STATISTICS.

We resume our extracts from the Statistical Annuary relating to 1889. IMMIGRATION. In 1889 the number f passengers arriving at this port, whether immigrants or otherwise, reached the highest total ever attained in this Republic, The total number of arrivals was 27,349 persons, of whom 10,446 came as State immigrants and Hotel. It is also fair to presume that large proportion of the remainder were immigrants, that is to say, belonging to the labouring classes. It is to be regretted that the Annuary does not state more clearly to what class the arrivals useful comparison with former

During the 121 days it was open there were 17638 visitors, or about 145 per day, against 12863 in 75 days or 171 per day, in 1888. Periodicals. To our great astonishment we find there is a considerable falling off in this respect. The total number of periodicals and reviews published in the Republic in 1889 was 86, against 108 in 1888, and 122 in 1885.
