PASSING NOTES.

We are to have no fresh taxes at present, that is, presumably, until a fresh deficiency is discovered in the estimates. The E. P. is of opinion that the balance of the Budget can be maintained with the present taxes and has sent a Message to the Chambers withdrawing certain schemes laid before them last year for additional taxes, and which had not yet been reported upon in committee. Perhaps the Message was a trifle superfluous, for almost the same taxes were embodied in the Law of January 12 last. However it is satisfactory to read the declaration of the E. P. that the limit of taxation has been reached for the present, and we certainly congratulate the new Minister of Finance upon his name first appearing officially in connection with this document. By all means let us have no more taxes.

We have just had the clear declaration of the Executive Power that the Budget should be sufficiently balanced without the imposition of further taxes. We have also had the statement that the new Ministers intend making further considerable economies in the estimates or administrative expenses. The latter is not exactly official and may perhaps be fathered by the wish, or may be due to the zeal proverbially attributed to "new brooms." Anyhow, there is no doubt that the estimates are capable of considerable compression. Another half million or more might be knocked off the Army estimates with the greatest advantage, and the monstrous pension lists and some retrenchments in the other departments might account for another half million. Altogether then we think it is quite possible to make a reduction of about one million dollars in the forthcoming Budget. And as we have it authoritatively stated that the Budget is balanced without this reduction, the million thus economised should afford a large margin for the reduction of the present overpowering taxes and duties, and first of all, of the recently re-imposed duties on exports, which are having a most deadly effect on the productive energies of the country. In fact, we have every reason to think that a restoration of the duties and taxes to the standard of some eight months ago—more than high enough even then—would imply a very small reduction in the revenue, certainly nothing approaching what might be met by the suggested economies. As we have had many occasions to argue and prove, these additional taxes, when carried beyond a certain point, merely crush commerce and industry without producing the calculated increase in the revenue. All the duties imposed in the last six months, including those of exportation, have failed to raise the Customs revenue to the level of

the same months in the two preceding years, whilst there can be no doubt whatever of their mischievous effect upon business. When the crisis first burst upon us, business fell for a time into a lethargic state. It is now making valiant efforts to regain some of its former activity, but it finds itself checked and checkmated at every turn by the extra burdens imposed just at the time when the previous burdens should have been lightened. Especially is this true in reference to national industries and produce. In fact over-taxation is the preponderant cause which is now preventing a revival of trade. If the new Ministers would only turn their attention to this and make all practicable reductions in the administrative expenses with the ulterior view of reducing the present monstrous rate of taxation, they would do more towards reducing the crisis and reviving the country than any twenty loans.

The Message already referred to saves us from one calamity, namely, the raising of the *patente* or license on transatlantic steamers to \$200 for the round journey. The present license of \$90, imposed alike on steamers with packet privileges and those without, is found excessive, as has been proved by the excerpts we recently made from the powerful articles of "Mario." If the port is being killed by the present fees and duties, what would happen to it with such an increase as was threatened here? This only shows the utterly reckless way in which the governing powers propose new imposts without ever stopping to consider the effect of the same upon commerce. We have no hesitation in saying that if this new tax had been imposed the increase in the revenue would not have represented one fifth part of the loss entailed on the port generally. Some day, perhaps, the eyes of the governing powers will be opened, and they will then perceive that the people are not created for the sole purpose of being taxed to supply administrative waste or dishonesty. There are limits beyond which even a sponge cannot be squeezed.

The elections of representatives for the department of Colonia having been declared void by the recent decision of the Chambers, the Executive has issued a decree assigning Sunday, March 29, for new elections. The persons elected are warned that they must come provided with powers to discuss reforms in the Constitution. The absence of this formality was the cause of the previous elections being annulled.

Message.
The Executive has passed a Message to the Chamber of Representatives to the following effect:—
Before presenting the schemes of taxes which the Chambers converted into law by the sanction of Jan. 12, there had been presented to the Chambers other schemes of a similar nature, not yet reported upon by the corresponding Committee. After the above mentioned sanction, the Ex-

ective Power believes that there will be no necessity for the establishment of any new tax in order to ensure the balance of the Budget. Moreover, some of the schemes pending are included in the Law of Jan. 12. Therefore the E. P. begs the Chambers to withdraw the following affairs.—Bill of impost upon certain national factories.—Bill of application of revenue stamps to certain articles of local production.—Bill raising to \$200 the license for the round journey of transatlantic steamers.

The Message is signed by the President and the Minister of Finance.

Excellent Ideas.
Deputy Dr. Mendoza has presented to the Chamber of Representatives two bills which have already been very favourably received by the press. The first is to the effect that in future no person accepting military service for the Nation shall expect a pension for himself or his heirs, except in case of death or wounding on the field of battle. The second is to the effect that in future no person may fill the post of Jefe Político of a Department, even temporarily, without fulfilling the conditions exacted by Art. 119 of the Constitution, that is to say, he must be a citizen of the Republic, must possess landed property in the Department to the value of \$4,000, and must be 30 years of age. These bills have been referred to the corresponding committees.

SUNDRIES.
—Dr. Castellanos, Minister of Foment, has quite recovered from his recent severe indisposition and is assiduously attending to his duties.
—It is reported on good authority that the new Minister of Finance, Sr. Ramirez, is making great efforts to have the Budget for 1891-2 ready for presentation to the Chambers by April 1, as ordained by law. As our readers will well remember, the presentation of the estimates has generally been two or three months behind hand, and the consequence is that on July 1, when the new Budget is supposed to come into force, the discussion has not even commenced. This was notably the case last year, when, as a matter of fact, the Budget Committee never reported, nor was there any pretence made at discussion of the Budget until the introduction of the Economies Bill in January last, when half the financial year had already expired.

—An important contemporary (not the *Nacion*) states that one of the Ministers has declared that the Brazilian loan is a State Secret, and that whilst the papers are at liberty to say what they like concerning it, no official information will be vouchsafed them. If the said loan in anyway requires the guarantee of the Nation, it cannot long be kept a State Secret, as it must be presented to the Chambers for ratification. We always thought that those hole-and-corner dealings denominated State Secrets were reserved for empires and monarchies, not for republics.
—Everything points to the English language becoming in future the universal language of mankind. It is not merely the English speaking peoples who are increasing several millions every year, but English is becoming the language of commerce throughout the world, and commerce is every day extend-

ing its dominion. It is the same in every quarter of the globe. The English as a foreign language is at the present time more taught in the schools of the world than any other language.—*World*.
—Gold closed yesterday at 121 1/2, according to which the paper dollar is worth 82.3 cents.
—Juan Moreira will be repeated at the Politeama for the 12th time this evening. Another *«criollo»* drama is in preparation. It is called "Juan Cuello" and contains scenes of the times of the Argentine tyrant Rosas.

—The Sambrizzo youths, who attempted to assassinate General Roca, have declared that they used to amuse themselves by enacting scenes from "Juan Moreira." We can quite understand the very immoral influence this piece would have on an uncultured mind.
—The Temptations of Saint Anthony is the alluring title of the zarzuela to be given at the San Felipe Theatre this evening.
—A popular clergyman delivered a lecture on "Fools." The tickets to it read "Lecture on Fools—admit one." There was a very large attendance.

—In the forenoon on Sunday afternoon, in calle Cerrito, the fire brigade and engines were on the spot three minutes after the alarm was given. Greater promptitude could not be expected.
—During January the arrivals in this port from beyond seas were 1091 against 1998 departures, leaving a deficit of 907 persons. That does not look as if the crisis was conquered. When persons high in office wish to make illusory statements respecting the situation, they should first take care to suppress such statistics as the above.

—The London Correspondent of the *B. A. Standard*, in his letter dated January 21, says:—"Some of the small financial papers are making copy out of the lugubrious accounts of Uruguay finance supplied by the *Montevideo Times*. We were quite prepared to hear this, and from a certain point of view we cannot help regretting it. At the same time, as we know that our articles are bound to be misrepresented and misinterpreted, on whichever side we write, we prefer to take the safe side and confine ourselves to the truth. If the facts are found «lugubrious» it is they and not ourselves who are to blame.

—*El Bien* states that Government entertains the idea of creating a new Debt for the liquidation of the estimates in arrears and other administrative debts. The news has not been confirmed as yet.
—William Anthony, the manager of the "Criterion" Restaurant, having disappeared, the Restaurant has been judicially sealed.
—Sunmer seems to be giving its last kick, and a long, warm and powerful kick it is.
—The unusually warm weather, or some other cause, is evidently affecting the «rowdy» classes, who have been very troublesome of late. There were several cases of stabbing and fighting again on Monday, three of them rather serious. The details are of the usual vulgar description and quite devoid of interest except to the parties concerned.

LONDON NOTES

London, February 9.
A Cardiff Correspondent telegraphs that the position of affairs in the Bristol Channel ports is daily becoming more grave, and that steps have been taken by the Federated Unions which, it is anticipated, will result in an extension of the conflict to other mercantile centres. A meeting of the strikers is to be held today at which a definite course of action will be resolved upon. Meanwhile, the dock officials are endeavoring to secure outside labour. Should the dock men think it necessary, the railway men will come out to aid them in the struggle.
Dr. Perowne, the new Bishop of Worcester, paid his first visit to Birmingham on Saturday, and yesterday preached at Aston. He said that in the present day there was a good deal of perverted reverence, and that religious manuals were killing religion. Many popular religious hymns were simply shocking in their irreverent sensationalism.
Sir John MacDonald, the Canadian Premier, has issued a manifesto to the electors, in which is unfolded the policy of his Government. Beginning with the declaration that the Government will seek the development of the Dominion by every means consistent with its position as a part of the British Empire, he proceeds to review the improvements effected by his Government since 1878. He believes that the adoption of reciprocity with the United States—the plank upon which the Liberals take their stand—would bring about the annexation of Canada to that country. In conclusion the Premier appeals to the electors to pronounce against reciprocity and thus aid him in the preservation of the Empire.
The distinguished Russian traveller in Central Asia, Colonel Pevtsoff, and his companions are expected in St. Petersburg next month. They will bring details of their discovery of a tract of land several hundred metres under the level of the sea. This discovery is attracting considerable attention among the students of physical geography.
February 10.
There was no improvement yesterday in the position of affairs arising out of the strike at Cardiff. Indeed, the strikers claim to have gained ground, a number of Bute warehousemen who were told off to assist at the tipping having refused to work with blacklegs. Subsequently these men were informed that their presence was no longer required. In the course of the afternoon a telegram was received from Mr. Wilson, the General Secretary of the Seamen's Union, in which he stated that «the campaign» would be opened at Hull that day, orders having been issued that all Federation boats were to be blocked in that port. A demonstration was held in the afternoon and attended by about three thousand men. An incident of the day was the ordering of a detachment of soldiers for dock duty from the Maidiee Barracks.
Troops under Colonel Settle left Cairo last night for Suakin, whence the Governor with the whole force available has been ordered to advance upon Tokar. It is the intention of the Government to occupy the town, and to build a fort and institute a civil Government there.
The Judge of the Burslem Country Court had yesterday a difficult task—to decide upon the worth of poetry «made to order and duly delivered.» The «poems» were in praise of certain flooded fields as a boating and angling resort in summer and a place for skating in winter. Eventually the value was assessed at ten shillings. Extravagance in funeral wreaths has reached a point which in Liverpool has provoked a rather decided movement against this inconveniently costly fashion. What, it is asked, have we gained by getting rid of mutes, plumes, hatbands, scarves, if we are to be ruined by the growing rivalry of mourners, each determined to lay on the coffin of the deceased friend a bigger and a better wreath than his fellow-mourners can afford? The very florists' shops are turned from joy and brightness to funereal gloom by the display of funeral wreaths, and it is feared that the late severe weather has taxed many a person in this fashion in a way that he has been ill able to bear. One correspondent states that at a funeral at which he was recently present the drawing-room of the house was so full of flowers that no more than about four persons could step into the room at one time to see them. Chairs, tables, sofas, piano, pictures, walls, and even the floor, except where four people might, if careful, stand, were covered with wreaths, many of them a yard in diameter, and a few much larger. Relief is looked for in the growth of the practice of adding to an announcement of a death the sensible intimation «No flowers.»
The diminution in the number of our criminals has been the subject of much congratulation of late. It may be that the actual decrease of crime is not sufficient to account for this, and that in part at least it is due to the shorter sentences now so general.
