## Franco-Italian Naval Conversations to be Renewed

### Mexican Money Exchange Houses Closed

### German Cabinet's Economic Meeting

#### FRANCO-ITALIAN NAVAL CONVERSATIONS TO BE RENEWED

Rome, July 31st

Important Franco-Italian naval developments are expected shortly as soon as France's fears in the German direction are eased, according to well-informed circles.

Italy's last moment delay in forwarding her disarmament memorandum to Geneva, which it is understood is already prepared but still under study, appears to confirm that Italy is waiting a French move to break the naval deadlock.

It is believed that the tone of the Italian memorandum would be materially altered if France reopened naval conversations, because France remains the greatest stumbling block to Mussolini's desire to promote economic recovery through the mutual reduction of armament expenses.

#### MEXICAN EXCHANGE HOUSES CLOSED

Mexico City, July 31st

The Treasury has ordered the closure of all money exchange houses on the ground that their speculations harm the peso exchange value. It is understood that the Government will attempt to fix a more favourable official rate, compelling the banks to adhere to it or refrain from operations.

#### GERMAN CABINET'S ECONOMIC MEETING

Berlin, July 31st

The Cabinet's economic committee met to consider the means of self-help, which it is understood Mr. Stimson and the British statesmen advocated.

The first problem is moving the

harvest, for which purpose the Reichbank has set aside a fund of fifty million marks supplemented by an additional fifty million to enable the cooperatives to buy and store the surplus.

It is understood that the committee are planning to virtually prohibit imports of grain and meat-stuffs, especially restricting the latter in view of the surplus of hogs.

Birkenhead, July 31st

Lord Derby, who christened the South American Exhibition ship said, "I wish for all who sail this ship a safe voyage and a happy return and that it may bring profit and work". Lord Derby also added that the expedition showed that the love of adventure still exists.

#### THE BRAZILIAN WARRANT AGENCY AND FINANCIAL MEETING

London, July 31st

There were several unusual features at the annual meeting of the Brazilian Warrant Agency and Finance Company. The first was the surprise resignation of the chairman, Mr. Walter G. Waldron owing to other pressing duties. The second was the non-adoption of the annual report and accounts and the third the appointment of a committee of shareholders to investigate the affairs of the companies.

#### IS ALL WELL WITH CLUB TENNIS ?

by F. Gordon Lewe

When one thinks of the hundred of affiliated lawn tennis clubs throughout Great Britain one realises the important part they must play in the development of the game.

Clubs are indeed the backbone of tennis and often the only means open to many young players to improve. They therefore should be properly organised.

Conditions in many clubs are certainly better, but there is still room for improvement. I am not thinking so much of famous tennis clubs such as Queen's, Chiswick, Roehampton, Edgbaston, and the Northern Manchester, etc but rather the countless small ones in every part of the country.

Queen's Club has always been one of the great nurseries of the game, not only for amateurs but for professionals as well. The latter start as ball boys, and after learning to play lawn tennis are drafted out to all corners of the globe.

#### SCHOOLS TENNIS

In these democratic times, club tennis has sometimes proved an easier road to Wimbledon than even the Public Schools and Varsityes.

I must, however admit that young players can get all the tennis they want, and more at Cambridge and Oxford but are handicapped by coming from their Public Schools with little or no grounding.

Luckily, some of the headmasters of our big schools, helped by the L. T. A. coaching scheme are at last beginning to look more favourably on lawn tennis than they did.

Perry, Hughes, and Lee all learnt a good deal of their tennis at the London clubs. Perry is proud of this fact and tells us he received his first training at a local Ealing club and then at Herga Harrow.

Afterwards he became a member of Chiswick Park, which by the way, is holding its annual tournament this week. It was at Chiswick that Perry was helped by some of the older members to put the finishing touches on his strokes, especially the backhand.

#### JOB FOR VETERANS

This is when veterans could be tremendously helpful at clubs, and instead of playing among themselves could concentrate more on bringing on the juniors.

Players like Dixen, Graville, Charlton, Crawford, Turnbull, etc. have helped considerably in this direction. Tilden, I suppose, has assisted the young idea more than any other man. There is no better coach than he is.

One of the worst features of club tennis is its cliqueness. A new member has sometimes a difficult job to fix up games and needs a good deal push if he is to get on. The older members are not too keen to give a young player a start until he has proved himself.

A club secretary should look after all new members and see that

they are fixed up with games. This is, of course, done at a club like the West Kensington, where L. A. Godfree, the ex-Davis cup player, helped by his wife, is secretary. This practice should be more general.

At Queen's a member is pretty sure of picking up a game even if he goes there on the off-chance, if not with another member then with one of the many professionals. At a small club things are not so easy, and for that reason I think that during the busy season every club should have its professional. Coaches and trainers can now be had at more reasonable rates.

#### A CLUB NEED

All clubs should have their practice board. Then a member can fill in a spare half-hour by profitably knocking up against it and thereby improving in particular his footwork, backhand, and volleying. Club members are inclined to divide themselves up into groups and to play the same old matches week after week. It would be far better for their tennis if they would mix up with the other members more.

Mixed doubles, I am afraid, are not over-good for club tennis; we play too many "mixed" in England, and they are the least helpful side of the game. Even if courts are limited everyone should have the chance of a short singles before commencing the afternoon's doubles. Singles will consolidate ground strokes as no other department of the game can.

There should be a carefully-planned club fixture list arranged for each season with proper "try-outs" beforehand to get the best

team. Most enjoyable club turns on the lines of cricket could also be arranged. The United Banks, led by Vinal and Metcalf, think nothing of journeying as far as Geneva or Brussels for a match.

#### LADDER TONIC

In Small club tennis there should be a closer observance of the rules. Players, for instance, seem to totally disregard the correct court position and serve double faults galore!

Lastly, let me recommend the club ladder, when the man below can challenge the man above. This ladder acts as a fine stimulant and increases friendly rivalry among its members.

WHAT FANCE THINKS

This tendency is sometimes attributed to the Teutonic blood in our veins, to some supposed congenital incapacity to share or understand Latin civilisation. But is not the difficulty rather that our retrospective view of the war is so much nearer to that of Germany than to that of France? We many than to that of France? We have more in common with the German who regards the war as a tragic blunder and an unmitigated disaster than with the Frenchman who hails it as a glorious victory. Nor is the attitude of France shared by the other great nations. In the United States there is some echo of French satisfaction with existing conditions; but it is not satisfaction with the results of the war. There are still a few Americans who like to remind us that they won the war "for the allies"; but there is no thought of the war as a victory for America. On the contrary, the war has left America an uneasy sense of European entanglements, risked or incurred; the debt payments of the allies are causing, perhaps, some slight pang of conscience; and the hoards of gold received from Europe have certainly produced severe financial indigestion. Even Italy, though she has gained much from the war, remains dissatisfied and ill at ease, and feels that her rightful place in the sun is still denied her. In looking back with complete complacency on the issue of the war, France stands alone.

This singularity of outlook is reflected in many branches of French life. Much was written in England during the war, and in Germany just after it, of the return of the people to religion and to the churches. In most cases the wish was probably father to the thought; and neither in England nor in Germany have these

prognostications been fulfilled. In France, there was less talk of religion; but the return to the church has occurred, and has been one of the most remarkable phenomena of French life in the last fifteen years. At the beginning of the present century it was scarcely possible in France for a devout Catholic to occupy any important post in official life; and a Catholic savant or a Catholic intellectual would have seemed almost a contradiction in terms. The tide of anti-clericalism may be said to have reached its height immediately after the Dreyfus affair; and the ebb had set in during the decade before the war. There was still little relaxation of tension between church and state; but in literature the Catholic poet Claudel had already begun to enjoy a national reputation. The war gave a sudden and violent impulse to the incipient Catholic revival, and carried it to triumph. A hardy infidel like Clemenceau was compelled by public opinion to attend an official service at Notre Dame; and probably half the leading men of letters and learning in France to-day are Catholics. The growth of religion among the masses during the same period has been less marked; for the masses had been infected far less than the intellectuals by the anti-clericalism of the preceding generation, and there was less ground to be recovered. But there is no doubt that, in every stratum of society, the church in France has immensely strengthened its position since the war.

What is the explanation of this remarkable change of heart, so directly opposed to the tendencies prevailing during the same period in nearly every other quarter of

the civilised world? We have heard of primitive tribes who beat their breasts in the hour of defeat, and worship them when they return victorious from a battle. It would be unkind to press the parallel. But human nature is in some of its manifestations wonderfully constant; and there is no doubt that, just as the violent wave of irreligion and anti-clericalism in France followed the humiliation of 1870, so the return to religion has been the sequel of the victory of 1918. It was difficult for a proud nation suddenly reduced to the rank of a second-class power, to retain its belief in a just and omnipotent Deity; but the return to the faith was immensely facilitated when, nearly fifty years later, a full measure of justice pressed down and running over was meted out to the oppressor.

The return to Rome was particularly easy in France, where the church had always had a nationalist flavour and had, from time immemorial, been identified with the vicissitudes of French political prestige.

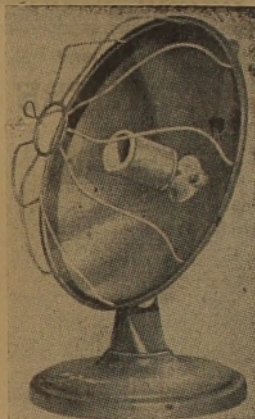

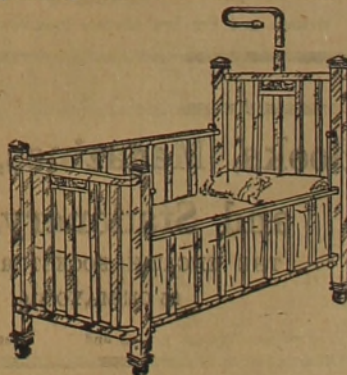

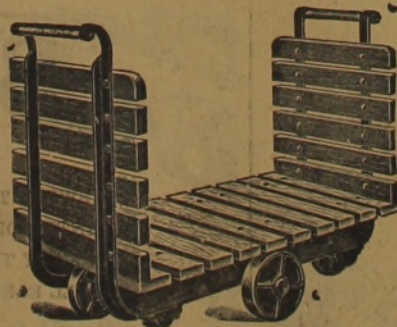
