THE IMPROBABILITY OF A LOAN.

The Government schemes for the reorganisation of the National Bank, approved by the Chambers and signed by the Executive, but still awaiting the final sanction of the shareholders, are based, as we have frequently mentioned, on the realisa-tion of a loan of \$14,000,000, and it is semi-officially stated that the once prominent capitalist Mr. Edward Casey has gone to England bearing powers to negotiate for the said

In our opinion the realisation of this loan is exceedingly improbable, reasons for that belief .-

1. The English market is at present very unfavourable to a Uruguayan loan for any purpose whatever.

The Unified Debt, which takes natural precedence of all other Uruguayan loans is quoted at half its nominal value, while other Uruguayan invastments are greatly depressing the property of the present of th an investments are greatly depress-ed and are looked upon with distrust by investors. It is no exaggeration to say that strong fears have been and still are entertained as to the punc-tual payment by the Government of its obligations. These fears may be right or wrong, but there they are, and under such circumstances what chance would there be for a new

As recently shown, the public debt of the Republic is, roughly, a hundred million dollars, an enormous ipher for so small a country,-but one that might be met without fear one that might be met without fear were the country soundly adminis-teredand properly developed—which, just now, it certainly is not. A very large proportion of this debt is in the hands of English capitalists and investors, and consequently these keep a close watch on the march of events in this Republic. Now, how-ever anxious they may be, in their own interests, to see the Republic advance and to help her to do so, it must be frankly owned that the pre-sent situation is not one to inspire them with confidence or to encourage hem to lend further assistance. For abstract politics they care not a jot,it is nothing to them which party is in or which is out, but it does concern them to see at the head of affairs a Government which has completely alienated itself from public support; which has promoted waste and extravagance when economy was most urgently needed; which burdens the country with wholesale promotions and unnecessary extra deputies; which insists on maintaining a standing army the expenses of which are out of all proportion to the population; which not only has not consummated one single work of public utility or one measure tending to develop the magnificent resources of the country, but, by the imposition of fresh and ponderous taxes and imposts has done its best to check commerce and crush growing industries; and which the tighty pages all good counsel. ponderous taxes and imposts has done its best to check commerce and crush growing industries; and which obstinably resists all good counsel on certain national industries was proprietor in joint-stock banks. I

towards amending its ways. English investors are neither blind nor foolish, and, despite all efforts to hoodwink them, can see the true state of things as plainly as we do here. Therefore, they are not likely to be beguiled into a fresh loan.

2. There is no sympathy with the purpose of this loan. The National Bank—national in

nothing but name—is not an institution that is looked upon with general favour. The private interests of the Government, of some of its founders Government, of some of its founders to whom it has served as a convenient cloak for all manner of nefarious transactions, of certain unscrupulous capitalists who have used it as a doubtful means to still more doubtful ends, and of some of the shareholders, doubtless demand its reorganisation. Moreover its liquidation would be inconvenient, as it would necessitate the washing of would necessitate the washing of much dirty linen now hidden away in dark corners. But the true friends of the country, and most independ ent investors, would far sooner see it disappear. They do not recognise it as having done any real service to the country or commerce, they do recognise it as having fostered spe-culation and being responsible for a great deal of positive harm. They see a strong element of danger in its continuance, and whatever their opinion of the credit of the State, least of all do they wish to see that credit pledged for the support of an institution with such antecedents. English investors have a not un-

keep apart from banking. They look upon all state or National Banks with suspicion, and especially on such a one as this.

As regards the State, the result of the more recent loans has not been satisfactory, for it is notorious that the proceeds have been diverted into improper channels, and that the state of affairs which the loans were supposed to mend, are now even worse than before. As regards the Bank, whilst enjoying exceptional advantages and privileges, it has already completely dissipated and squandered its primary capital, and there is no guarantee whatever that any additional capital will not follow the same course, the more especially now that there is no longer any confidence in the Bank. The record

of its past administration is not such as to inspire any trust for the future, so long as its managethe future, so long as its manage-ment remains in the same or similar hands, and so long as the Government has the power of in-terference. If the Directorate were removed to London, confidence might be gradually restored, but for many reasons that is about the last thing to which the Government will

4. The choice the Government has

made of a financial agent is in itself sufficient to bar all hope of a loan. Mr. Casey (we speak only of his public character) is well known to factors in the forced sbooms and policy of inflation, iniciated by Dr. Reus, and carried out with such disastrous consequences to every one concerned. Investors both here and in England have a long score to settle with him which is not yet wiped out. The credit of the whole country has been materially damaged through his schemes. Remembering this, and remembering the condition of the National Company and other affairs of which he has been at his head, it is impossible to imagine a person in whom less confidence will be placed. or could be recommended. The sending of him to Europe as a financial agent will, therefore, not only be fatal to the success of his enterprise, even if it were wholesome in itself, but will astach further discredit to the Government for having selected the Government for having selected. and associated itself with such a commissioner. We can only explain the selection on the grounds that no other person would undertake the

If these four reasons, as set forth above, are not sufficiently powerful to show the excreme improbability of realising the loan, there will be no

difficulty in producing others.

And by way of conclusion we may add that we do not regret this improbability in the least. On the constary speaking in the true interests of the country, we boldly declare that it were far better that the loan should not be realized that the loan should not be realised, that the Government should be taught to depend on the internal resources of the country, and that the National Bank should either beliquidated orelse left to resuscitate itself as best it may. And we strongly advise English investors to have nothing whatever to do with the
