A Growl from the Camp. (From an occasional Correspondent.)

Rural matters north of the Rio Negro, and I suppose they are more or less the same south of it also are bad, prices of all kinds are low except wool, and, I fear, declining. SUNDRIES.

Though little noticed now, today is really one of the most important anniversaries in English history. The execution of King Charles I by the subjects whom he had betrayed, and robbed, hardly less than the signing of Magna Charta by King John, was a leading step to the building up of the great English constitution and the assertion of the present liberty enjoyed by British subjects.

The Cosmos Club at Buenos Aires is to be broken up after an existence of some nine or ten years, the longest life, if we are not mistaken, attained by any English Club there. It had got so heavily into debt that the members could not see their way to carry it on.

The members of the musical society "La Lira" meet at 8.30 this evening to receive accounts for the past year, and to elect a new Committee.

The rain of Wednesday appears to have been general throughout the Republic. It was much wanted, as all parts were complaining of drought, and the pasture was very poor.

The management of the Gounthion Baths warns the public against purchasing tickets in the street, as it has been discovered that a number of forged tickets are in circulation.

The Epoch, apparently tired of the daily repetition of the same phrase, says that it intends having a "blocks" stereotyped with the paragraph "Nothing new about the Ministry, etc." for permanent insertion. We entertained a similar idea ourselves.

Our camp contributor whose "growl" we published to-day says he has not favoured us recently because estancieros have little heart for writing this year as up to date they can merely chronicle disasters so far as they are concerned. It is to be hoped that the ill-luck of which he complains has not been so general as he thinks.

President Herrera has accepted the Honorary Presidency of the Committee for the reception of the remains of General Panero, sharing that post with Dr. Eduardo Moreno (Argentine Minister here).

As Carnival this year is little likely to be more than a ghastly mockery, it would be a very sensible plan to cut off one of the two holidays, and let us have an extra holiday in September or October, when there are only too few in its place. We recommend this suggestion to the authorities.

There is some sense left in the River Plate, after all. The Com-

mittee named by the Municipality to superintend the Carnival fetes has declined the honour, and advises the Mayor to employ the sum assigned for decorations and illuminations in paying the four months arrears of salary due to the pavones. At least, that is the tale that reaches us from Buenos Aires. We hope no one thought it referred to this city.

Gold closed yesterday at 135 1/2, according to which the paper dollar is worth 73.9 cents.

Ernest's grandfather is a doctor, and had been for some time treating a patient for St. Vitus's dance. Ernest had soon the sufferer from the strange nervous disease, and felt much sympathy for him. The other day he hurried from his grandfather's office to his mother's room to say, "O mamma, mamma, here's another poor little boy who has the—the—I can almost think of the name—the St. Patrick's jump!"

There will be more masked balls at the Cibils Theatre, on Saturday and Sunday evenings.

Government has issued stringent orders to the frontier authorities to be on the guard against smuggling, chiefly in tobacco. Thanks to the new duties the temptation to smuggle will be greater than ever.

The old cause of bad food caused a disturbance in the Com. Misaria of the 2nd section, on Wednesday, and we hear that classes were freely used. If the men are not properly fed, they naturally become discontented, and no one can blame them for it.

Colonel Muró, Chief of Police of the Capital, has applied for leave of absence from his post for 15 days. It is whispered that he wishes to avoid the festivities of Carnival.

Buenos Aires. The Chamber of Deputies held its closing session on Monday evening and rejected all the amendments of the Senate in the tax bill except those that were accepted in the previous session. The tax on Bank profits is therefore fixed at 10 per cent, the excise duty on alcohol is fixed at seven cents per litre and the tax on live cattle is rejected.

At a meeting of the members of the Cosmos English Club on Monday evening it was resolved to liquidate the affairs of the Club, Messrs. Mackinlay and Zimmermann have been instructed to sell all the furniture and effects of the Club on Wednesday next. From a circular which was issued by the Committee, it appears that the expenditure of the Club has recently exceeded its receipts by \$800 a month, and its liabilities exceed the estimated value of its assets by about \$8000. The Committee proposed to raise the entrance fee to \$200 and the annual subscription of \$120, and to make a special call for getting rid of the debt, but the members appear to have preferred a winding-up.

The Argentine North Western Railway will be 700 kilometers in length, of which 350 have been constructed; there are 2500 men at work on the line, and the total quantity of earth excavated is 6,700,000 cubic metres.

Colonel Fontana, Governor of Chubut, has informed the Minister of Finance that eight Welshmen have just returned from an exploring expedition, bringing with them a small bag full of gold dust, the largest piece being of the size of an almond. The locality where the gold was found is not mentioned.

On Monday, some men engaged in marking an excavation for the Madero Port, at a square to the left of the Catalinas mole, came upon the remains of an old ship apparently a man of war; a portion of it about 25 metres in length was cleared of sand, from which two iron guns were extracted; they are about 1 1/2 metres in length and one bears the date of 1781 and the other a dual crown, with the letter P. and the number 6322. Several cannon balls for those guns and about 100 of a much larger size were also found. Orders have been given carefully to clear away the sand from the whole of the ship.

As affording confirmation of the wholesome fact that it is industry and commerce, and not mere speculative ingenuity, which help to swell the catalogue of fortune makers, somewhat willars reported during the year from the north of England alone which each represent personality over £40,000. Oddly enough, however, it is a solicitor—Mr. John Clayton, of Newcastle-on-Tyne—who heads the score. He was for many years Town Clerk in that great human hive, and died at the great age of ninety-eight, leaving behind him £728,746—or considerably more than two million six and eightpences. The Newcastle folk are presumptively fond of law. Perhaps the best known of the twenty is the late Mr. Thomas Andrew Walker, contractor for the Severn Tunnel and the Manchester Ship Canal, who died at the comparatively early age of sixty-one, leaving considerably over half-a-million. Besides these, the northern counties yield eighteen whose personality, though under £400,000, was still above half that sum. They figure under the various descriptions of cotton spinner, engineer, merchant, sugar refiner, hide broker, linen manufacturer, and distiller, and including in the case of Mr. Namyith, the inventor of the steam hammer, at least one name of world-wide renown.

LONDON NOTES

London, Dec. 29.

Railway traffic in Scotland during the morning hours of Friday continued on a very disorganized state; but, according to telegrams received from Edinburgh and Glasgow, the companies in the afternoon and evening were able to despatch a larger number of passenger trains than on previous days, and even to make some attempt to deal with mineral traffic. The officials predict an early breakdown of the strike. On the other hand the men's executive express themselves sanguine of the result, declaring that financial aid has been offered them by trade organizations, and that, for six weeks, if necessary, they will be able to support the men who stand on.

It has been estimated that the recent Austria strikes cost the colonies there over one million and a quarter sterling.

A Terrible Moment.

In Captain Gatton went through it, and came home, a colonel and a V. C. to wed Miss Laughton, the daughter of the brave old soldier who would not shrink even in the most terrible 'Tug of War' with Ganga Sing, the traitor prince. THE END.
