NEW ITALIAN SUPER SUBMARINE

Rome, July 10th

The contract for the construction of the largest submarine in the Italian Navy has been awarded to the Tosi shipyards at Taran to, in which three U-boats are being built for Argentina. The submarine, which will be of the mine-laying type, will displace 1,500 tons on the surface and 1,300 under water, is to be equipped with six torpedo tubes and two 125 mm. guns. She will carry forty torpedoes of the most improved type, and have a cruising radius of twelve thousand miles.

The Minister for the Colonies, M. Reynaud, has announced that he is sailing for Indo China early in August charged with the study of communist activities preparatory to the Government decision as to the best means of combating communism in the colonies.

INDIA AND EUROPE

In India, notwithstanding the great difficulties with which we and other British companies have had to cope, we succeeded last year in maintaining our position. It is our confident hope that the time will come when all sections of the Indian community will realize that the best interests of their country lie in the fullest cooperation with the British people.

Taking the fire account as a whole, the depreciation in premiums amounts to 3.6 per cent, and the losses are some £ 5,000 in excess of those for 1929. The profit shown is 6.08 per cent. on our premium income, as compared with 8.29 per cent. in the previous year—a result which in the circumstances must I think, be regarded as gratifying. (Hear, hear).

Mr. Callos and his assistants. At home our accident business gave excellent results, and considerable improvement was shown in the profit earned in the general foreign field.

The total underwriting profit of over £ 87,000 on the accident accounts, taken in the aggregate, has given considerable satisfaction to the board, as I feel sure it will to the members. I would take this opportunity to congratulate our accident manager, Mr. Fallon, and his staff for their labour during the past year.

Taking the fire and accident accounts together the fall in premium income is only 3 per cent. Having regard to the adverse conditions of the year under review we feel that the fact that we have been practically able to maintain our income is a considerable achievement.

MARINE BUSINESS

Our marine figures continue to be satisfactory and our premium income shows a substantial advance on that for 1929. In view, however, of the difficult conditions affecting this section of our operations and of the uncertainty as to

ACCIDENT BUSINESS

I think that the results in the accident field reflect considerable credit on our organization. The premiums have increased by £ 82,500 and an underwriting profit of 6.25 per cent., accrued from the year's working. It is true that the profit earned is slightly less than in 1929, but when we consider that a substantial proportion of our income is derived from casualty business in the United States—a section of business, indeed, which produced an adverse experience for the majority of casualty companies in 1930—I think you will agree that our results are most encouraging. (Hear, hear). Although the Sun Indemnity Company of New York did not maintain the ratio of profit shown in 1929, nevertheless that company did produce a profit, thanks in large measure to the careful handling of

the future, we have deemed it wise to leave all profit in the account and to transfer to profit and loss only the interest on the fund, which stands at £ 648,636. This means that when the provision made for outstanding losses is added there is left in the account a sum equal to 118 per cent. of the year's premium—a figure which should prove considerably more than adequate to provide for all probable contingencies.

PROFIT AND LOSS ACCOUNT

I will now refer to the profit and loss account. You will see that there is brought into that account from the fire, personal accident, employers' liability, burglary and general, and marine accounts a total of £ 375,642, of which £ 137,696 represents interest on the departmental funds, leaving £

237,946 as the under-writing profit of the year.

It is our practice, after providing for incometax, pension requirements, and one or two other items, to add the underwriting profits to our funds and thus year by year to increase the strength and influence of the office. We aim so far as possible at paying our dividends out of the net interest received from investments; that interest for 1930 was £ 251,769, which compares with £ 254,889 for 1929, the reduction being largely accounted for by the increase in incometax. The splitting of the shares last year makes a comparison of the dividend recommended by the board for 1930 with that of 1929 a little difficult, but I may explain that if the shares had not been split the total dividend of 26s. for 1929 would have compared with a dividend of 26s. 8d. for 1930. The final dividend recommended on the existing shares is 1s. 5d. per share, which, added to the interim dividend paid in January last, amounts to a dividend for the year of 2s. 8d. per share. You will notice that the amount required — namely, £ 250,761 — is slightly more than covered by the income from investments.

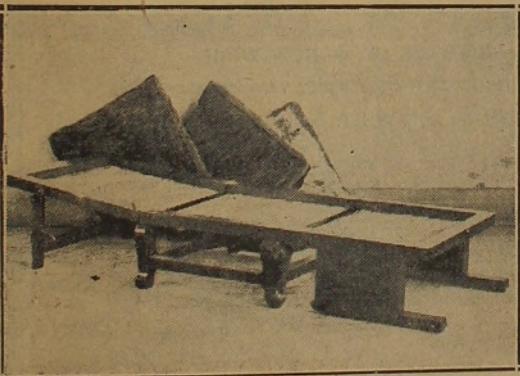

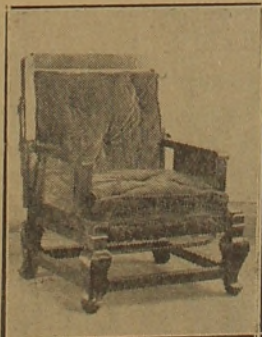
