Parliament.
In the Chamber of Senators, on Monday, a message was received from the Executive Power, containing a proposition of Don José Joaquín Gómez dos Santos, in representation of himself and of Sr. E. M. Topin and E. do Guimarães Beaujean, for the establishment of a factory of thread, cotton, woolen, silk and other stuffs. This was passed to the other Chamber.

The reports of the Committee of Finance on the schemes for the reorganisation of the National Bank were distributed, also the report of the scheme of Poritt Walker and Co. for port works at Maldonado.

The Bill authorising the E. P. to adhere to the protocol celebrated by the Argentine and Brazilian Governments for the distribution of medals commemorative of the Paraguayan War, was then put in discussion, and after a very short debate was approved in general and in detail.

The sitting then concluded.

—La Nacion, the solitary government organ, is of the opinion that the country is greatly to be congratulated on the result of Sunday's elections, and on the fact that, with one small exception, they were carried out in perfect order. But when the Nacion congratulates, the country generally mourns.

—Msr. Mariano Soler, Bishop elect of Montevideo, will shortly leave for Rome on business connected with his prelate. It is noteworthy that the appointment of this priest has been received with absolute silence by all the papers except *El Bien*, the position of the latter compelling it to take notice.

—Official telegrams have confirmed the statement that the election in Rosario last Sunday was accompanied by a conflict in which two persons were killed and three or four others wounded. The opposition candidate came out at the head of the poll by a large majority, and had to telegraph to the President for protection as his life was threatened. The President has ordered the usual «official enquiry», but against whom does not appear as at present no one seems exactly to blame. No news of disorder has arrived from any other quarter.

—We cannot agree with some of our contemporaries who think it wise to suppress all notices of suicides, but at the same time we think that the other extreme is taken by some of them in publishing as was done yesterday, the farewell letters written by a suicide to his relations or friends. This having bare of private matter serves no useful purpose and only gratifies a morbid curiosity which were better left unsatisfied.

—Men who would solve the problems of the universe should remember that we can only see one half of a sphere at once. The fellow on the other side may be all right from his point of view.

—Rumours are again current about changes in the Cabinet, especially with regard to the Minister of Finance. So far they are not sufficient to warrant being worth repeating. Constant rumours are just as much a sign of crisis as a cough is of consumption.

—Yesterday's papers were very dull and melancholy. They could find nothing to talk about except the elections, and that was not at all a cheerful subject, always excepting for the Nacion. Even the telegrams failed to give one item of interest, although the Galveston line has resumed transmission.

—With regard to the Athletic Sports, we are requested to announce that competitors can obtain entrance tickets and programmes by applying to the Honorary Secretary, Mr. O. Scoones, Misiones 134 (altos).

—The Cathedral clock, which serves as a regulator for many people, has been very much out of order lately, and cannot be depended upon. Yesterday morning it was fully half an hour slow, and its incorrectness seems to vary from hour to hour.

Fresh rumours are afloat of a ministerial crisis, the resignations of Drs. Lopez, Costa and Carballido being momentarily expected. There is some hope, however, that matters may be smoothed over.

A well known merchant has been arrested on accusation of largely defrauding the Custom House.

A conflict took place in the elections at Puan. A citizen and two policemen were killed and four persons wounded.

So far seven failures have occurred in the liquidation on the Bolsa.

Gold is sold in the exchange shops at 300 to 510.

The new torpedo boat «Barchardo» has arrived from Glasgow and gone to the Figue.

A strike has broken out amongst the hackney coach drivers, greatly interfering with traffic.

Great heat prevails.

LONDON NOTES

London, Nov. 1.
Last Wednesday evening, the White Star steamer *Tentonic* left the Mersey for New York, leaving on board Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Stanley and party. Since Mr. Stanley's arrival in Liverpool he and his party had been the guests of Mr. T. H. Ismay, one of the managers of the White Star Line, at his Chelsea residence. Mr. Stanley did not visit Liverpool yesterday, but went on board the

Tentonic by a special tender from the Woodside landing-stage. This prevented any demonstration which might have taken place had Mr. Stanley gone in the ordinary tender. The *Tentonic* left the river about ten o'clock, many of Mr. Stanley's friends going on board the steamer to bid him farewell. Mrs. Tennant, Mrs. Stanley's mother, is of the party, as well as Mr. A. J. Montney Jephson and Mr. Burdett-Connors, M. P. There were also on board Prince and Princess Ruspoli, Madame la Marquise de Talleyrand-Périgord, Lady Arthur Wellesley, the Hon. J. W. Mansfield, General J. H. Wilson, the Hon. George Hoadley (ex-Governor of Orléans), W. D. Sloane and family, and Mr. D. Mills.

It is very well to dismiss Theosophy as a mere «theological dilettantism.» The Calcutta Psycho-Religious Society has discovered in the Yoghí Shashtra some maxims for the conservation of the human body which, if they are well founded, are undoubtedly of considerable importance. One is to the effect that «the who can by inserting old cotton make the breath flow through the left nostril by day and through right nostril by night successively for twelve years shall enjoy health and youth up to a great old age, and shall not be affected by any poison.» The directions are somewhat difficult to understand. The complete theosophic cure for «depression of spirits» and many minor troubles is to «take in pure air by the tongue like a serpent.» Unfortunately, the operation seems difficult. Then inhaling «by the lips, putting them in the form of the bill of a bird» is, we are assured by this ancient book of wisdom, a sure means of increasing the appetite and improving the power of seeing and hearing.

Representatives of the Jewish community in England waited upon Cardinal Manning at Westminster on Thursday and presented him with an address expressive of the regard in which their race held him by reason of his special and signal services to them. The Cardinal, in reply, reciprocated their kindly feelings. He rejoiced that Jews shared in the strength of the British Empire, and added to it. Unhappily the same could not be said of other lands. But both the cause and the remedy were in the hands of those who declaimed against the Jewish race.

The so-called miracle at the Styrian village of Luttenberg, recently reported, has already led to disturbances and bloodshed. A few days ago four thousand people were assembled in the forest, and crowded near the tree in which the Virgin Mary is supposed to appear twice a day to little Aloisio Trabl. As the crowd was very disorderly, policemen, who in the country carry rifles, ordered the child to go away. She complied, and went into the village church, not far from the wood. The people then took a threatening attitude towards the policemen, and asked to see the child and witness the miracle without their interference. A man trod on one of the policeman's feet, and shook his fists at him. The policeman, alarmed by the attitude of the crowd, and two men fell—one killed and the other mortally wounded. A large number of gendarmes were sent to the spot. The clergy have nothing to do with the miracle, and have even advised the people to stay at home.

A system of «voluntary patients» that is of allowing persons whose mental condition is not such as to warrant the granting of certificates of insanity to enter lunatic asylums of their own free will—is found to work well in Scotland. Such sufferers are not registered as lunatics nor is there any power to detain them for more than three days after they give notice of a desire to leave. During last year the total number of these persons admitted was seventy-six, which shows a large increase upon the average of the last ten years. The Commissioners in Lunacy for Scotland state that at the visits of the Medical Commissioners all such patients are seen, and where there is any reason to believe that they fail in any respect to understand the conditions of their residence, it is the custom to explain these matters to them. In no instance has it ever been found that the nature of the position of a voluntary patient has been intentionally concealed from him. On the whole, the Commissioners declare their opinion that the voluntary patient system is a useful provision of the law.

According to a correspondent of *The Grants*, the really important question of the day is not whether women, but whether undergraduates «should woo.» Twenty years ago, we are assured, an engaged undergraduate was at Cambridge as rare as a white blackbird; but now their ranks are being constantly thinned by the subtle fascinations of the other sex, and there is no knowing whom may be the first to go. As examples, *The Grants*' correspondent cites the case of a friend who, while at Trinity, secured an eighty pound classical scholarship. His character was «a singularly beautiful one» but one Easter vacation he went and spent a fortnight in a country house. When he returned there was a marked change. Instead of poring over classics he was always writing on scented

note-paper. Voluminous letters, addressed in a girlish hand, were seen to be delivered to him by the porter. Then it came out, and so did he—a low third in Mays.—He is still up and lives on the thought of being married next June. Another was up in May last for his Theological Special, Love, conveyed in mathematical formulae, was his ruin.—«If Ethel», he wrote, «is my sister's friend, and if I am my sister's friend, which I am—then, by Euclid I, 30, Ethel must be my friend.» This was a young man who lived up to his belief. One examination day he was seen with a young lady, believed to be Ethel, in a boat at two in the afternoon. In the most important paper he had stayed in thirty-five minutes. Of course he was ploughed.

An American story-writer, Mary E. Bryan, is said to have been under contract for the last three years to write a novel every three months. She has so far fulfilled her engagement, and has besides found time to give orders concerning the management of a farm owned by her in Georgia.

VITAL STATISTICS.

The mean lifetime in England is forty-one years, but in the healthiest districts it is forty-nine years, the latter implying an annual rate of increase of 2.041. An increase of the years men live involves a decrease of the annual mortality, but not necessarily an increase of population, for the birth-rate may fall to an equivalent extent. The Egyptians and Greeks discovered that there was an average interval of 100 years between the births of children and the births of their grandfathers, that is 33 1/3 years between the birth of a son and the birth of his father, and at present the interval from generation to generation, from the birth of the parents to the birth of the children, may be thirty years, early marriages producing a generation every twenty-six years, and late marriages every thirty-six years. More women are married than men, but the women are married at an earlier age, and it is by reason of remarriages that the absolute number of women who marry is greater than the absolute number of men in the proportion of 1,048 to 1,000. By re-marriages about 100 women marry 108 men, and 100 men 113 women. The mean age at which women marry is 24.3 years, and according to the census returns the women living at that age were 4,180 more numerous than the women living at the later mean age 25 1/2 years, at which men marry, which is a curious illustration of law regulating social combination.—*Provincial Medical Journal.*

A REMARKABLE RAILWAY.

The most remarkable short line of railway in the world is probably the submerged railway at Onton, near Bilbao. It runs down an evenly sloping shore in double line to a distance of 650 feet, and has been constructed by a Spanish engineer for the sole purpose of facilitating the shipment of iron ores. The only car is a massive iron tower on wheels, in the shape of a pyramid, rising 70 feet from the track. Upon the platform of this tower the ores are placed, and thus they are conveyed to the vessel; the pyramidal car, whose wheels are always under water, returning automatically as soon as its cargo has been mechanically shot into the ship's hold.—*English Mechanic.*

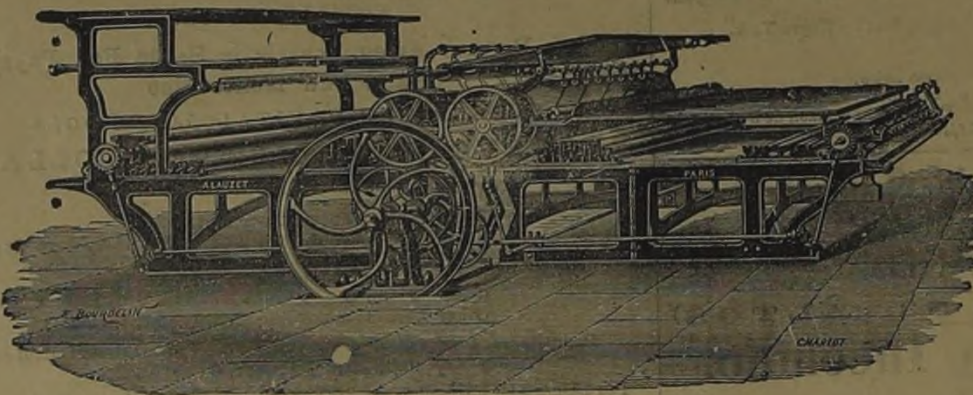
