KILLING THE PORT.

Absorbed as we have been of late we have been rather neglectful of others questiens of great interest. Foremost amongst these stands the natter of the pore, which deeply concerns not only commerce here, but those abroad who have commercial or shipping relations with this

Whilst the Government, instead of endeavouring to ioster and assist noise commerce and industry by by lightening the excessive taxation under which they labour, has been following the following the very reverse policy, with most obviously mischievous results, much the same fatal course has been observed with regard to the snipping trade which is of such vital importance not merely to the

capi al, but to the whole republic.

The city of Montevideo, with its advantageous situation and its fine natural harbour, only awaiting a little assistance from the art of man to become one of the finest in the world, should be essentially maritime, being the natural port for the large region north of the River Plate, and superior to any other port in that river. But instead of taking advantage of this, and encouraging maritime movement and shipping trade, the tendency of late, both officially and privately, has been to drive trade away by much the same means as those employed by the Government to crush internal industry. Those means may be summed up in the phrases, excessive fees, charges, light dues, and the extortions made under pretext of salvage.

For the present we cannot enter into the details of these, but we feel justified in making the assurance that there are few ports in the whole world where they are higher, nd that they are slowly but surely

killing the trade of the port.

A very large proportion of this trade has hi herto been conducted under the English flag; and we have it on high maritime authority that this matter of excessive charges has attracted great attention in shipping attracted great attention in sinpping circles at home, so much so that not only is it contemplated to double the treights, but that some shipping firms have issued positive orders to the masters of their vessels to avoid this port at all costs, even when in

As already said, it is not merely that the port fees and light dues are excessive, but that the amounts claimed for assistance rendered to claimed for assistance reintered to vessels in distress are most extortionate. The philosophy of proverbs is something more than the philosophy of sold wives's sayings by their fire-side. It is true a large number of po-pular aphorisms suggest the doc-trines or Martin Tupper rather than those of Mr. Herbert Spencer, but many of them enclose a kernel of trush folicitously conveyed in a definite shape. The best of them are almost as old as the hills, and enjoy a kindred power of resisting the mouldering touch of time. They have survived and lived in the memory of men because they were fragments of of cold wives's sayings by their fire men because they were fragments of human wisdom. The proverb is a reliq of the age that preceded print-ing, when practical knowledge was handed down from father to son on the stream of oraltradition. It became the property of the household, whence it, perhaps, derived the quaint homespun character which made it, in the any personal damage.

The last is of Italian origin, a language, like the Spanish, rich in witty aphorisms. The spice of malice in it is charming, and the circumstance which gave it utterance is obvious. Modiseval Italy was a country divided against itself, when city fought city, and bands of foreign mercenaries were a constant nuisance when they were not engaged to cut throats by wealthy citizens who preferred to fight their battles by proxy and pay for them at probably the lowest market price. Perhaps when some hireling grumbled at his wage the proverb was shot at at him from the thin lips of a quick-brained Florentine. Its aptness and malice made it live. But it is quaint humour rather than condensed quaint humour rather than condensed wisdom that gives proverbs a charm peculiarly their own. And for this we must for the most part go abroad. Those of Spain are of on remarkable in addition for their dignity and poetry; and of such there are many immortalised in the month of Sancho Panza by Cervantes. The resemblance of certain proverbs in different nations is either a striking instance of the identity of the human mind, similar ideas finding similar expression, or is proof of the influence of Eastern thought on Western culture. The same proverh is some imes found in English, Italian Spanish, Latin, and Greek. Most of these may be traced to an Asiatio origin. We speak of carrying coals to Newcastle, the Jews of taking oil to the City of Olives, the Persians of taking pepper to Hindustan. The same idea of casting ridicule on an act of absurdity seems widely spread all over the world, like some of the oldest jests of Joe Miller, which rival the everlastexpression, or is proof of the influence Joe Miller, which rival the everlasting hills in powers of endurance. The bast proverbs are often exquisite strokes of genius, of which the author is humanity; the worst are the wisdom of bores and wiseacres.

PROTECTION IN MEXICO.

Referring to the very high protec-tive tariff in Mexico, the British Consul at Vera Cruz in his last report observes that the working of protec-tion is much more detrimental to the consumer in that country than in most others, for the duties are most extravagant, and the retailer naturally calculates his profits on the duties as well as on the price of the goods he sells. In some branches of trade the retailer adds the duties to trade the retailer adds the duties to the cost and then doubles the result to form the retail price, so that the consumer has to pay four times the simple value of the goods; and even for British cotton goods the consumer has to pay at least three times the actual value in England. It may safely be said that the 10,000,000 or 12,000,000 Indians in the Republic, who clother themselves chiefly in who clothe themselves chiefly in cotton goods, pay four times the value of their clothing, and consume less than a third of what they ought least able to bear it; whilst at the same time the Treasury is impoverished in order to enrich a very limited class, composed largely of foreigners who make large fortunes by fostering, who make large fortunes by fostering, as they claim, the native industry of the country. The commonest soap is taxed 150 per cent, advolorem. A small consignment of Pearss, unscented soap paid duties at the rate of 243 per cent. advalorem. For a cleanly people like the Mexicans soap is, of course, a pecassity, yet, much, is the people like the Mexicans soap is, of course, a necessity, yet such is the feeing in favour of protection that the import is taxed nearly 2 112 times its value. The average duty on dutiable goods of British origin is 121 per cent cottons pay 183, woollens 118, linens 103, glass 205, iron and steel 95 per cent; and so on for many other important articles.—

BONUSES FOR LARGE FAMILIES

THE UNITED STATES?

The fact that the total population of the United States has tallen below the popular estimate of 64,000,000 is likely to call attention to the fecundity of American women. Not long ago a sensational newspaper took a census of the children in certain fashionable quarters of this city, and brought to light the fact that comparatively few children gladdened the spacious homes of afurray Hill, and that the birth-rate here was alarmingly low. The last State census of Massachusettes brings out some interesting facts in relation to the percentage of married women having no children, which may set some of the hasty critics of the census tanking. We find that one-fifth of the navive married women of Massachusetts are childless. It is said that in no country save France can a similar condition of affairs be found. On the other hand, instead of over 20 per cent. only 13.27 per cent. of the foreign-born married women of of Massachusetts are childless. What is true of this State is undoubtedly in a greater or less degree, true throughout the country. The time has come when we must face the fact that the increase of population by birth is decreasing—that the tendency of the times among well-to-do Americans is to small tamilies, and that one-fifth of our native married women are childless.—New York Press.


