### PASSING NOTES.

It is satisfactory to note that, with the exception of a few rabid and not particularly important papers, the new ministers have been favourably received by the press. Without assigning to them any exaggerated attributes as saviours of the situation they are accepted as capable and trustworthy men, likely to inspire confidence at home and abroad. Impartial recognition is given to President Herrera for his efforts to initiate a conciliatory policy, and the present nomination is looked upon, in many quarters, as a step towards overcoming the unpopularity acquired in the first year of his Presidency. How far that policy will be carried, yet remains to be seen. The new Ministers have before them a difficult and unenviable task and if they set about it in earnest, they must commence by undoing much of what was done by their predecessors. Remembering the share Dr. Herrera had in the mistaken policy of the past year, and the faint recognition of the true facts of the situation shown in his last Message this is a great deal to hope for. But without it, we are well convinced there can be neither lasting nor important improvement. Compared with the Argentine middle our situation is simplicity itself, and both common sense and experience clearly point out the road that should be taken and condemn the road that has been taken. This nomination of a new and conciliatory Ministry may be looked upon as a fresh start in the race, rendering possible a retrieval of many past errors, and the initiation of a new and wiser policy. Yielding to the superior claims of patriotic interest in the welfare of the country, political partisanship is hushed for awhile, and it may be said that the whole country is in an attitude of anxious expectancy to see what course the new Ministry will take and how far Dr. Herrera will retrieve his former errors. The fate of the country for the time being hangs upon the answer.

Bad business, monetary straits and the crisis generally are unanswerable excuses for difficulties in meeting one's customary obligations, and in the present situation patience and mutual forbearance are absolutely necessary as a *modus vivendi*. But neither these reasons nor any others that can possibly be produced, will serve to excuse neglect of the usual business formalities and habits, or will atone for the dishonest evasion of contracted debts. It is therefore with deep regret that we have noticed, both in our own experience and that of others, that firms and persons of business standing have taken advantage of the present situation to behave in the most irregular manner, and to shirk their obligations on excuses which, at any other time, they themselves would be the first to condemn as dishonest.

The business morality that only endures in fair weather, but which disappears at the first adverse wind, is hardly worth calling morality. Little credit is due to the person who pays his debts when he is prosperous and his pockets are full of money, but, on the other hand, it does not follow that, because times are hard and money is scarce, there is any justification for refusing to acknowledge contracted debts or for incurring obligations which there is no intention of meeting. There is no dishonesty in finding oneself unable to pay and asking for time, but there is certainly great dishonesty in repudiating an obligation, and refusing to pay either now or hereafter. Between this and obtaining goods under false pretences, which is in all countries a criminal offence, the distinction is so fine as to be hardly perceptible. The subject is a very delicate one, and therefore we do not pursue it further, but we are sure most of our business readers will have had experience of what we refer to, and, we trust, will join us in regretting that such a charge should have arisen.

In the Chamber of Representatives, on Tuesday further data furnished by the Executive concerning the Colonia elections were referred to the Committee of Petitions, as also various petitions referring to the same, including one from various residents of Nueva Palmira asking that the elections might be approved!

Messrs. Castellanos and Delucchi, proprietors of a factory of vegetable oils, petitioned for exemption from duty on all oleaginous seeds imported by them. Referred to the Committee of Finance.

Leave was accorded to Dr. Carlos M. Ramirez, Deputy for Treinta y Tres, to accept a post in the Cabinet, and the substitute, Sr. Carlos E. Barros, was called to occupy the seat thus vacated, being sworn in in the act.

**SUNDRIES.**

The *Siglo* has been enquiring into the causes of the non-publication of the details of the census of Montevideo, taken with so much fuss so long months ago. It appears that the sudden death of Sr. Ruiz Zorrilla, who was charged with preparing the figures collected, threw the work into great confusion, as no one seems to have exactly understood the plans on which he was proceeding. It also appears that a quantity of the work done at first was so badly executed that it has had to be done over again. The census of edification is complete, that of population complete with regard to numbers, sex, age, and nationality, the scholastic census is nearly complete, and the industrial census is hardly touched. Altogether, considering the time that has now elapsed it may be said that this important, necessary, and expensive job, over which so much fuss was made and from which so much was expected, has insignificantly collapsed and the results are now comparatively worthless.

A meeting will be held at the Lafone Memorial Hall at 8.30 p.m. tomorrow (Friday) for the purpose of receiving communication of the reply of the British Treasury to the Memorial of last July relating to the re-transfer of the Cemetery Fund to the control of the British Community, and for the election of trustees of the Fund. The chair will be taken by the British Minister, Ernest Satow Esq.

Several distinguished Chileans, driven out of their country by the lamentable revolution which is dragging out its protracted length in Chile just now, are taking refuge in the River Plate. Two have recently arrived in Montevideo, namely Sres. Manuel Jose Irarrizabal and Ventura Blanco Viel, both senators of distinction who have been the objects of persecution by President Balmaceda.

Payment of the pension and invalid list for October last was commenced yesterday. The police are now being paid for November.

A woman in the waiting-room the other day had a great deal of trouble with one of her two children—a boy of seven or eight—and a man who sat near her stood it as long as possible, and then observed: «Madam, that boy of yours needs the strong hand of a father.» «Yes, I know it,» she replied, «but he can't have it. His father died when he was six years of age, and I've done my best to get another man, and failed. He can't have what I can't get.»

The pretty little San Felipe Theatre reopens its doors this evening, with a long recess, with a Spanish Zarzuela Company, including several popular and well-known artists, under the management of Sr.

José Suarez. The opening piece is «El Anillo de Hierro.»

The newly appointed Ministers are to take the oaths and assume charge of their portfolios this afternoon.

Gold closed yesterday at 120 1/2, according to which the paper dollar is worth 77.2 cents.

On account of quarantine difficulties in Buenos Aires, the sailing of the R. M. S. «Trent» for Southampton, etc., is postponed until to-morrow, Friday.

Our correspondents, both in town and in camp, have been very neglectful of late, yet there is always space at their disposal and we are sure some of them could find something interesting to say, if they chose.

The native papers, slow to condemn anything bearing the name of «criollo,» can find but faint praise to give that miserable production «Martin Fierro.» Why do they not take a more courageous course and condemn it equally from a moral, dramatic and artistic point of view, as it deserves.

An unfortunate soldier, trying to escape from the horrors of the Artillery Barracks in La Union, on Tuesday, was cut down and severely wounded by a captain, in the street, and in the presence of an indignant public, who have no sympathy with the barbarities known to be perpetrated in this regiment. Of course there will be no enquiry, and the chief regret is that Lynch law is out of date.

At last we have the Ministry, but where is the loan? Notwithstanding the many positive assurances concerning it, it seems to have dropped out of sight. We have reason to believe that negotiations really were considerably advanced, but at the last moment there occurred an awkward hitch which has not yet been overcome.

Some of our contemporaries warn travellers by the river steamers against the professional gamblers and cheats who have lately reappeared there, practising the three card trick and other modes of swindling flats out of their dollars.

The death occurred yesterday of Captain Francisco A. Sayavedra, Adjutant of the Military College, by the pupils of which he was much esteemed.

**BUENOS AIRES.**

The *Herald* says that it appears that there are still difficulties in the way of arranging the so-called loan. It is stated that the question which has not yet been settled is as to the mode of securing the application of the Customs duties to the payment of the coupons of the new bonds. The duties are falling off alarmingly and they are charged with the service of the loan of 1886 as well as the new one. Moreover, the expenses of the Administration have to be defrayed out of these duties.

A bulletin was issued on Monday evening by *La Tarde*, stating that it was authorized by the Minister of Finance to announce that the contract for the loan is concluded.

Various English capitalists of this city are forming a syndicate to test some gold, silver and copper mines in the province of Catamarca, the concessions of which Messrs. Irish and Olmi have already made the necessary legal arrangements to secure. We understand that the syndicate is almost complete.

Mr. Frank S. Livingston has instituted criminal proceedings against the directors of the Banco Constructor of La Plata for libellous statements concerning him contained in their Report just presented to the shareholders of the Company, against the Syndic of the Company, Don Melchor G. Rom, for having adopted the charges and against the *Nacion, Nacional, Diario and Sud-America* for having published the Report.

### LONDON NOTES

London, February 4.  
Mr. Justin McCarthy, M. P., and Lord Aberdeen were guests on Monday night of the Liverpool Reform Club. In reply to the toast of his health, Mr. McCarthy made an important statement as to the measure of Home Rule which, in his opinion, would satisfy the Irish people. He wanted the Bill, which he hoped to see introduced by Mr.

Gladstone, to be one on which they could all agree; and he believed it would be for him had faith that Mr. Gladstone would never bring forward a proposal which was not acceptable to the Irish and the majority of the English people. He went on to discuss the questions of the land and the control of the police. In acknowledging an address presented to him by the Irishmen of Liverpool, Mr. McCarthy expressed himself as being hopeful with regard to the reunion of the Nationalist party.

An immense crowd assembled at the Hall of Science on Monday evening, to attend a service held as a memorial to the late Mr. Bradlaugh. At the close of the proceedings a Hindoo rose and expressed the gratitude of the people of India for the services Mr. Bradlaugh had rendered them.

The performances of a play in English is such a rarity at St. Petersburg that considerable interest is being taken in an amateur representation fixed for Saturday. The play selected is «David Garrick,» and the leading parts will be filled by Mr. L. Irving, the son of Mr. Henry Irving, of the Lyceum Theatre, Mr. Turner, English professor at the Petersburg University, and Mrs. Grace Turner.

One indispensable condition of the proposed issue of 11 notes is that, when presented to the Bank of England, they shall be reissuable. A 51 note, however new and crisp, is at once extinguished when brought back to the Bank. Were 11 notes so treated, the expense would be altogether excessive. It is doubtful whether Mr. Goschen will venture to propose 10s. notes.

Nearly three thousand people were present at Mr. Bradlaugh's funeral in Brookwood Cemetery yesterday. Mr. John Morley, Mr. Labouchere, Mr. Conyngham, Mr. Burt, Mr. Pictou, Mr. J. O'Connor, and Dr. Hunter were among the members of Parliament who attended, and the company also included the Marquis of Queensberry and Mr. G. J. Holyoake. A great number of wreaths were sent by political friends, branches of the Secular Society, and private persons. All the spectators unconcerned as the coffin was borne to the grave and lowered, but not a word was spoken in the nature of a service.
