THE RETURN TO CONVERSION.

Last week we referred to some paragraphs appearing in certain of our contemporaries conveying the as-surance that the reconversion of the National Bank notes would certainly commence within the limit assigned by the law, namely January 7, 1891. These paragraphs were rather vague and rather mysterious, therefore we paid no great attention to them, but since then we have been making some enquiries and find that they have more foundation than was at first suspected. In fact, we have it on good authority (financial and political) that the return to conversion on that date is highly probable and almost certain. The difficulties in the way are not so great as they at first sight appear, and we hope in a few days to be able to prove this, and to show the manner in which the conversion may be resumed, by means of figures and facts which have already been laid before us, but which we are not at liberty to make use of just now. And although we are aware that the balance of belief is largely against the return, the idea that it will take place is slowly gaining ground in well-informed circles. At the same time, although such a fulfilment of its pledges will redeem in a great measure the drooping credit of the Government, the return to conversion will in reality only relieve the market to the extent of about a million dollars, and a great deel more will have to be done before the National Bank can be reinstated or the crisis onsidered stemmed.

We may further add that rumours have reached us from a very trustworthy source of an important ne-gotiation the President has in hand, involving \$5,000,000, the details of which are at present carefully guarded, but which is intended as a pleasant New Year's surprise for the country. This, added to the con-version above mentioned, will certainly help to place matters on a greatly improved footing.

Many of our readers will regret to learn of the death of Captain James Lawrence Morse, which occurred at Fray Bentos on the 28th ultimo. The B. A. Herald speaks of himas follows. «Capt. ### New-York, Nov. 2.

The official announcement on Saturday of the results of the new census shows that the total population, 62,480,540, is three millions less than Was generally expected. It shows, however, an increase of over 12,000,000 during the last decade, or about 24 1/2 per cent. For the preceding decade, as shown by the census of 1880, there was over 30 per cent. increase. The census officials say that the apparent falling off in the rate of increase, is due to errors in the census of the errors in the census of 1860, which exaggerated the population of the Southern States. Expert criticism is not satisfied with this explanation, and the confidence in the accuracy of the new census is far from general, as the complete recount tiken by the police of this city, after the Government count, showed a total nearly 200,000 larger, making the population of the city over 1,800,000 instead of 1,650,000, the new census total. Similar recounts in other localities have shown like results.




