten times greater. But we have to compare this hypothetical air raid not with any raid that actually occurred, but with a bombardment of 150,000 high explosive shells or their equivalent in bombs. This would hardly have left a house in central London untouched, and the dead would have been numbered not in hundreds but in tens of thousands. Such an attack would have required the visits on repeated nights of something like 1,000 aeroplanes. Such a number is not yet a practicable possibility. We are, perhaps, inclined to underestimate the potentialities of town-bombing with high explosive and incendiary bombs. In London, for example, there were never too many big fires started at any given time for the fire brigades to deal with. An attack by ten or twenty times as many aeroplanes as ever bombed London simultaneously might well ring round a given area fairly completely with wrecked streets or burning houses, in which case most of the buildings and a good proportion of the inhabitants would perish.

Major Stewart speculates positively on the fighting plane:

The fighting machine of the future will be a very small, all-steel monoplane mounting a 1,000 h. p. gas turbine engine and possibly incorporating a form of jet propulsor. It will have a capacity of 400 m. p. h. on the level and will have a terminal velocity in the dive of 800 m. p. h. In other words, it will be able to travel faster than sound.

The sting carried by this mechanical wasp would, Major Stewart believes, be a gun with a bore smaller than that of the present-day machine gun, would comprise several barrels and would be able to "eject bullets so rapidly that the effect will be a whiplash of lead", which, "when it cracks across the wing of another aeroplane will cut it like butter".

Imagine, then, our fleet of raiders in the year — shall we say, 1950? So great will be the armada — 500, perhaps 1,000 strong, for metal aircraft will be the cheapest form of war-weapon ever evolved — that the element of surprise is unlikely. But the fleet's speed will serve it. If the aircraft are detected

by observation posts an outburst of anti-aircraft artillery may endeavour to embarrass the raiders but this is doubtful owing to the appalling cost of any barrage making a pretence to effectiveness.

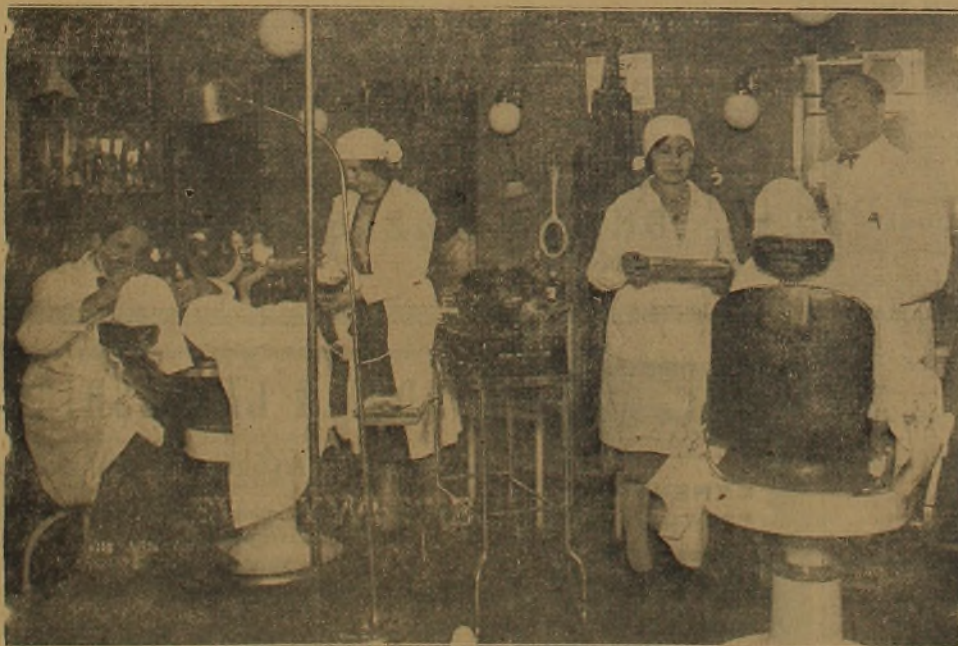
