Custom House. The Direction General of Customs has issued notice to the effect that the new tariff of import and export duvies comes into force on the 16th instant, Monday next, and that from that date all «permits» must be presented in accordance.

Tramways.

The Montevideo Tramways Company has applied to the Municipal Board for permission to unite their newly acquired line (that just bought from the Credito Real Uruguayo) with the Southern line. The proposed points of junction are at calle Du-razno, corner of Convencion, and calle Estanzuela, corner of Gaboto.

Sr. José Zipfel has applied for permission to make various extensions in the line for which a concession has already been applied. We have no information as to which concession this refers, but the exten-sions are to be placed in the Camino Suarez, Avenida 19 de April, Camino Reyes, and other parts in the neighbourhood of Paso Molino.

Since writing the above we learn that the permission referred to in the first paragraph has been granted.

-The proceedure of the Post office respecting small change is at once ridiculous and vexatious. For example, yesterday we sent a gold piece worth \$4.66 to buy \$2 worth of stamps. They refused to take it because they could or would not raise \$2.66 in change. We then sent the \$2 in copper. This, which, being short of changs, one would have thought they would have been glad to accept, was also refused on some absurd pretext. There was then no resource but to send to a money changers, where we had to pay 20 cents for the class. cents for the change, so that in the end our stamps cost us 10 o/o more than their value. For this tax we have to thank the incompetence and absurdity of the regulations. The only person benefited was the money

-- Onr neighbours in Buenos Aires must be in an uncommonly nervous state, for we read in the Standard that.— There was another revolutionary scare in town yesterday morning caused by strong bodies of police marching from all points of the city to the Central Office in Calle Moreno. After an hour's fright, fuss and foolery it was discovered that the guardians of our hearths and homes had merely marched up the hill for their month's pay, and, on getting it, marched down again. Such a scare would be almost impossible here for the simple reason that the police are very seldom paid.

-- We understand that Sr. Serres has lodged a claim of \$40,000 gold damages against the Central Uruguay Railway Company for the injuries inflicted on his wife and family in the terrible accident which occurred on the level crossing at Calle Capurro a fortnight ago. LONDON NOTES

London, Jan. 14.

Mr. John Morley, addressing his constituents at Newcastle last night, said that the next election would be a clean-cutting one between Liberals and Tories. With regard to the Irish crisis, he would not utter one word to aggravate the situation; but all depended for the settlement of the great question they had at heart upon Ireland herself. Mr. Gladstone had had no chioce but to communicate to Mr. Parnell at the earliest moment the plain and palpable truth that the prosecution of the Home Rule cause in Great Britain, unless there was a change of leadership, was a hopeless task. The Liberal party had bound themselves not only to take the first opportunity, but to create and make it, of once more pressing on Parliament such a scheme for the better government of Ireland as they believed would be safe to the British Empire, just and wise for Ireland, and rightly calculated to secure the free assent of both

countries.
As to the Scotch Railway Strike Lord Provost Boyd yesterday attempted a mediation between the men and Mr. Walker, the manager of the North British. The latter stated




