DELICATE PROBLEMS ARRIVE | GERMAN DISCONTENT DURING ON HOOVER PLAN

Brussels, August 4th Belgium's chief delegate at the Committee of the Hoover plan experts has returned from London consult the Government. He stated that the Committee would resume its labours on the 13th and that negotiations had pro-gressed but Szechoslovakia, Portugal and Greece being unrepre-sented on the Committee certain delicate problems had arisen.

#### THE PACIFICATION OF BURMA

Simla, August 4th

Lord Willingdon has issued a special ordinance for the maintenance of peace in Burma.

The ordinance gives the Government special powers, first, arrest without warrant; second, the seizure of property if necessary for the suppression of rebellion; thirdly, prohibition of the possession of arms and ammunition; fourthly the control of all traffic, communications and literature. The penalties for disobeying orders range from six months to three years.
