China to Make Its Own Iron and Steel

Favourable Reaction in Brazilian Commercial Circles

PRESIDENT HOOVER PROPOSES DEBT HOLIDAY

Washington, June 22nd
President Hoover's plan to alleviate the world economic crisis by a one year suspension of the payments of war debts on the condition that the allied powers also suspend their reparations payments from Germany represents the result of the multitude of conferences held at Washington and in foreign capitals.

In August 1922 Mr. Lloyd George proposed that all international debts, which he considered were interfering so seriously with trade be wiped out, but America and France refused.

Hoover's plan is expected to profoundly affect the entire financial settlement of the war which hitherto had been regarded as finally closed for all time by the Young Plan.

CHINA TO MAKE ITS OWN IRON AND STEEL

Peiping, June 22nd
The Chinese Government Economic Bulletin reports plans for China to make its own iron and steel, needed for reconstruction of railways and cities. It is proposed to build a government steel works at Pukow, across the river from Nanking, as a State enterprise.

The Bulletin declares that iron ore abounds in China with adjacent coal deposits. The works will be capable of producing one hundred and fifty thousands tons of steel within three years.

FAVOURABLE REACTION IN BRAZILIAN COMMERCIAL CIRCLES

Rio de Janeiro, June 22nd
The insistent reports that British bankers would meet the Cou-

pon payments of the Sao Paulo exterior loans has produced a favourable reaction both on exchange and in commercial circles.

ITALIAN GRAIN FARMERS LOAN

Rome, June 22nd
The Ministry of Agriculture has announced that the banks have posted a loan of two hundred and seventy million lire to the grain farmers at an interest of five and one half per cent to prevent the hurried sale of the incoming harvest. The banks, upon an appeal from Mussolini, have offered to increase the interest on credits if this be shown to be required by the farmers.

THE LEOPOLDINA TERMINAL COMPANY'S ANNUAL REPORT

London, June 22nd
The Leopoldina Terminal Company's Annual Report shows the net revenue to be £ 25,847. The report states that owing to the Cantareira Company's inability to pay dividend, the Leopoldina have had recourse to £ 40,903, due from the Leopoldina Railway Company, less sinking fund charges, leaving £ 51,957. The net receipts of the combined system are 2,539,121 milreis, which is a decrease of 779,912, milreis.

A TOURISTS ROAD UP MOUNT ETNA

Catania, June 2nd
A road for tourists up the slopes of Mount Etna is projected and tenders are being invited from constructors. The mountain road will be about nineteen kilometres long and eight metres wide and will be available for automobile traffic as it will have a specially prepared surface.

BANK OF THE UNITED STATES DIRECTORS FOUND GUILTY

New York, June 22nd
The jury has brought in a verdict of guilty against Bernard K. Marcus (since deceased), President of the Bank of the United States, its Vice-president and the latter's son, Herbert Singer, who were charged with wilful misapplication of funds. The prisoners have to face the maximum sentence of seven years each, and a fine of five thousand dollars. As regards another defendant, Henry Pollock, also a Vice-President of the bank, the jury disagreed. The charges originated in an eight million dollar transaction which came to light after the bank had closed its doors.

MONTEVIDEO WATERWORKS

At the beginning of this year the ordinary stock of the Montevideo Waterworks Company was quoted at 114, and had been as high as 125, and never below 113 in 1930, and as much as 146, with a lowest of 120 in 1929; but this year the price has been steadily declining, so that it is now only at about 90, although the dividend recently paid was only reduced from 8 per cent. to 6 per cent. The reason for the fall is the heavy decline in the value of the Uruguayan peso, which continues to drop at an alarming rate. Unfortunately, no one seems to be able to give a satisfac-

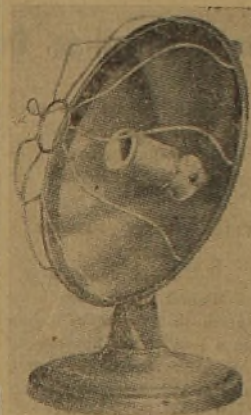

THE FUTURE OF AIR WARFARE

By A. E. Blake

(Continued)

The cause was, of course, to be found in its comparatively imperfect technical development. Indeed, when it is remembered that, at the outbreak of war, the margin of lift of the few aircraft possessed by the British Army was insufficient not only for an effective loan of bombs and machine guns but even for a camera, it is the more surprising that by the end of the war giant aircraft of great range and capable of carrying 3,000 lb. of bombs should have been produced in such quantities and used with such effect.

Nor should the achievements of the Gotha raids be underrated. The opinion is often expressed that the damage done by the raids was not commensurate with the cost to the raiders, in material and personnel, and that the recruiting reaction to this "frightfulness" is sufficient reply to the claim that such invasions affect the people's morale and will to win. This opinion may be based on nothing more than the impression created by war-time counter-propaganda, but a little consideration will demonstrate not only the effectiveness of the German and British raids in the 1914-1918 war but also the potentialities that are suggested by the technical improvements of the last decade.

During the war, England was subjected to 51 airship and 57 aeroplane raids. The resulting casualties comprised 296 soldiers and sailors killed and 521 wounded, and 1,117 civilians killed, 2,886 being wounded; a total of 4,820. Fifty casualties per raid is not, it is agreed, a very significant loss in time of war. Nor was the two million pounds worth of direct damage achieved in the London area a very substantial return for the 300 tons of bombs dropped or the cost of the 13 airships and 128 aeroplanes employed. But these are petty items on the credit side of

the raiders' balance.

To provide a defence against the visitations it was necessary to ring every menaced town with artillery capable of sustaining as nearly as possible an impenetrable barrage of shells to force the raiding aeroplanes to maintain a height at which accuracy of bombing would be impossible, and to equip the defences with countless searchlights, wire 'apron' screens suspended from large and costly balloons, elaborate sound detectors and mobile trolley guns. Aircraft units, too, had to be diverted from the battle fronts. In other words, an enormous expenditure of men and materials had to be made in order to safeguard — and that imperfectly — huge areas against attack by a relatively insignificant force whose strength lay in the ignorance of the defence as to where and when the next blow would fall.

Nor was the creation of a military diversion the sole result. Industrial disorganisation was no less the aim and the achievement of the raiders. Who can estimate the effect on production of the almost sleepless nights spent by so many city dwellers, or of the nervous strain imposed by prolonged bombardment?

It was only necessary for Zeppelins to approach the Cleveland district in thirteen weeks of 1916 to reduce the year's output of pig iron by one-sixth of the normal production. The quality and precision of the work correspondingly deteriorated from the same cause.

All these results were achieved by a mere handful of aircraft, obsolete according to modern standards, unprovided with any means of securing precise result, and ex-

perimenting with a strategy entirely new to warfare. Their engines were not silent, their ceiling comparatively low, and the bombs they carried few in number and of a pattern and power now regarded as primitive. What consequences would follow a raid in one of the wars which, ever and anon, threaten to spread like fire in a powder magazine from any of the dozen potential war centres of Europe to-day? An even more disquieting question would relate to the near future, when the researches now proceeding arrive at fruition.

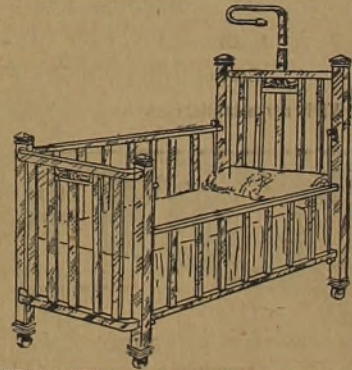

DAILYGRAMS.

In spite of the very severe weather yesterday there was quite a good gathering of parishioners at the Lafone Memorial Hall to meet the Right Rev. Bishop E. F. Every.

The Bishop gave a very interesting account of his visit to the Bolivian, Paraguayan, and Argentine Chaco Missions, recounting some of his experiences in travel and Mission work in those far distant regions.

H. B. M.'s Minister, Mr. R. C. Michell thanked the Bishop for his interesting talk.

Winter seems to have come in like a lion, or rather like a bull in a china shop to judge by the amount of damage caused by Sunday night and yesterday's storm. Sheets of zinc and telephone wires appear to have suffered the most in the city, and today we expect to hear of but a few fortunate people who can communicate by telephone.

In the port the steamer "Uruguay" broke her cables and after considerable work was once more made fast, and the steamers Villa del Cerro and Yaguarí also broke lose. The Argentine motor vessel "Noble Argentino" was blown ashore at Punta Sayago and the lighter "D. K. D. 16" loaded with coal, sank. The lighter Primavera loaded with 2,600 bags of rice was also sunk.

At calles Victoria and Nicaragua a horse pulling a cart was struck by a falling electric cable and instantly killed. The same thing occurred in calle Larrañave. A 40 metre wall of the building belonging to Señores Jaime and Cia. in Av. 8 de Octubre was blown down.

According to information to hand the United States Government has purchased 4,642.72 square metres of land, from Sr. Pedro Etchegaray, situated near the Parque de los Aliados between Av. Dr. Americo Ricaldoni and calle Pedro Campbell, and facing the continuation of Av. 18 de Julio.

BOOKS REVIEWED

The last hull boat has brought us a copy of Dr. C. W. Kimmins book "How a baby is Born". Dr. Kimmins was Chief Inspector of the Education Department of the London County Council and his book gives much desired assistance in conveying reliable information about birth which appears to us to be set forth in an ideal manner.

"The story of How a Baby is Born" is woven into an intensely interesting account of the nature reproduction in plants, fishes, birds, wild and domestic animals. The book will be of value, which it would be difficult to overestimate, to parents, teachers, and to the children themselves. With such a fascinating story, there should be no difficulty whatever in giving to the children a satisfactory account of how they came into existence. The child in possession of such knowledge will no longer be troubled with the atmosphere of mystery and anxiety formerly associated with birth and sex.

We have no doubt that this book fills the requirements of one of the resolutions included in the Lambeth Conference of Bishop report held in London in 1930 and without any reservation we strongly recommend this book and wish it every success.
